#### Dear guests of airBaltic,

It is very likely that you are currently on board one of our 40 *Airbus A220-300* aircraft. But, it is also possible that this summer you are flying with another airline that is transporting you across Europe on our behalf.

Air travel is the fastest and safest mode of transportation. Imagine soaring across Europe at 900 kilometres per hour, while enjoying a refreshing drink and reading this magazine, despite the outside air temperature plummeting to -56°C. There is simply no other way to cover long distances with such ease and comfort in such a short time.

This summer season we are offering more destinations and seats than ever before, and you as our guests have already made a significant number of bookings.

However, due to still ongoing supply chain delays, primarily on the part of the engine manufacturer of our aircraft, we are unable to use all of our aircraft at the moment. As a result, we currently have a shortage of ll aircraft.



If you are reading this aboard our partner airline, rest assured that you will arrive at your destination as scheduled. 


### Trophy wall

# **Your complet**

With a history spanning more than 700 years, Vilnius has a vibrant past. In the 14th century, it became the capital of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania, one of the most powerful states in Europe at the time. And it all started on Gediminas Hill, where Grand Duke Vytautas established the city's first masonry castle in 1409. Still today, the castle's stately brick tower rises above the cityscape, boasting fascinating views of the Old Town.

Over the subsequent centuries, the city prospered, attracting a multicultural population from various parts of the duchy. A community of Jewish artisans once governed the charming Old Town streets that now are known as the Glass Quarter, which is today one of the most enchanting parts of the Old Town. In the 18th century, Vilnius was annexed by the Russian Empire, and the Palace of the Grand Dukes at the foot of Gediminas Hill was destroyed. After painstaking renovations, the palace – which boasts a wonderful mix of Gothic, Renaissance, and Baroque architecture – reopened to visitors in 2009.

After the Second World War. Vilnius remained under Soviet control, which left its mark on the city's layout with prominent examples of Soviet modernism. Today, the city continues to evolve, attracting top-tier architects such as Daniel Libeskind (MO Museum) and Zaha Hadid Architects to contribute to its cityscape.

Opened in 2018, MO Museum is the place to immerse oneself in Vilnius' thriving contemporary art scene. Established by art collectors Danguole and Viktoras Butkai, the museum features over 5000 works of art by Lithuanian artists showcased in thought-provoking and engaging exhibitions.

### Chernobyl & Stranger Things

Head to the Fabijoniskes district, which acted as Pripyat in HBO's acclaimed miniseries Chernobyl. As for Gen Zers, Lukiškes Prison is a must-visit, as this is where many of the scenes in Season 4 of Netflix's Stranger Things were filmed.





Send a vertigo-inducing *Snap* to your friends from a hot-air balloon – a common feature in the skies above Vilnius during the warm months. #### Lukiškes Prison

Lukiškės Prison 2.0 is now home to 250 creators and artists and regularly hosts exhibitions, performances, and other events. Rolling plains, lush forests, numerous lakes... Sixty-one percent of Vilnius is a green zone, making it one of the greenest capitals in Europe. Located at the confluence of the Neris and Vilnia rivers, the relatively small capital has a hilly landscape and, all in all, is a joy to walk through. For a short stroll, head to one of the city's parks, such as the Bernardine Garden, Vingis Park, or Belmontas Park. You can also go for a longer hike in one of the city's nearby nature reserves, such as Pavilniai Regional Park or Vokės Landscape Reserve, both around a 15-minute drive away from the city.

Vilnius is also surrounded by several lakes, including the Trakai Lakes and Lake Baluošas, which are particularly popular during the summertime among water sports and fishing enthusiasts. To make your choice even more difficult, explore the Green lakes, six lakes located in the northeastern part of Vilnius, in Verkiai park. The most loved one is definitely lake Balsys, which was recently awarded a Blue Flag. Surrounded by all this nature, thinking green is in the city's DNA, with many eco-conscious shops and initiatives located throughout the city. Shop for local, homemade, sustainable organic goods at the Zeroteka zero-waste store and indulge in guilt-free meals at the farm-to-table restaurants and shops in Senatorių pasažas. Moreover, the word on the street is that the thrift shopping in Vilnius is excellent.

of Briedis' work. Taken between 1966 and 2010, the more than 60 iconic and timeless portraits in this exhibition capture the photographer's peers and friends, including composers Raimonds Pauls and Mārtiņš Brauns, the poet Imants Ziedonis, actress Mirdza Martinsone, and others. 'Back then, it was like the starting gun at the beginning of the race for human freedom,' Briedis comments on the zeitgeist he documented.

These are not static portraits taken in a sterile studio environment; instead, they are intimate snapshots taken during friendly strolls, informal gatherings, and formal speeches. The photos permeate Briedis' ceaseless quest for truth, in which he strived to capture his subjects in their real, uninterrupted existence. Many of the people he photographed are no longer alive, but their impact on the nation was immense. In these faces, one can see the unfolding fate of a whole country over the course of half a century.

Born in 1940, Briedis has left an enormous mark on the Latvian photoscape. Working as a photo correspondent for major Latvian newspapers, the many press photo prizes he has won have acknowledged his talent, and he has twice been named Latvia's best portraitist. In 2011, Briedis was also awarded the Order of the Three Stars, the nation's highest civilian order. His works are featured in the permanent collection of the Latvian National Museum of Art.



# The faces of freedom

Free To Be. Uldis Briedis. Portraits (1966–2010), a photo exhibition at the Ola Foundation in Riga, showcases iconic portraits of Latvian cultural legends.

On May 4, tables in homes and gardens across the country are dressed in white tablecloths, honouring a tradition commemorating the restoration of Latvia's independence in 1990. As stately as this custom is the collection of black-and-white portraits by photographer Uldis Briedis, on show now at the Ola Foundation in Riga.

The Latvian independence movement was spearheaded by native cultural figures brave enough to voice their beliefs and resist the Soviet regime. These same people have also been the protagonists



Outstanding: Relief from Rodin to Picasso at

the Städel Museum offers a glimpse into the rarely exhibited artistic medium of reliefs (May 24 -September 17; Schaumainkai 63; staedelmuseum.de). This carving technique applied to a flat surface of stone or wood gracefully balances between painting and sculpture to transcend the boundaries of visual perception. The exhibition explores the many possibilities of relief art from the early 19th century to the 1960s, featuring works by Auguste Rodin, Paul Gauguin, Henri Matisse, Pablo Picasso, Hans Arp, Yves Klein, and more. The story begins with Classicism-style works and then moves to the early 20th century, when bold vision, innovation, and artistic experimentation gave rise to a breakthrough in terms of canon, typical genre schemes, and techniques. Reliefs turned into assemblages and collages created from everyday materials and unusual objects.

The **Night of Museums** reveals the treasures found in Frankfurt's museums in an unconventional nighttime setting, from 7 p.m. until 2 a.m. on May 13 (museumsufer.de; tickets at museen-ticket.de). This tradition celebrating the power of spring, education, and culture unites locals and visitors, young and old. More than 40 museums and exhibition spaces participate in the project, offering special workshops, musical and theatre performances, and video and light installations to accompany the event. The majority of Frankfurt's museums are located in the Museumsufer quarter alongside the picturesque Main River promenade. Explore it and the surrounding historical architecture on foot or on a complimentary shuttle bus. Several guided tours will be offered in English.

The new Scandic Frankfurt Hafenpark hotel located just a few steps from Frankfurt's Old Town blends Scandinavian comfort, contemporary style, and a relaxed atmosphere for business and leisure travellers alike (Eytelweinstraße l; scandichotels.com; from EUR 89). The design of this hotel's meeting rooms, event spaces, and 505 guest rooms is inspired by nature. Conceptually, the interior is a continuation of the neighbouring Hafenpark, with an abundance of hanging plants in the communal spaces. Dressed in earthy tones and natural materials, each room has been designed with a vision of circularity; many details here are made from recycled materials, and most of them can be reused in case of renovation. A 320-seat restaurant with an open kitchen and bar area indulges guests with a relaxed atmosphere and delicious meals throughout the day.

The Ateneum Art Museum, one of Helsinki's leading art institutions, has reopened after a year-long renovation with a new permanent exhibition titled Collection: A Question of Time (Kaivokatu 2; ateneum.fi). The exposition reflects major issues of our time through the prism of classical Finnish art as well as modern and contemporary pieces, including previously rarely exhibited works. The showcase is divided into four themes that span across different timelines: Art and Power, Modern Life, The Age of Nature, and Images of a People. The nature topic focuses on the changing environment and climate issues; the portrait section takes visitors back to the 19th century to unveil the Finnish national identity; and the selection of 20th-century art brings technological development, urbanisation, and utopian concepts under the spotlight. A retrospective of Albert Edelfelt (1854-1905), one of Finland's most acclaimed artists, takes place in May as well.

Hotel AX in the Jätkäsaari district brings a new artistic experience to Helsinki's hospitality scene (Välimerenkatu 18; hotelax.fi; from EUR 142). The concept was created in collaboration with Finland's leading contemporary artists. A massive glittering sculpture of a flying fairytale creature welcomes guests before they even step inside the building. The cosy vet light-filled rooms are thematically designed. For example, the Poem King room with panoramic city views immerses guests in the world of poems and rhymes with a selection of poetry books. The Love Letter with a View room has a floor-to-ceiling window and a massive wallpaper of an enchanted forest. The hotel's restaurant, for its part, continues the art theme but in the culinary field, serving seasonal ingredients, local delicacies, and surprising flavours from around the globe.

Brasa is a new restaurant nestled in the heart of Helsinki close to Senate Square (Aleksanterinkatu 22; brasa.fi). With a name that comes from the Spanish and means 'hot coals', the menu at Brasa focuses on open-fire cooking. Fresh meats, seafood, and seasonal vegetables are cooked on a massive open-fire grill, while spruce branches bring extra smoky flavours straight from the fire to the plate. With a contrast of grilled and fresh foods, the menu is influenced by global cuisines, with wild forest herbs adding authentic touches of Finnish nature. The tableware collected from second-hand shops, including pieces from the iconic Finnish brand Arabia, add a sustainable note. The bar boasts a selection of natural wines as well as specially made drinks even the Bloody Mary here is complemented with charcoal-grilled tomatoes.



Sommerro is a new five-star hotel occupying an architectural gem from the 1930s - the former Art Deco-styled headquarters of Oslo's electric company (Sommerrogata 1; sommerrohouse.com; from NOK 2256). Located in the Frogner neighbourhood, this new urban retreat has been called Norway's largest-ever preservation project. The hotel has 231 rooms, including spacious lofts and classy suites. The interiors feature an elegant selection of bespoke furniture, plush rugs, shimmery chandeliers, and oak parquet floors. Sommerro has seven restaurants and bars. Among them, the *To Søstre* tearoom lures guests with lush greenery, *Izakaya Bar & Terrace* offers street-style vibes, and the rooftop TAK Oslo serves Nordic-Japanese cuisine. The century-old Vestkantbadet public baths have also now been turned into the city's largest wellness oasis, with restored Roman baths and mosaic murals. Oslo's first year-round pool welcomes guests on the

Thorvald Hellesen: Pioneering Cubism is a retrospective of a Norwegian abstract artist, designer, and painter whose one and only exhibition in his native land took place in 1919 (until August 20; Brynjulf Bulls plass 3; nasjonalmuseet.no). Back then, the local press was dismissive, calling his works 'colour orgies (...) hurled at the wall'. Hellesen (1888–1937) spent most of his career in avantgarde Paris, where he joined the Cubists and explored various sub-techniques of the movement, such as Orphism, in which pure abstraction and bright colours dominate. This long-awaited exhibition at the National Museum puts Hellesen back on the radar with nearly 70 paintings, gouaches, and drawings that burst with bold colour and a clear interaction of forms. Hellesen also designed patterns for textiles and wallpapers, and the show includes some of his interior design pieces.

Punk Royale is a daring new dining spot that turns the perception of the traditional fine-dining experience upside down (Frognerveien 5; punkroyale.se). Its edgy tasting menu, in which some dishes are even theatrically served in-hand, is paired with tailor-made drinks and bursts with an array of eclectic combinations and sensational, well-balanced flavours. Caviar, truffles, foie gras, and lobster set a classy, 'high' tone that contrasts with the wild and punk visual atmosphere. The restaurant is located in the basement level, and the rather dark interior bursts with flashing lights and sound effects, graffiti on the walls, red Chinese lanterns, and an overall exuberant rock-and-roll atmosphere.

# The symbol of Venice

Gondoliers still ferry visitors along Venetian waters, as they have for centuries.

They're called the symbol of the lagoon fleet, the keepers of tradition, the guides of Venice. They know the hidden corners of the city's labyrinthine canals, the most mysterious legends, and the greatest secrets. Their characteristic silhouette, manoeuvring gracefully on the stern of a sleek boat with a single paddle, has become iconic. They are the gondoliers of Venice, whose resounding cry of 'Gondola-a-a, gondola-a-a!' echoing across the canals makes the city so alive, so authentic, so beloved.

The profession was born in the late Middle Ages, when the aristocracy decided to create the private profession of *gondoliere de casada*. At the time, the gondola was the only means of transport for the elite, and thousands of them crowded the canals. Gondoliers became indispensable companions and confidants of noble Venetian families. Incidentally, the famous art collector Peggy Guggenheim is known as one of the last people to have had a private gondolier in her service.

For centuries, sons have inherited the gondolier's profession from their fathers, but since 2010, a few women have managed to break into the respectable profession as well. The professional qualifications of a gondolier are key to both a safe and beautiful

journey and include four years as an apprentice, rowing instruction, theory exams, swimming and rescue skills, and other tests. Currently, 440 gondolier licences have been issued in Venice, and, as in the past, family members and native Venetians retain a clear advantage.

At the moment, the tariff set by the municipality for a 35-minute gondola ride is EUR 80 during the day and EUR 100 in the evening or at night. It's most convenient to reserve a ride with the lagoon navigator of your heart's desire at one of the gondola piers in Venice. One gondola may carry up to five passengers, but don't share one with strangers in an effort to cut costs, as you may lose the indescribable freedom and magic of the ride.

So you've heard about the abrasive character of gondoliers? Actually, behind that mask is a proud yet welcoming soul. Gondoliers love to share stories, tell jokes, answer inquisitive questions, and engage in a unique adventure together. A gondola ride is the most romantic and authentic Venetian experience; it's something you cannot find anywhere else in the world. And oh, yes, gondoliers do not sing. If you want a romantic ride at sunset that includes a serenade, bring along a musician.

Kolbeinsson has always been fascinated by photography and filmmaking, but in 2018 that interest turned into a promising career when he started his own production company. Since then, he has worked for brands such as *National Geographic*, *Nissan*, and *Red Bull*.



#### Other locations to check out

- Brimketill is a naturally carved pool surrounded by a rough and rocky coastline. It's perfect for a quick stop, and if the waves are big, you're in for a real treat.
- The Festarfjall mountain is located east of the fishing town of Grindavík. It's near a secluded black-sand beach hidden by rugged cliffs.
- Reykjanestá, at the most southwestern tip of Reykjanes Peninsula, offers epic views from all sides. Fascinating bird life, rugged sea cliffs, two lighthouses, and a beach covered in giant boulders are just a few of the attractions there.



But apart from that, he feels that being outdoors and enjoying the magnificent landscapes of Latvia is the best way for him to regain energy and find his inner balance. As he says later in our conversation, there isn't a nature trail in Latvia that he hasn't explored.

'Before leaving the city, find some time to visit the Riga Motor Museum,' Vitenbergs suggests to hockey fans. 'It was completely revamped a few years ago and is considered one of the most significant and also most interesting motor museums in the world. The exposition showcases more than 100 cars as well as Latvia's achievements in this industry. It's an exciting place that tells an interactive story about the history of the automobile.'

Next, there are two beautiful towns just a short train ride away from Riga: Jūrmala and Sigulda. Jūrmala is Latvia's largest and oldest spa town, and it still offers plenty of opportunities to pamper the body and soul in a modern spa as well as become acquainted with the charming historical heritage of its sanatoriums. Treatments here also make use of therapeutic mud, which is a local natural treasure. 'A couple of years ago, my family and I stayed in one of the old sanatoriums for a few days, and I cannot recommend it enough. We left feeling very energised,' Vitenbergs recalls.

Take the train in the other direction, and you'll end up in Sigulda, one of Latvia's most scenic towns. The town is surrounded by Gauja National Park, which offers countless nature-related activities. The *Aerodium* – a vertical wind tunnel in which one can quite literally feel what it's like to fly - is located in Sigulda as well.

'We're very lucky in this country, because as we leave the city by car, in just 15 or 20 minutes we can already be in the middle of nature, with no other people around,' Vitenbergs continues. 'The workweek tends to be quite intense, so weekends and holidays are my time to spend with the family and also to avoid crowds, which is very easy to do in Latvia. We have three young daughters, and we often choose to visit several towns in one trip to make the outing more interesting and to play a game of comparing the different places.

But however you choose to spend your time in Latvia, remember to also try the local beer. 'We have a long and strong tradition of beer brewing, there are many small breweries making beer in Latvia. I've heard nothing but good things about the local beer from my friends from abroad who visit Latvia,' says Vitenbergs.



Ethnic and green

The new Museum of Ethnography in Budapest shines with a sparkling façade amid lush greenery.

Nestled in Városliget (City Park), Budapest's oldest urban green space, the imposing new edifice of the Ethnography Museum is the brainchild of the local architecture studio Napur Architect. This museum is a part of the Liget Budapest Project, Europe's largest-scale urban cultural development initiative, which aims to revive the iconic city park. The museum also neighbours another recently completed architectural marvel, the House of Music.

Simple yet imaginary, the curved volume of the museum building merges with the surrounding park. Measuring more than 7300 square metres, its landscaped roof serves as a public garden and is thus a continuation of all that green space. It's covered with grass and other blooming plants, shrubs, perennials, and evergreens to echo the Városliget and create a welcoming recreational area for visitors. The roof's highest point rises to the height of the tree tops and offers a breathtaking view.

A glittering curtain-like façade wraps around the building and consists of nearly half a million pixels set into a laser-cut aluminum grid. Inserted with the help of a robot, the pixels create abstract images based on ethnographic motifs from the museum's Hungarian and

international collections. Thus the ornate façade in its contemporary technological interpretation reflects the historical artefacts exhibited inside. The patterns are inspired by Hungarian weavings, tortoiseshell jewellery from Oceania, a Mongolian shaman's cloak, tablecloths from Cameroon, a Croatian apron, and many other items.

The museum has two arched wings that gracefully rise towards the sky, resembling a pair of hillsides. The unique thing about this structure is that similar technology is used in the construction of bridges. One wing of the museum houses the public spaces: the visitors' centre, a museum shop, a restaurant, an event hall, and children's workshop rooms. The other wing houses a library and archives. Nearly 60% of the exhibition spaces are located underground.

Alongside 225,000 items in the ethnographic collection, the Museum of Ethnography also holds photographic and film materials and valuable objects from other countries that illustrate everyday life in communities around the world since the 17th century. The Ceramics Space lines the 40-metre staircase with an impressive showcase of nearly 4000 ceramic objects from around the world.



# Hip fuel

More and more inspiring spaces are opening for all kinds of creative minds.



Contrary to popular belief, creatives can't survive on wine and passion alone. So where there's a swarm of creatives, there should be at least a few options to replenish their flights of fancy. Cafés and restaurants at creative hubs do not exist only to satisfy physical needs; they're actually also crucial for networking, sharing ideas, and creating a sense of community. In addition, these parlours can attract visitors to the hub and aid in sustaining it.

Creative hubs can be part of an urban renewal plan in which officials let creatives into vacant (often industrial) structures, usually rentfree, to revive the place and its surroundings. Think Centquatre-Paris, a cultural centre improving the rough reputation of that city's 19th arrondissement and which also hosts a handful of eateries and an organic produce market on Saturdays. But such makerspaces can also be brand-new additions to a city's layout, such as SALT in Oslo. Sitting right on the edge of the Oslofjord, SALT's cutting-edge wooden structures host concerts, lectures, and exhibitions that often focus on the cruciality of the sea. Like other innovation hubs, SALT's focus is also evident in its culinary offerings, with seafood occupying the biggest part of the plate.

What unites the seemingly very different spaces following this trend is the carefully curated selection of food and events as well as very creative staff. In addition: art, design, and architecture are integrated in their overall concepts.

# RIGA THAT STUNNING OPEN-AIR LIVING ROOM

I envy those of you who are coming to Riga in May. This is the most beautiful month in the city, when you can truly feel spring giving way to summer. The lilacs are in full bloom, and late-evening urban sunsets awaken the vibe of those long, almost never-ending summer nights still ahead.

The key is that in Riga, still a widely undiscovered gem of the Baltics, one never gets into the annoying trap of overcrowded summer tourism. Even when hosting events such as the Ice Hockey World Championship (12–28 May) and the Riga Marathon (May 6–7), which gathers thousands of participants from around the globe, Riga manages to maintain the slow-paced vibe of a cosy, visually stunning open-air living room. During the hockey championship, however, bars and outdoor cafés are allowed to roll out their TV screens, so the festive atmosphere and cheering promise to be at a high.

But the Latvian capital is also a textbook on historical architecture, creative culinary experiences, relaxing spas, nightlife, and fascinating art and culture. Add a picture-perfect seaside and spa town half an hour's train ride from the city centre, and there's no better package for a weekend gateway.

MY MORNING STARTS IN THE ĀGENSKALNS NEIGHBOURHOOD, BY ARKĀDIJAS PARK AND MĀRAS POND, one of the largest water reservoirs in the quiet residential area on the left bank of the Daugava River. This side of the river is referred to as Pārdaugava, meaning 'across the Daugava', and it's pierced with lush parks, century-old townhouses, and secluded narrow streets. This was a favourite recreational spot for residents of the city since the late 18th century, and even composer Richard Wagner liked to dine in one of the taverns facing Māras Pond while he served as the chief conductor at the Riga City Theatre. Today, a couple of swans are guarding a nest of eggs under a willow tree, and ducks chase one another. Spring is here for good.

I myself am one of the privileged residents of the Āgenskalns area, which, together with the Torṇakalns neighbourhood, combines a slightly provincial charm and old-time flair with the new energies that are gradually spreading on this side of town. Here, the University of Latvia has built two advanced centres, the House of Science and the Faculty of Biology, on its new campus on the edge of wild, abandoned gardens.

Pārdaugava seems really keen on becoming one of the most student-friendly areas in the Baltics.

Āgenskalns Market, a freshly restored red-brick marvel, is a magnet for social and gourmet life in the neighbourhood. Industrial brick architecture is a trademark of Riga, alongside the holy trinity of Art Nouveau, wooden buildings, and modernism. The market was designed by prominent Riga city architect Reinhold Schmaeling and opened in 1923. When I was a child, it was my shopping paradise. As is usually the case, everything seemed brighter, bigger, and louder back then. When I first entered the freshly renovated market, where every layer of history was respected and authenticity highlighted in a bold way, my excitement returned.

The market's entryway is decorated with vintage posters depicting the coats of arms of Latvia's major cities and towns; they're relics that have remained from before the restoration, and I feel relieved to find them here again. The first floor is shared between local vendors and businesses selling creative delicacies, such as Molberts artisan ice-cream and gluten-free baked goods from Better Bread. Riga is known for some great coffee roasters, and here *Kalve* serves the best coffee on this side of the river. The food court on the second floor has everything to indulge fans of global cuisine, from Georgian khachapuri to wood-fired pizzas and delicious street food. The cult bar called Vest moved here from the city centre to shake up the neighbourhood with its frequent DJ sets and cocktails late into the evening. The two massive crystal chandeliers add a note of





glamour to this industrial space, and the strong sense of community in the neighbourhood is opening up a new chapter for the area.

The market's outdoor zone is also lively. An elderly lady is selling tulips, and she looks quite the same as she did 20 years ago – I guess working outside year round has its benefits when it comes to looking young. Meanwhile, the guys from Klapkalnciema Zivis (Fish from Klapkalnciems) are cooking

probably the heartiest fish soup in town. Āgenskalns Market also hosts a diverse entertainment programme and a flea market on Sundays. Here one can find quirky souvenirs from the Soviet era, fancy vintage crockery, vinyl records, coins, toys, and plenty of other treasures.

Although I know the neighbourhood like the back of my own hand, I can never get enough of the details that its aged buildings hold. Riga is a gem of

wooden architecture, which makes it a rarity when compared to other European capitals. The finest examples of meticulously restored and freshly repainted wooden buildings are found in the nearby Kalnciema Quarter and romantic Ķīpsala, where time stands still on the shores of the Daugava River. I decide to ride my bicycle there along one of my favourite streets, Meža iela, where an almost magenta-coloured Russian Orthodox church contrasts with the old wooden haberdashery with a fat, elderly cat in the window and one of the largest Neo-Gothic buildings in the city, which occupies a whole block.

In Āgenskalns, tiny wooden houses also contrast with imposing glass skyscrapers. *Zunda Towers* is one of the highest residential and office complexes in the Baltics. Those mirror-like twin cylinders mark the highest point on the skyline of the left bank of the river. I pass them on my way to Ķīpsala via a pit stop at a viewing point under the Vanšu Bridge to enjoy a tranquil urban panorama of central Riga's church towers.

The main cobblestone street in Ķīpsala, Balasta dambis, is not bike friendly; it's better to enjoy the architecture and small boats swaying in the wind

on foot. Once a 17th-century fishing island, Ķīpsala is now one of the most expensive residential areas in Riga. A fresh newcomer here is the Ola Foundation, a private art venue set in a cylindrical three-storey concrete and glass shell that hosts concerts, talks, and exhibitions. Ķīpsala has a wonderful urban beach for swimming and sunbathing, as does Lucavsala, another island a few kilometres' bike ride south along the river. These recreational areas are also equipped with volleyball courts and other sports facilities.

RIGA IS TAILOR-MADE FOR WALKING; IT'S A VERY COMPACT CITY AND ENJOYABLE FOR PEDESTRIANS. Most sites one might want to discover are accessible on foot or via a short taxi ride. Also, the public transport system in the Latvian capital is convenient. Why not catch a tram to ride from one part of the city to another? For instance, tram number 10 is an old blue-and-white car that can take you from picturesque Pārdaugava to the city centre. Alternatively, choose a rented bicycle or electric scooter...although the issue of their safety is still questionable.


From my side of town – or better yet, from the top floors of the National Library of Latvia – one can gaze at a panorama of Riga's city centre in its full glory. When I was little, I had a cute ritual that I adhered to every time I crossed the bridge to the city centre – I greeted the shiny golden rooster figures on top of the Old Town's churches. Roosters, or weathercocks, made of wood or metal appeared on



the rooftops of Riga's buildings in the late  $13^{\text{th}}$  century. According to legend, they guarded houses from devils, who were afraid of the bird's song.

Churches began to crown their spires with golden roosters in the mid-16th century. The highest one stands proudly atop St. Peter's Church (125 metres). The church also has an observation deck accessible via elevator. The weathercock at the top of Riga Cathedral – a must-visit for afternoon organ concerts and medieval grandeur – has stood there for 400 years. The cathedral faces the eye-catching terracotta-orange Riga Bourse building. Shaped like an opulent Venetian Renaissance palazzo, it now holds a museum with an extensive collection of foreign art.

The UNESCO-listed Latvian capital proudly carries its 822 years of history. Riga was one of the most significant trade cities in the Hanseatic League from the 13th to the 15th century. Those ancient traces are found on every corner of the cobblestoned Old Town (or Vecrīga, in Latvian). Its architecture features an eclectic mix of various imperial influences: Polish-Lithuanian, Swedish, German, Russian. A favourite strolling zone of tourists, Vecrīga has a picture-perfect selection of heritage buildings, from the remains of a medieval defensive wall to Romanesque, Gothic, and Baroque gems with an array of signature restaurants and bars in between. The ornate House of the Blackheads that appears on every other postcard of Riga was built in 1334 as a venue for meetings of the Blackheads Society. a community of unmarried, foreign-born merchants based in Livonia from the mid-14th century onward. Completely demolished in the Second World War, it was

# The Old Town's face changes when night falls

rebuilt in 1999 and is worth stepping inside for lush interiors and a collection of historical artefacts.


The main shopping area in the Old Town,  $Galerija\ Centrs$ , first opened in 1938. It has a long glass-covered passage right on the location where the Rīdzene River used to flow. Its newest addition is Burzma, a hip food court on the top floor with ten diverse culinary stations where meals can be enjoyed in a stylish setting or to go.

The Old Town's face changes when night falls. Alongside such time-tested classics as the Latino rhythm-filled *Cuba* bar, *Balzambārs* and its trademark *Riga Black Balsam* cocktails, and *Rock Café* with multiple bars and dance rooms set in a 17<sup>th</sup>-century Baroque building on Mārstaļu iela, some daring newcomers are hitting the Old Town party stage. *Nosaints* is the new hidden bar nestled under the old brick vaults near the Italian embassy. Its dimmed lights, mirrors, and finely crafted cocktails and infusions set a speakeasy tone for a stylish night out. Across the canal, in the basement of the Latvian Academy of Music, the new, experimental *Com* bar and club offers premium cocktails and a dose of unforgettable music.

Before stepping into the elegant, creative streets of the city centre, one should make a detour to the century-old Central Market, one of the largest of its kind in Europe. Five interconnected food pavilions are located inside massive former *Zeppelin* hangars, while the outdoor area bursts with fresh seasonal fruits and veggies.

The market's fish pavilion is the place to go for local delicacies and expressive vendors. Canned sprats and dozens of cold- and hot-smoked fish varieties are signature delicacies to taste in Riga. The entrance to the pavilion is marked by the minimalistic counter of *Rizhskiy Samogon*, the producer of a strong white brandy produced from pure sunflower honey. Degustation – best with a piece of rye bread toast, beetroot, and a slice of herring from the nearby *Siļķītes un Dillītes* restaurant – leads to an irrevocable love affair with Riga. The ergonomic shape of the bottles, which have quickly become a design icon, was created by award-winning designer Artūrs Analts.

The borders of Riga's nightlife scene have been expanding into the so-called Quiet Centre, which turns out to be not that quiet after all. There's hardly a more perfect setting for a stroll than a background of opulent Art Nouveau buildings. Alberta and Elizabetes streets are the quintessence of this style. Most of the buildings here with imposing mascarons and ornate details were designed by Mikhail Eisenstein, the father of Riga-born cult cinema pioneer Sergei Eisenstein.



Adjoining Strēlnieku, Antonijas, and Dzirnavu streets lure visitors with dozens of stylish restaurants that indulge the taste buds of even the most exacting gourmets. Wine enthusiasts shouldn't miss the eternal classic *Vīna Studija*, the stylish and convivial *Noble Wine*, or the cheeky organic-wine newcomer *Truff Le Pig*.

SKANSTE, AN AREA BORDERING RIGA'S HISTORICAL CENTRE, HAD BEEN A HORSE PASTURE SINCE THE 13TH CENTURY. Then it was used as a race course, and later yet, it became a vast area of so-called 'kitchen gardens'. Its revolutionary new chapter began in 2006, when Riga first hosted the Ice Hockey World Championship in the newly built Arena Riga. Now it has turned into a neighbourhood with convenient infrastructure, energy-efficient A-class office buildings, the New Hanza business centre, and constantly evolving cultural life that circles around the award-winning Hanzas Perons venue.

One hang-out spot within close walking distance of Arena Riga is Sporta 2 Quarter. It's a multifunctional urban development project with studio spaces for designers, technical start-ups, and other creative tenants, such as *Kim?* (the leading contemporary art institution in town) and *Oratorio* (a space for music and theatre performances). But the main focal point of this industrial quarter is the laid-back *Zefirs* located in a former hangar. I pass by its spacious white terrace in the late afternoon – it's full of youngsters, families with children, dogs, bicycles, and scooters parked

all around. A DJ is chilling between unpretentious music sets, and it feels as if time is standing still because everyone is captivated by the first bold springtime rays of the sun. Indoors, Neapolitan pizzas are baked, while *Paisums* next door organises celebrations of wine and oysters.

Riga has one of the most intriguing brewing traditions in the Baltics. The Briāna Street Quarter just ten minutes away is a cool party-meets-culture outpost. A beloved gathering place for local bohemians, the eclectic surroundings of this slightly run-down yet charming area centre on beer history. Back in the 19<sup>th</sup> century, the brick buildings here were home to three historical breweries: *Kimmel*, *Kunzendorff*, and *Von Stritzky*. The beautiful C. C. von Stritzky Villa with imposing figures of Dionysus and Hermes atop the entrance gate was the home of the *Stritzky* brewery's owner. Now its garden hosts exuberant open-air concerts.

Deeper into the villa's courtyard, the electronic music rhythms of the *One One* club face the *Labietis* craft beer taproom. This brewery offers trendy beers with a taste of cultural history, offering interpretations of recipes that date back 12 centuries. Here, on a black wooden terrace under

the linden trees, one can taste a variety of crafted gems from l7 taps, as well as ales and bottled beers. Guidance from professional brewers and stories from bartenders are guaranteed.

Valmiermuiža is one of the most famous Latvian craft beer brands, and its 'embassy', which sits just around the corner from *Labietis*, is always full of restless beer tasters. Exploring the creative beer labels that are surely at the top of graphic design artistry is a pleasant addition to the Latvian beer experience.

*M/Darbnīca* is the newest venue for creative events in the Briāna Street Quarter. It's a platform for emerging multidisciplinary artists that features an eclectic interior, art exhibitions, and on top of it all, jazz music. A narrow spiral staircase leads to the second floor, where concerts take place in a cosy green-walled living room. It's a melting pot of improvisation, jam sessions, local talents, and artists from around the globe.

Tallinn Street Quarter lies on the other side of Miera iela from Briāna Street Quarter and features lifestyle cafés and alternative design shops. One of the successful urban revitalisation projects of the Free Riga community, the quarter appeared in 2018 on the site of a former ambulance garage. Surrounded by garages and repair workshops, the courtyard is adorned with street art and colourful murals that create a backdrop for laid-back bars and art spaces. The vintage-vinyl atmosphere of the main two-storey bar echoes the spacious <code>Angārs</code> on the opposite side of the courtyard, which offers

a wide selection of street food, film screenings, and concerts. Other industrial nooks house reckless dance floors, such as Zakuska.

NEW BUSINESS AND RESIDENTIAL AREAS ARE EMERGING ON THE PERIMETER OF RIGA'S CITY CENTRE to revitalise and bring a new lease of life to the outskirts. The former electronic manufacturer VEF - a Soviet giant that produced, among other tech miracles, the world's smallest camera, the Minox - occupies a very large area northeast of the city centre that's getting back on track with technologies and innovations. New tenants and international businesses now fill the spacious red-brick lofts of the VEF Quarter, its promenade hosts live concerts and yoga classes, and the clock tower has newly become the home of Tower, the largest nightclub in the Baltics.

On the other side of Brīvības iela (the main traffic artery), the Jaunā Teika neighbourhood raises VEF's traditions to the next level with the development of information and communication technologies. This dynamic, smart city within a city is filled with advanced office buildings of leading local and international companies, apartment blocks, and inviting co-working and recreational areas.

The image of Riga would not be complete without the presence of water. Like many locals do, I finish my day watching the sunset in Andrejosta. This 4.5-kilometre-long waterfront area near the Art Nouveau district is a creative development project of Riga Port City, and I'm crossing my fingers that one day soon its striking visions of revitalisation will come true. For now, however, this post-industrial district hosts some quite energising seasonal events as well as a few restaurants and clubs. The area around the vacht centre is a favourite place for improvised picnics and a base for SUP and canoe rentals that provide unforgettable tours on the waters of the Daugava River.

Wondersala in Andrejosta is a new open-air stage that plans to host loud concerts and DJ sets all summer long. AOK, or Andrejostas Kvartāls, is a hip and relaxed pit stop with drinks, music, and street food that opens for the season on May 12 with sparkling music sets as well. On May 19-20, the area will host the Under Festival. The celebration of electronic music will include techno, house, dark disco, and more than 40 international DJs on three stages in a groovy urban setting near a massive grain elevator and warehouses.

There's an old legend about the Latvian capital. Every now and then a voice emerges from the depths of the Daugava River and asks if Riga is ready - meaning, has everything finally been built and has life become settled for the residents of the city. The answer is always no. But if one day the answer will be yes, Riga will sink into the water. Maybe this explains why we're taking our time and the city is stepping into the future slowly, albeit surely. Meanwhile, with up to 20 hours of daylight by Midsummer and warm city nights, you're bound to experience Riga's beauty and energy to the fullest.

#### WHERE TO STAY **Dome Hotel**

This recently revamped boutique hotel is located in a gem of 17th-century architecture in the heart of the Old Town. Historical wooden doors, windows, a staircase, and fragments of wall frescoes give a sense of travelling back in time, while some rooms feature an original tiled fireplace. The hotel has only 15 rooms, but it also has a small spa, a sauna, and a rooftop bar with a postcard-like view of the tower of Riga Cathedral. Miesnieku iela 4 domehotel.lv

#### A22

This sleek boutique hotel is situated on the edge of the Art Nouveau district, facing the lush Viesturdārzs park. The building is a former site of the U.S. embassy, and in 1939 a young John F. Kennedy even stayed here. The hotel restaurant, named John, celebrates that occasion with a flawless menu and bold interior. Historical legacy is also reflected in the state-of-the-art rooms filled with rich textures, genuine details, and an artistic touch

#### Metropole

The oldest hotel in Riga is located in a building that dates to 1871. Metropole by Semarah reopened last month with 84 elegant rooms in which classic elements are blended with a modern touch. How would you describe Riga and its residents for someone who's visiting the Latvian capital for the first time? Latvians are slightly introverted in the capital, but they're very introverted out in the countryside. Don't be surprised if we're not too talkative and sparkly; we just need a bit more time to open up! Also, I believe Riga is full of parallel lives and people with peculiar, alternative, and sometimes humorous leisure activities. But you can only experience them if you leave the Old Town.

What are some authentic Riga experiences one should definitely try? The Central Market and Agenskalns Market are great places to start. They're full of locals, and they give a good picture of how we live. They also preserve the important old-school market tradition that has otherwise almost been lost. Another area is the city centre beyond the Old Town (and not exclusively the Quiet Centre!) with its Art Nouveau architecture, cafés, and restaurants where, again, you can meet many locals. Another essential Riga thing is coffee. Try our local best at *Miit* Coffee, Kalve, Rocket Bean Roastery, Innocent, or Naughty Beans Coffee House. And of course, don't miss the opportunity to visit Riga's sandy beaches! come, too.

# What are your favourite places to dine and go out?

My suggestions will be biased because I'm a vegan. We have dozens of vegan-friendly places where everyone, no matter your preferences, can get some finger-licking good meals and large portions: Kozy Eats, Mazā terapija, 2eat if you like Eastern Mediterranean fast food, Miit for great pancake brunches on the weekends, and Stockpot as probably the best-known lunch canteen serving global cuisine. Of course, for a very popular place serving traditional Latvian fare, try the big Lido Leisure Centre. And for adventurous Latvian flavours, 3 Pavāru restorāns might do the job!

Which underrated area of Riga would you recommend exploring and why? Try the Avoti neighbourhood. It's an old, semi-central area full of small cafés and bars (Aleponija, Čau pica, Auss, 1983, Nurme, Laska) as well as alternative cultural venues, such as Low, Zuzeum, Bolderāja, Look, and 427. The residents are mostly locals, young families, and creatives. The vibe and appearance of the main street through this area, Avotu iela, are worth checking out.

# What's the best thing to bring home from Riga?

Latvian crafts and food. Books and publications. Try our locally roasted coffee at the cafés mentioned above. *Lāči* (meaning 'bears' in Latvian) produces delicious sweets, biscuits, and various kinds of bread. Find more contemporary traditional crafts and design at *Riija*, head to *Neputns* for beautiful books, go to *Valmiermuižas vēstniecība* for a massive selection of beer, and check out *M50* for some wearable Latvian design.

# Where would you suggest going on a day trip outside Riga?

My favourite suggestions are the towns of Cēsis or Kuldīga. But it's best if you have a full, somewhat sunny day and you wake up early. They're both lovely towns with great architecture, nature, and tons of creative potential. Best to visit Friday through Sunday.

# How do you see the future of Riga, in which direction is it developing?

I hope the city will become even more of a European hub of sustainable creative industries, events, and culture. We have the history, the vibe, and the creative capital for that to happen. Of course, we'd appreciate more reliable financial momentum, but that will eventually come, too.

#### Shōvu

A quirky newcomer on Riga's restaurant scene, cosy *Shōyu* offers savoury hot bowls of ramen in an authentic Japanese ramen-shop atmosphere. The menu includes a creative selection of ramen soups with crafted noodles, soupless ramen, and vegan bowls as well as fried ice cream and mochi for dessert. Oh, and original cocktails to spice up the day.

# ALL FOR THE GAME

Baltic Outlook met with two legendary ice hockey players, each of them representing a country hosting this year's IIHF Ice Hockey World Championship. They are legendary indeed – Sandis Ozoliņš (50) from Latvia and Jere Lehtinen (49) from Finland have both played for their respective national teams in world championships and in the Olympic Games. They have both won the most prestigious professional ice hockey trophy, the Stanley Cup, while playing in the National Hockey League (NHL). Even more, they have both played against each other and still remember what that was like.

And both Ozoliņš and Lehtinen have not lost their connection with the sport. Ozoliņš has worked as a coach and is now part of the scouting team for the NHL's Colorado Avalanche. Lehtinen joined the management of the Finnish national men's ice hockey team almost right after he ended his career as a player over ten years ago. Now he's the general manager of the national team.

But the most interesting thing in these conversations was to learn about the careers of these two players through their own perspectives. It was our honour to join the journey of these two different people, two different personalities, for whom ice hockey still plays a large role in their lives.

### FIRST CONVERSATION. IN RIGA

'I would like for this championship to be a celebration for everyone involved,' says Sandis Ozoliņš when we meet in central Riga on a quiet Friday morning. 'I'd like to see people on the streets, cheering for our team and for others. It doesn't matter who wins, because next year someone else will win anyway. I want there to be joy and satisfaction, so that we can express ourselves emotionally in these games.' Actually, he says that at the end of our conversation, when we turn to talking about this year's men's ice hockey championship taking place in Riga and Tampere. But in a way, with these statements Ozoliņš expresses the overall feeling that prevails in the city. People here don't talk about hockey competitions; they talk about hockey celebrations.

'I also don't try to over-analyse and predict the outcomes of games,' Ozoliņš continues. 'In a way, the world championship is very unpredictable, especially the first part – the group games. But the result is not as important as how we celebrate this event as a country, as a city, and as fans.'

When it comes to the Latvian national team, Ozoliņš says it is a belief that anything is possible, despite the odds, that has allowed the team to play in the world's top division for so many years: "The Latvian mentality is one of perseverance and a desire to prove that we're one of the big nations, despite the fact that we're actually a very small country in terms of area and population. This gives us the fearlessness to face much bigger countries that have much better odds.'

Ozoliņš began his professional career in the NHL in 1991. In fact, he played his last game for the USSR national junior team just a few days before flying to the United States. It was a turbulent time for Latvia, a country that had just regained its independence from the Soviet Union in May 1991. In just a matter of days, Ozoliņš was offered a chance to join the San Jose Sharks in the NHL. Latvia still had no national team of its own.

'I still remember that very tense, strange feeling at the time. I was still in high school, but the idea of our country's independence was already in the air – we'd draw a Latvian flag or folk ornament in our notebook and then hide it, so no one would see it,' Ozoliņš remembers. 'Some kids knew the lyrics to the Latvian national anthem, which was banned back then. So there was something in the air, but we still didn't really understand what was happening around us or what freedom meant. Back then, for a child or youth, freedom probably meant not having to go to school. Or being able to decide whether to do our

homework or not. Which, of course, is true. But the United States taught me about the responsibilities and consequences that come with freedom and the freedom to choose.'

#### ABOUT A DREAM THAT WAS NOT A DREAM

The NHL was Ozoliņš' biggest dream come true. But, as he himself admits, given the context of the time, it was a dream he couldn't even dare to dream, because he could never have imagined it coming true.

'It's hard for me to even compare it to anything. It's like if someone told me I could become the president of the United States,' he says. 'I know full well that I can't be president because I know what the preconditions are for that to happen. And I know just as clearly that I cannot fulfil them. And it was roughly the same when it came to the NHL. My investment had been my time in training and my athletic skills, but I got into the NHL thanks to a series of coincidences and happening to play at a time when the country, and also the social structure, was changing. The rules changed independently of me. My actual dream was much more down-to-earth – I wanted to play for the then-legendary Dinamo Riga team.'

But five years later, in 1996, Ozoliņš became a Stanley Cup champion with the Colorado Avalanche. During his career in the NHL, he participated in seven NHL All-Star Games. In the 16 years he spent playing for NHL teams, he became known as a very skilled offensive defenceman and also experienced from the inside how the NHL itself changed.

'They were huge changes. Originally, playing in the NHL was a well-paid job; the salary at that time was only slightly higher than what you could earn with a good education, working hard, or building your own business,' Ozoliņš recalls. 'And also for the businessmen who owned the teams, it was something nice to have, because success in their main business made it possible to support a hockey team. But by the time I left the NHL in 2008, hockey had become a 24/7 business. The players received much higher salaries, but they also understood what the training process, the discipline, one's diet, and all the other aspects that make up this organism mean – in other words, what it takes for a team to function as a company, as a business project.'

When they step out onto the ice, the game – which lasts about two and a half hours – is the quintessence of all the very practical and meticulously planned work that goes on during the preparation. 'I compare




'It doesn't matter who wins, because next year someone else will win anyway. I want there to be joy and satisfaction.'

it to going on stage, to actors and musicians who spend countless hours rehearsing in order to be ready to perform at one particular moment. It requires an adjustment in lifestyle. And it brought about a complete change in the players' attitude,' Ozoliņš explains. 'Because the competition was fierce, and I learned that through plenty of bumps and bruises. I saw that the young players were arriving in August already in better physical shape, slimmer, and faster.'

Competition has always existed. 'There's always someone ready to take your place in the NHL, because every year another group of 18- and 19-yearolds joins the team through the training camps. Those kids also want to fulfil their dream and play where you are, but there's not enough room for everyone,' says Ozolinš. 'At first, everything worried me, and it took me about three years to calm down a bit. I eventually got used to the system and learned to separate what was worth worrying about from what wasn't. There are better seasons, and there are worse seasons. Even in the same season, there can be periods when it feels like everything is going well and periods when it feels like nothing is going well, my days are numbered... And you're constantly being judged – by the coach, by the owners who pay your salary, by the fans in the U.S., by the fans in Latvia, by your family, by your friends. By the media in both countries. Ultimately, by myself. And in my case, I'm my most ruthless judge.

However, as Ozoliņš admits now, ten years after playing his last game, self-criticism was his strong point: 'I used to even pride myself on being very selfcritical.' But that's a deceptive game, and only now through psychology - has he begun to grasp many of its nuances, of what really went on. He explains: 'There's healthy self-criticism, which allows you to draw conclusions and move on; there's unhealthy self-criticism, when you're always frustrated and don't see the positive side of things; and I've also identified a third type of self-criticism that pertains to me, namely, setting one's standards too high. For example, when you haven't reached your goals, but you nevertheless want someone from the outside to say that it's okay, it's fine the way it is. So now, I realise that many times I've been overly self-critical in order to receive assurances that everything's fine anyway.'

#### ABOUT THE MOST MEMORABLE MOMENTS

Ozoliņš played his first game with the Latvian national men's ice hockey team in 1998, after the Colorado Avalanche lost to the Edmonton Oilers in the first round of the play-offs. He flew directly to the world championship in Switzerland, where he scored a goal and made two assists for Latvia. 'As pertains to the national team, I've come to the conclusion that I wish I had made different choices in my life, but I realise that I cannot go back in time. And, given my youth, my level of maturity, and my experience at the time, I realise that in fact my decisions could not have been different,' Ozoliņš admits.

'I also remember that tournament in Switzerland because of the fact that I joined the national team full of energy and used to fighting for everything for my team. We had won the Stanley Cup a couple of years earlier, and we needed to do it again. But back then, the Latvian national team's goal was very modest: just stay in the top division. For a 25-year-old player who thinks he can do anything, what kind of goal is that? Hence my attitude...'

Ozoliņš continues: 'Back then, I was probably not mature enough to properly assess what this tournament meant for the fans and for my teammates. Because a lot depended on their performance in the championship; it affected their

future career and life. I, on the other hand, wasn't affected by it. That's the only way I can justify my careless attitude. I wish I had not been like that, and I changed my attitude towards the end of my career, but that was me when I was young.'

Asked to name his most memorable moments with the national team, Ozoliņš first mentions the game against Germany in the 2001 World Championship, which Latvia had to win in order to not be relegated. More precisely, he means the feeling of injustice in the way the referees influence the course of a game, which can lead to a forfeit. Another, more positive, moment was the Olympic Qualification Tournament in Riga in 2013. Arena Riga was packed with fans, and after winning the last game against France, the spectators rose to their feet and the Latvian team did a lap of honour around the ice rink.

'That was a very important moment for me personally, a huge feeling of togetherness,' says Ozoliņš. 'That feeling continued at the Winter Olympics in Sochi, which were also important for me, because I realised that this was the last time I'd be playing at an event like this. I was 4l years old, and I accepted that our team's result no longer depended on my performance, but I had been given the opportunity to enjoy this moment, and enjoy it in the way that I should have been enjoying all of my more than 20 years in hockey. But I was grateful for having at least this final stage of my career.'

'I think patriotism is actually an internal feeling, not so much an external one. We can each put on a shirt, pin on a badge, sing an anthem, but really most important is our internal patriotism and how it manifests itself in everyday life,' he says. 'For me, too, it has manifested itself in different ways, because I've been a different person in different stages of my life. To me, it begins in everyday life, with duty and respect for the environment in

which we live. Not in appearances and fleeting emotions, but in everyday actions.'

'That's really the only thing I have to share with others – being able to speak from my own experience about how things ought to be, that there are things in life that are far more valuable than we may think,' Ozoliņš says. 'But I also understand very well that the boys are still young, they'll do things the way they see fit and think, "What's that old man talking about? [laughs] I know better!" That's normal, I did the same. Why should they be different? Sometimes I look at them and smile: "Oh man, eventually you'll get it, you'll understand what real satisfaction is."

Ozoliņš began coaching almost by chance. In any case, he had not planned to pursue a career as a coach after he retired from playing hockey professionally. But once he started, he quickly realised that he loved it. 'I really enjoyed it, and I got a heap of bruises and scrapes, some of them fantastically painful, but every job has them. The only difference is that coaches are judged publicly.' The job gave Ozoliņš a much better understanding of his own former coaches, their experiences, their anger and feelings of helplessness, and also their feelings of satisfaction – the whole gamut of emotions involved in coaching.

'At the same time, I realised what I wanted to replicate in my work as a coach, and what I definitely didn't want to repeat – what human values, ethical choices, attitudes, and ways of

communicating are acceptable or not acceptable to me,' Ozoliņš says. 'So, while I can understand a certain action, the motivation behind it, the effect, and even the result it achieves, if it's not acceptable to me, I won't do it. But, as happens in life, I have made mistakes and done things I said I'd never do. And so then it's my turn to draw conclusions and try to avert or reduce my impulsiveness. To improve myself. It's this never-ending process in life. I allow myself to change; even more, I contribute to that change.'

However, considering the current geopolitical situation, Ozoliņš left his coaching job in Russia last year and returned to Latvia, seeking new opportunities to provide for his family. For some time already, he'd played around with the idea of becoming a scout, but he hadn't acted on it. After a phone call to his former teammate Joe Sakic, who is now President of Hockey Operations at Colorado Avalanche, Ozolinš finally decided to try scouting. 'As a result, I've earned airBaltic Executive status, because a big part of my job is attending games and tournaments throughout Europe,'

he says with a laugh. The Colorado Avalanche has a whole team that scouts in North America and Europe. So does every one of the 32 NHL teams. Some of Ozoliņš' colleagues have been scouting for decades; one has even been at it for 45 years.

'Scouting has evolved with the advent of modern technology and the availability of resources. It's become much easier, more accessible, more transparent,' Ozoliņš explains. 'And at the same time, my colleagues see the same things that I see, and so do our competitors, who are also looking for young talent. And so do the agents who represent potential players.'

Asked what kind of players catch his eye, Ozoliņš says they're probably similar in some ways to the guy he was 30 years ago: 'Of course, everyone likes

the goal scorers; they're the easiest ones to evaluate [laughs]. But there are so many players and also different scoring systems. In a way, it's about anticipation, making educated guesses about what might happen or might not happen, how players might develop. I find it very interesting, although this work has required a shift in perception, especially regarding the speed at which things happen. As a player, I know there's a beginning, an end, and a result, and I know how I've played. But in this line of work, the result will only be known in two, three, maybe even five years. It's not easy to assume whether my opinion will come true or not. But the most important thing is that I'm once again part of the process called the NHL.'

In the spring of 2002, during his NHL career, Ozoliņš opened the first golf course in Riga, on the shores of Ķīšezers Lake. It's rated one of the most beautiful, but also among the most challenging, courses in northern Europe. Since returning to Latvia last year, Ozoliņš has taken over the day-to-day management of the golf club, which opened to players in April after a winter break. 'It was a crazy idea from my youth. I didn't realise the consequences of it – the energy and the financial investment it would require, nor the benefits of it or the dayto-day problems that would have to be dealt with,' he says. 'Now I'd look at all aspects of this project very differently. But the golf course is now part of my life, with all the worries but also the satisfaction that comes with it.'

Jere Lehtinen, the general manager of the Finnish national men's ice hockey team, also plays golf occasionally. 'Yes, of course I remember him!' Ozoliņš says with a smile, and the expression on his face shows that the mention of Lehtinen has taken him back almost 20 years. He remembers those matches almost as if they had happened yesterday.

'We lost two very important games to the Dallas Stars in the Stanley Cup, and Lehtinen was one of the reasons we lost... He was one of the guys covering me to make sure I didn't score [laughs]. That was so irritating! He'd get in the way and get on your nerves and play against you. But while he prevented me from scoring, he sometimes scored himself! In a game, it's not just those who can score who are important; it's also those who prevent the opponent from scoring.'





#### **SECOND CONVERSATION.** IN ESPOO

I meet Jere Lehtinen in Espoo, a town near Helsinki. He is the former right winger for the Dallas Stars who always covered Ozoliņš, thus preventing him from making goals.

'Yes, he was a great player!' Lehtinen says with a laugh. 'We had a good rivalry against the Colorado Avalanche, where he played. He was a defenceman, and I had to play against him. He was a good defenceman, but he had incredible skills on the offence side, too. It was tough to play against him. He scored a few goals while I was on the ice, and I do remember those moments...'

The former player (now the general manager of the Finnish national men's ice hockey team) I'm sitting across from in the cafeteria of the local ice hockey arena is a Finnish hockey legend with an impressive record measured in countless trophies and medals. He became a Stanley Cup champion in 1999. Together with the Finnish national team, he won four medals in the Olympic Games (one silver and three bronze) and three silvers and a gold medal in the World Championship. But it all began right here where we meet, in the Ilmatar arena. To be precise, there was still no arena here when Lehtinen first began skating, just an ice rink. The arena that was eventually built on this site is now demolished, and the new arena opened recently.

'I lived just a few blocks from here,' Lehtinen says and glances at the multi-storey apartment buildings across the street. 'That's my neighbourhood, and now I'm back here again. We moved to Espoo and live just a few minutes down the road. In a way, I've come full circle. I started out here, and now we're back. I didn't mean to do that; it just happened.'

Playing ice hockey was what all the kids around here did. Football in the summer, and then in the winter the field was turned into an ice rink for hockey. Lehtinen's brother, who is three years older than him, began playing hockey with his friends, and Lehtinen soon joined him, using his older brother's skates. 'At the time, it was so important that everything was so close, within a few minutes' reach,' he says. 'That made the whole thing way easier and more accessible.'

Over the course of his professional career, Lehtinen has only played for three teams: the local Kiekko-Espoo team, then TPS (a ten-time champion of the Finnish SM-liiga), and then 14 seasons with the Dallas Stars in the NHL. He feels lucky that he didn't have to move anywhere from Dallas and says Dallas was a good place to be. But in Lehtinen's mind, luck – that intangible factor so often invoked in sports – is something one has to earn.

He continues: "The way I played and how I approached things helped, too. When I stopped playing, I thought a lot about my life, about how I had played, why things had happened in a certain way. And if you had asked me what the key was, my answer is that I've always put my team first. I wanted the team to win, and only then came whatever happened to me personally. If the team succeeded, then I as a player also did very well. I always approached the game that way while I was playing hockey, and even when I played football. They're both team sports, so of course, it's about being in a group in which you trust each other, and you all want the same thing – for the team to win.'

#### ABOUT LUCK, WHICH NEEDS TO BE EARNED

When Lehtinen left Espoo for TPS, his plan wasn't to move to TPS; instead, he wanted to get better coaching. Although he had had a good coach at Espoo and the experience there helped him a lot, TPS was the next step in his development as a player. By the time he moved to Dallas, he was ready to go. Two seasons at TPS had been enough.

As the other key ingredient of his success Lehtinen names the fact that he's always been surrounded by good players and good coaches and has been a part of good organisations. 'It's never been only for the sake of the trophies or medals. But of course, in sports you want to win – you don't start a game and wish to lose it,' he says. 'Work hard, have fun, but there's always that wish to win. And if you lose, especially if you lose in the finals of a championship tournament, it's a horrible thing. I tend to think about the fact that there are so many good players who've never had the opportunity to play for medals. Great players who haven't even been on a team at all.'

Lehtinen thinks it was the same thing with winning the Stanley Cup in 1999. A year earlier, the team had already been quite good, and a year later, the Dallas Stars again played in the finals but lost. After that experience, he realised how tough it actually is to win such trophies.

'But if you do good things, every day, all the time, then luck might eventually strike. You have to earn it. I feel that way more and more,' Lehtinen says. 'That said, the Stanley Cup is still the toughest one to win. National team tournaments are different, because they take place over much shorter periods of time, but it takes a whole season to win the Stanley Cup. In addition, it's the world's best players playing for it and there are countless unpredictable things that can happen along the way, including injuries, transfers, and so on. And again, so many great players haven't even had a chance to play for it.'

During Lehtinen's career with the Dallas Stars, the team had two owners, both of whom made sure that the organisation was at the top level. Before Lehtinen joined the team, it had been known as the Minnesota North Stars; the team had just moved to Dallas in 1993. But nobody in Dallas knew anything about ice hockey before the team arrived.

#### 'Work hard, have fun, but there's always that wish to win'

'I saw how it grew, how people started to follow hockey,' Lehtinen remembers. 'In my first season there, the house was half full. There were not that many spectators, and they didn't know much about the rules of the game, either. But that changed pretty quickly as the understanding grew. Back in the day, the city had the Dallas Cowboys, an American football team winning Super Bowls. People from Texas and Dallas, they like winners. Therefore, when we started playing better, people began attending games more and more.'

The game of ice hockey experienced a dramatic evolution during Lehtinen's time. The rules were changed, making the game faster and faster. There was much more speed to it.

'In my younger years, I was a true workaholic. I liked to work hard in the summers and the offseasons, but, of course, this change in the game required me to change as well,' Lehtinen explains. 'No heavy weights anymore, because you needed to get going on the ice, you needed to get a little faster. To be able to do so, you had to become a little lighter, and a couple of kilograms less made a lot of difference; I felt better, and I was able to play more energetically. Back when I started, however, the game was different – it was way more physical, with more hooking and holding. Practice routines also changed with time, because getting older means you can get injured more easily.'


Each sport attracts a certain type of personality, and when I ask Lehtinen to tell me about ice hockey players in that regard, he says that they're overwhelmingly team players. Meaning that they understand team dynamics very well. 'Of course, people are different, but usually they take that team



spirit with them off the ice as well,' he says. 'I think hockey people are good at doing things together. They're team players in all senses of the word.'

#### ABOUT TEAM SPIRIT

The team spirit Lehtinen speaks about is very characteristic of the Finnish national men's ice hockey team. This will now be his ninth season since he became the team's general manager, but his own journey towards playing on that team began in his junior years: 'The national team is very close to my heart, because I grew up following it, watching its games, and thinking how great it would be to be there myself... Could this really happen to me some day? And then when it did happen, when I first put on the jersey of the national team, that was a moment that will stay with me for the rest of my life.'

Lehtinen truly enjoyed coming back and playing in national team tournamenets. But there was another thing to it as well. When playing for Dallas, the team had players from many different countries, but the national team consists of his Finnish teammates, whom he has known for a long time. To get together and play for their

own country was a special thing. After his career as a player ended, he realised just how lucky he had been to play those tournaments. 'While you're there and doing it, you just focus on your next game and don't think about the meaning of it all,' he says.

Right after he finished playing, Lehtinen thought about doing something completely different. But he realised quite quickly that he still wanted to be around the game and around the team. 'I realised that I can help to see the game from a different perspective,' he says. 'To see the players on ice, to see their strong and weak sides. At first it wasn't a full-time job, which was important at the time because we still lived in Dallas. But when we moved back to Finland, it became a full-time job. And nowadays, on top of that, I'm also involved in the Finnish Ice Hockey Association.'

Judging from the list of accomplishments of Finland's national team in recent years, Lehtinen has built a good team. To say the least. They are the current world and Olympic champions, winning both gold medals last year. Lehtinen is humble about these successes. 'Yes, we've had some good times,' he says. 'Again, I have to say that I feel lucky to be a part of the national team. I started with a smaller role and was able to observe what's going on inside the team. We've had good coaches, good players, and I believe we earned our luck over these years. Because of how we play, how we understand the situation.'

For this year's championship, Lehtinen is looking for players with an attitude quite like his own. That is, players who put the team first. But different players nevertheless have different roles – the team needs players for power play as well as so-called penalty killers. 'We need good players who can play our style of hockey, which means playing together,' Lehtinen summarises. 'But at the same time, we let the guys be themselves; they don't have to change when they join the national team. But they do first have to show some specific things within themselves, and if they

have those necessary traits and skills, then there's a chance they'll be part of the national team.'

First, the players have to really be proud to be there. And this is required not only of players but also of the rest of the staff. Then come players' overall skills and specialties, the things that make each of them unique. One thing Lehtinen is happy about as a general manager is that there are so many good Finnish players to choose from.

Our conversation takes place in late March, and it's still too early to tell exactly what the Finnish team will look like for the championship. But Lehtinen thinks that, for the most part, the team will consist of players who have already played for the past four years. Still, there's competition for many of the spots on the team.

'Having the world championship in Finland again is a special thing. It's a home tournament, and no one knows when Finland will host the tournament again, so this makes it tough for everyone,' Lehtinen says. 'There will be tough decisions to make, because we can't invite all of the players we'd like to invite. We'll play nine exhibition games after Easter, which will be important for us and for the players. We'll also have to see how the teams with Finnish players are doing in the NHL. Last year, we got top-level players with Miro Heiskanen, Mikael Granlund, and Esa Lindell. But they joined after the tournament had already started. We hadn't done that before - usually when we start a

tournament, we already have all the players there. It's better for the team chemistry to complete the team as early as possible. Last year was different because we had top NHL players available, and of course, we wanted to give them a chance to come and play. In the end, it was a very good result, but to be honest, I don't know what's going to happen this year.'

Lehtinen remembers the games against Latvia's national team, both as a player and as a general manager: 'If you look at the results, they've been tight games. I like Latvia as a team. They're honest players, skilled players, they play hard, and they play as a team. That's why it's a tough team to beat. It doesn't matter what tournaments they've been, world championships or other, they've always been tough games.'

But once the competition is over, Lehtinen will most likely spend his free time on his boat. 'Water is everywhere here, all around us, and I practically grew up on a boat. My parents had a summer place on a small island, and we had a boat to get there,' he says. Now he and his family enjoy spending time at their own summer house not far away on the mainland.

'I like the sea, and I like water,' Lehtinen continues. 'When I played in Dallas, there was no water nearby, and I really missed that. When we went to play on the East Coast or the West Coast, Florida or Los Angeles, I always went for a walk on the beach just to see the ocean and take a deep breath.'

Other than that, you might see the Finnish national team's general manager at a summer music festival - he likes heavier music and enjoys attending concerts during his time off. Or perhaps on a golf course: 'I'm not particularly good at golf, but I like playing it.'

And so, may the best team win! bo

## WHERE THE MAGIC IS HAPPENING

The 2023 IIHF Ice Hockey World Championship will take place from May 12 to 28 in Tampere and Riga, at the biggest venues in two of the world's most passionate hockey countries. Here are some interesting facts you may not know.



#### **ARENA RIGA IN RIGA**, LATVIA

With a capacity of up to 9550 spectators, Arena Rigar is serving as the Latvian venue for the 2023 IIHF Ice Hockey World Championship, just as it did in 2006 and 2021. It is hosting one preliminary-round group and two quarter-final games. While the arena was built for the 2006 IIHF Ice Hockey World Championship, it is also used for other European-level sports events (the European championships in basketball for men and women, the Davis Cup in tennis, etc.) as well as concerts by world-class musicians.

This year, the organisers are planning to create a large-scale fan zone by Arena Riga for everyone to enjoy the atmosphere of this grand event. It will feature a variety of attractions, souvenir and fan merchandise stands, screens with live broadcasts of the games, and a wide range of foods and beverages. The zone will also be open to those without tickets to the games. 'In cooperation with the Riga City Council, we're creating a two-week hockey festival throughout the city of Riga. Riga will become the Hockey Capital of the World during this time,' says Edgars Buncis, the managing director of the Latvia Organising Committee of the 2023 IIHF Ice Hockey World Championship.

Latvia is well known for its passionate ice-hockey fans, who wear maroon-white-maroon shirts, scarves, and other apparel and can fill the biggest venues with their cheers and songs. The Latvian national ice hockey team's participation in the world championship is the most popular sporting event of the year. It brings fans together in person and in front of their TV screens. Latvia's fans are known and welcomed all over the world, and what everyone needs to know is that they're passionate, loud, and friendly,' says Buncis. The players also acknowledge that the fans' chants of 'Latvija, Latvija!' have often provided crucial support in tense situations on the ice.

The Latvian national men's ice hockey team participated in the world championship for the first time in 1933 in Prague. A local tournament was organised before then to raise funds for the team to travel to the championship. Five local hockey teams took part in that tournament, and there were about 300 spectators. Nowadays, several thousand supporters accompany the Latvian national men's ice hockey team to away games, while tickets for home games usually sell out within a few days.

In 1992, the Latvian national hockey team played its first official game following the restoration of the country's independence, and this marked a significant turning point in the development of Latvian ice hockey. Since 1997, the national team has been competing in Group A of the world championship, among the best national teams in the world. Its highest achievement is three seventh-place finishes. However, many believe that the team's most resounding and symbolically significant success was its 3-2 victory over the then-mighty Russian national team in Saint Petersburg in 2000.

#### **NOKIA ARENA IN TAMPERE.** FINLAND

The newly opened Nokia Arena in Tampere is serving as the main venue for the championship, just as it did for the 2022 IIHF Ice Hockey World Championship. It is hosting one preliminary-round group, two quarter-finals, and all of the semi-final and medal games.

Designed by the internationally renowned architect Daniel Libeskind, the arena opened in December 2021 and is considered one of Europe's most modern entertainment venues, guaranteeing a premium experience for athletes and spectators alike. It has up to 15,000 seats and is the first next-generation arena to be constructed right in the heart of the city. In addition, Nokia Arena includes a wide range of commercial offerings, including several restaurants, versatile event facilities, and a first-class hotel. And, as Tampere is the Sauna Capital of the World, it's only natural that the hotel also has more than 70 saunas.

The main tenants of Nokia Arena are the local ice hockey clubs Tappara (meaning 'battle axe') and Ilves (meaning 'lynx', although locals call it a kitty). Both of them are among the all-time most successful teams in a sport that is a distinctive part of Finnish national identity and culture. Officially, Finland has 75,682 registered hockey players and 260 ice-hockey arenas. However, according to Antti Toiviainen, the director of development at *Business Tampere*, that number would double if you were to count all the skates and hockey sticks used during a single season in Tampere alone.

'Ice hockey is played by children, teens, and grownups on natural ice rinks all around Finland, just like football elsewhere. It's not even an exaggeration to say that, in Tampere, some kids learn how to skate before they learn how to walk,' Toiviainen continues. In recent years, the number of female players has also grown significantly, and Finland has ranked third in the world (after Canada and the United States) in the women's championship for the past decade. The Finnish national men's hockey team won gold at both the Olympics and the World Championships in 2022.

Whenever Finland wins in an international championship or a local team becomes the champion of the Finnish Elite League, or Liiga, the usually rather reserved and famously introverted Finns gather to celebrate. 'Finnish hockey-fan culture is everywhere during the championships – on the streets, in the bars, at work, in schools, in the media – and hockey dominates the small talk,' Toiviainen says. 'The most viewed television programmes of the year are our Independence Day celebration in December and the ice-hockey championship finals.'

Finnish fans know very well what it's like to be an underdog, because it took Finland decades to win against the big countries. They therefore tend to cheer for the underdogs...and quite seldom for their long-standing rival Sweden. Interestingly, the favourite song of Finnish fans is 'Den glider in' (or, 'it glides in'). 'It was the goal song of the Swedish team in 1995, when Stockholm hosted the championship. Finland won its first World Championship gold against Sweden, and the rest is history. If you're a foreigner in Finland, the easiest way to become friends with Finns is to say "Den glider in" and smile. Then you're one of us,' Toiviainen explains.

#### CHAMPIONSHIP SCHEDULE

Defending champion Finland will play against Austria, Denmark, France, Germany, Hungary, Sweden, and the United States in Group A in Tampere. Group B in Riga includes Canada, Czechia, Kazakhstan, Latvia, Norway, Slovakia, Slovenia, and Switzerland. The preliminary round will take place from May 12 to 23 at Nokia Arena in Tampere and Arena Riga in Riga. Tampere and Riga will also each host two quarter-final games. The semi-finals and the medal games will all be held in Tampere.



#### IN RIGA

To make attending the hockey championship even more joyful, the Latvia Hockey Federation has been preparing an impressive festival right in the car park of Arena Riga to keep fans entertained and promote mingling with other supporters. From May 12 to 25, the parking lot at Arena Riga will turn into a grand festival grounds, hosting more than 10,000 fans daily. Starting with the grand opening on May 12 and through the entire two weeks of the championship, all hockey fans and game attendees are welcome in this fan zone to watch broadcasts of all the games, listen to live performances by well-known Latvian artists and DJs, and fill their stomachs with all sorts of delicious food and drinks.

If you're hoping to get a selfie or shake the hand of your favourite hockey player, you're in luck, because meetings with the players will be organised after most games. This is also the place to increase your own sense of competition, as various contests will be conducted in the fan zone on a daily basis. Attendance is free of charge, so if you're seeking to kick off the festival season with a party for hockey fans, look no further and have fun next to Arena Riga. #### IN TAMPERE


The first game of ice hockey in Finland took place... yes, you guessed it, in Tampere. That was in 1928. But besides this historical fact, Tampere is proud to have two professional and very successful hockey teams: Ilves and Tappara. During this year's world championship, the place to be for fans is the Fan Zone at Rautatienkatu 27, just a stone's throw away from Nokia Arena. There you'll be able to watch the games on a huge screen, listen to interviews with players, enjoy good food, get a drink at the bar, and listen to live music performances. DJs will also help to create an exciting atmosphere. Check the dates for specific events. The Fan Zone will offer various games for fans to play, and if you fancy, you can even get a tattoo. Official fan merchandise will also be available for purchase.

However, if the official Fan Zone feels too crowded,
head to the Sorin Aukio Fan Zone,
which will be open during Finland's games.
But there's more! The Keskustori Summer Terrace is also
a nice place to experience the games. Watch them on the
screen out in the open air and choose your snacks and
drinks from plenty of food and drink stalls. There are about
500 seats for customers, and there's no age limit. The terrace
is centrally located, at Keskustori I. Check the website for

Just a short distance from the Summer Terrace, you'll find an
activity area set up in the parking lot of the Central Market

#### IN RIGA

The gastronomic variety of Riga combines traditional with high-quality international cuisines. Restaurants and cafés tend to use locally-sourced ingredients, and in springtime, you're likely to find various gourmet experiments with seasonal fruits and vegetables.

If you wish to get a taste of how Latvian grandmothers feed their beloved grandchildren, you must pay a visit to one of the *Lido* restaurants. Set up like a buffet, customers can fill their platters with various dishes to sample different soups, meats, and vegetarian options.

After trying out the traditional meals, Riga has a grand offering of international cuisine as well. Most of the finedining restaurants are located in the Klusais Centrs (Quiet Centre) neighbourhood. Those who love Italian cuisine will find themselves immersed in a world of melty burrata and juicy carpaccio at Rossini and Italissimo (Dzirnavu 31 and Baznīcas 27/29), while foodies who fancy a variety of meat dishes will love the grand assortment at *Lidojošā varde* (meaning 'flying frog', Elizabetes 3la). For the best view of the Daugava River, be sure to pay a visit to *Naples* in the Andrejsala district (Andrejostas iela 5), which also lies only a short walk away from the Quiet Centre. Lovers of seafood and Asian cuisine will also be able to find something to their liking in the Quiet Centre at Zivju lete (Dzirnavu 41) and Shōyu (Ausekļa 20), respectively, both of which are also popular among locals. Latvia is well-known for its craft beers. While there are numerous beer bars scattered around Riga, the most prominent is Beer Museum (Dzirnavu iela 34a). There you'll be received with more than 70 kinds of beer, and you'll surely return to your

home or hotel with well-developed preferences for certain beers.

#### IN TAMPERE

Tampere has a good selection of restaurants and bars offering traditional dishes as well as international cuisine. One thing you surely shouldn't miss is the black sausage, or *mustamakkara* in Finnish. It's a blood sausage traditionally eaten with lingonberry jam, and Tampere is especially known for it. You'll notice it at breakfast at the hotel, but it's best when eaten fresh from food stalls at the market. The most authentic place to eat *Tapola* black sausage in Tampere is on a market square: *Tammelantori* at Ilmarinkatu 10 sells black sausage, as does *Laukontori* at Laukontori 4.

Another restaurant serving traditional meals is *Pispalan Pulteri*, established back in 1968. Located a few kilometres from the city centre, at Pispalan valtatie 23, it serves steaks, grilled liver, and even a dish called 'Finnish Way of Life', which (weather permitting) serves butter-fried herring steaks with pickles, lemon, and mashed potatoes with dill. If you're a meat lover, head to *Huber* at Aleksis Kiven katu 13. Enjoy the relaxed atmosphere at this restaurant, which has been selected as one of the 50 best restaurants in Finland. At Tampere Market Hall (enter from Hallituskatu 13 or Hämeenkatu 19), you'll find a wide variety of food, from meatballs to sushi. The best burgers in Tampere are there as well, at *Ohana Grille*. For an excellent lunch, try the *4 Seasons* restaurant, which offers a French-style menu and the best bouillabaisse in town.

If you're looking for pizza, head to *Pizzeria Napoli* at Aleksanterinkatu 3l, which has a menu of over 100 pizzas. Try, for example, pizza number 100, which includes *Finlandia* vodka and Finnish braised venison.

Local beers and large portions of food can be enjoyed in the Finlayson area at the *Plevna* restaurant (Itäinenkatu 8). The atmosphere is very traditional, with famous black sausage and other local dishes on the menu. The *Tuulensuu* gastropub (Hämeenpuisto 23) has been voted Finland's best beer restaurant, and it truly does serve excellent food.

In the medieval era, Riga was a part of the Hanseatic League. It was later possessed by the Swedish Empire, Russian Empire, Soviet Union, and other large neighbouring countries. This past has influenced the city's architecture; while many of its medieval buildings still remain intact or have been restored, Old Riga also features architectural gems from various other eras erected in place of buildings lost in wars.

ICE HOCKEY WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

The entrance to Old Riga is marked by the Freedom Monument, where Latvians gather for national celebrations. At its top stands a female figure, nicknamed Milda, who holds three stars symbolising the three historic regions of Latvia. The beautiful opera house also stands nearby.

After entering the Old Town, visitors encounter numerous architectural wonders, including the trio of medieval buildings known as the Three Brothers, Riga Cathedral, the majestic House of the Blackheads, and the Cat House. The best views of the city can be seen from the tower of Saint Peter's Church, so make sure to ride the elevator up to the viewing platform there.

History lovers should also see the Latvian War Museum to learn more about Latvia's history and what the nowindependent country went through to achieve its own place in the world. Those wishing to know more about the country's period under Soviet occupation will want to visit the KGB Building - or Stūra māja (Corner House), as the locals call it just outside the historic city centre.

After strolling through the historical centre, it's time to explore the 'new' centre of the city. The Klusais Centrs (Quiet Centre) neighbourhood is located a ten-minute walk away and features countless unique examples of architecture. Actually, beautiful Art Nouveau buildings can be found on most corners of central Riga, so it's worth just wandering around the streets to discover more gems.

Explorers seeking even more authenticity will appreciate a visit to the other side of the Daugava River and the Āgenskalns neighbourhood. This area is now considered one of the most hip parts of Riga, featuring the renovated Agenskalns Market and small eateries and cafés.


#### IN TAMPERE

Once known as a well-established industrial city, Tampere is situated between two large lakes, Lake Pyhäjärvi and Lake Näsijärvi, so it's worth enjoying the element of water here whenever possible. For example, by taking a boat cruise.

A day trip to Viikinsaari island is a wonderful nature experience. The island offers all kinds of activities as well as delicious meals at Viikinsaari Restaurant, founded in 1866. The ferry departs from Laukontori.

It's also worth getting a look at Tampere from above, and there are many great options for that. Restaurant *Periscope* on the roof of the *Ratina* shopping centre serves good food and offers the most spectacular terrace in the city. Also head up to the rooftop of *Sokos Hotel Torni* (Ratapihankatu 43) to enjoy views over Tampere and enjoy a drink at Moro Sky Bar on the 25th floor. The 120-metrehigh observation deck of the Näsinneula tower located next to the Särkänniemi amusement park (Laiturikatu l) guarantees stunning views, but it also has a restaurant. Buy tickets at the bottom of the tower, next to the lifts. Just a stone's throw from the city centre is the beautiful Pyynikki Nature Reserve with all kinds of walking trails. While you're there, stop by the Pyynikki coffee shop and observation tower (Näkötornintie 20). The café downstairs serves the best doughnuts in Finland.

The Vapriikki Museum Centre is the place to go if you're a fan of museums. It offers several museums under one roof, including the Ice Hockey Museum and the Natural History Museum. The world's only Moomin Museum is located near Nokia Arena, in Tampere House.



#### IN RIGA

Straddling the Daugava River where it flows into the Gulf of Riga, and with numerous lakes to boot, Riga has the hustle and bustle of a large city and the calm beauty of nature. And in the summertime, the forest and nature seem to truly enter the city! Take advantage of the warm temperatures to enjoy some activities by and on the water.

The Daugava River and its connected canal are located in the city centre and do not require much preparation or gear to enjoy. Head to Supfit rentals in the Andrejsala district (head to the Riga Passenger Port at Eksporta iela 3A). If that still seems too calm for you, it's also possible to paraglide over Riga and the Daugava, seeing the city from a bird's-eye view.

If the river is not your cup of tea, Riga also has plenty of lakes. One of the most prominent ones is Kīšezers, located a bus ride away in the Mežaparks neighbourhood (get there on bus number llT). The name Mežaparks translates to 'forest park', so the whole neighbourhood, including the huge park of the same name, is suited for long walks or roller skating. The banks of

Ķīšezers feature numerous cafés and picnic spots in addition to SUP, water motorcycle, windsurfing equipment, and catamaran rentals. Ķīšezers has plenty of vehicles for various tastes, making sure that even the most careful travellers can enjoy at least a bit of adrenaline.

The resort city of Jūrmala is also a popular destination among locals and tourists in the warm season. A 40-minute train ride takes you to this other city by the seaside. Jūrmala historically consisted of a number of small coastal fishing villages, which have now blended together. Dzintari, Majori, and Dubulti are the favourites of visitors and offer numerous cafés, restaurants, and sandy beaches.



#### IN TAMPERE

Tampere has been named the world capital of the sauna, so a sauna and swimming in a lake afterwards is something one should not miss. There are several public saunas in Tampere, including the Saunaravintola Kuuma, which was opened in 2018 at Laukontori 21 by Lake Pyhäjärvi. Enjoy the sauna, and then swim in the lake and have some food and drink. If you don't have a swimsuit along, you can rent one at *Kuuma*. The most legendary sauna in Tampere is in Rauhaniemi, easily accessible on bus number 2. The sauna at Rauhaniementie 24 by Lake

Näsijärvi has been open since 1929. The Kaupinoja sauna has also been there for a while, having opened in the 1970s. The famous Rajaportti Sauna is located in Pispala and is the oldest public sauna in Finland. It has been kept very traditional, and bathing is done with water in a bowl - there are no showers.

It's also worth heading to the Finlayson area, where something a bit more unusual is offered - a walk on Tampere's rooftops. Accompanied by local guides, who will tell you a lot of interesting stories about the city, you'll see it all from above.

Go canoeing and enjoy the beautiful lake scenery, or take part in a kick bike tour. Have fun climbing trees and sliding down cable cars at Flow Park in Varala. One of the most popular places in the spring and summertime in Tampere is the outdoor swimming pool located in the Kaleva area (Joukahaisenkatu 7B). The swimming centre offers both indoor and outdoor facilities.

It is easily accessible by tram number 3 in the direction of Hervanta.

#### **STRONGER** TOGETHER

Shortly before the World Championship, the Latvian and Finnish national ice hockey team candidates and leaders -- Rodrigo Ābols and Marko Anttila, respectively – spoke with *Baltic Outlook* about what being part of the national team means to them. And also what is definitely worth seeing and doing in Riga and Tampere.



Rodrigo Ābols (27), forward

Spent the 2022/23 season at Örebro HK, Sweden

Last year at the World Championship in Finland, I had the honour of being the captain of the Latvian national team for the first time. But I still vividly remember my debut in the national jersey at the World Championship. It was in Prague in 2015. I felt a little bit intimidated because the level of play was much higher than in the league I was playing in at the time. In the hotel, I met famous hockey players whose avatars I had used for my team in the NHL computer game. That tournament was not a success for me personally in terms of performance; I guess I'd call it something like my 'tournament of fear'.

My most memorable and emotional World Championship moment so far was definitely the quarter-final in Denmark in 2018. We beat the Danes 1-0 in the deciding match to place among the top eight teams in the world. It was an extremely satisfying feeling: silencing thousands of home fans in the stands. We played very well that time; we gave nothing to the other team. The Danish team had some big names from the NHL, but we had a very united team, so we won. Afterwards, our emotions overcame us, we sang the national anthem together, and the fun continued in the dressing room. After all, it was the first time since 2009 that the Latvian national team got to the quarter-finals.

With a big smile on my face I also remember my first goal in the World Championship. That was also in Denmark in 2018. We were playing against Germany, and Ronalds Ķēniņš, Rūdolfs Balcers, and I broke out in a great counter-attack. Yes, when it comes to the world championship, I guess I remember the moments on the ice more than the moments off the ice.

I don't have any special rituals before games. The national team and the club I play for have different pre-game warm-up procedures. On the national team we always warm up together, but in the club we warm up individually. I arrive at the rink at a certain time, change clothes, wrap my hockey stick, change the laces on my skates. I could probably call my daily nap a ritual. I definitely need it; I'm a big fan of naps. If I don't take a nap, then game day feels very long – long and drawn out.

The World Championship is a celebration of hockey. It's a celebration for everyone – the players and the fans alike. This wonderful feeling of celebration was particularly strong last year, when fans were again able to gather in the stands after the pandemic. I feel that it's an honour to play on the national team. And of course, it's a great opportunity to compete against the best in the world.

For those who are attending the hockey championship games in Riga, I recommend they visit one of my favourite places in the city, the Ozo Golf Club. If you play golf, you should definitely do it there! I usually go to Ozo or the 18-hole Jūrmala Course at the Jūrmala Golf Club.



Marko Anttila (37), forward Spent the 2022/23 season at Oulun Kärpät, Finland

I've been world champion twice with the Finnish national team, and last year we also won the Olympic gold. Playing at the World Championship in the Finnish national team uniform means a lot to me. It's something I dreamed of since I was a little boy. Back then, I watched all of the national team's games and was a big fan of the players, because it was difficult to get live broadcasts of NHL games or even recordings of them.

I've now been playing on the national team for more than a decade. It still feels special to play alongside my friends and to play against the best hockey players in the world. Playing in the World Championship is definitely not a job; it's pleasure. But of course, I don't deny that there's a lot of pressure on us. We want to win every tournament, and the fans expect us to win every tournament. Pressure like that from ourselves and others can sometimes be difficult, but only for a while.

I made my national team debut in 2013, when the championship was held here at home in Helsinki. This year, Tampere is hosting the World Championship for already the second year in a row. Back in 2013, I was much younger then than I am now, and too nervous. It's hard to describe the feelings that course through your body when you play in front of your home crowd. Family, friends, and acquaintances are all watching the games. It's nervewracking, but even back then I found a way to enjoy the experience.

My warm-up routine is the same before every game. If I'm physically ready, then I feel good psychologically as well. I'm not superstitious. Before a game, I try to not overload my mind; I maintain a light feeling. I definitely need a nap and a cup of coffee before the game. I sleep for half an hour – that's plenty. A midday nap is part of my pre-game routine. And also coffee. I don't drink much of it on a daily basis, but on game day I have one cup

in the morning and one shortly before the game. I need caffeine, but I take it with coffee. I never drink energy drinks; they don't appeal to me.

I can't single out one special moment I've had related to the national team at the World Championships. But a couple of highlights are the two finals we won to become world champions. We did it in Bratislava in 2019, and on home ice in Tampere in 2022, in extra time against the Canadians. That was really something special! We know we can do it again this year. But hockey is not smooth sailing. We're hungry for another World Championship gold, but there will be many competitors who'll want to dethrone us. It won't be easy.

I tend to have a pretty short memory, so I don't remember all that much of the things that happen off the ice during World Championships. But I do remember the good feeling you get every year, being with good friends, fighting side by side for a win, and having a good time together. I won't bore readers with the details, but that team feeling is the main value I bring with me every year on the journey of my career. From last year's championship, however, I'll always remember the championship party together with the fans. I don't know how many thousands of people were there, but it was a huge crowd. The party took place right there in Tampere, the day after we won the World Championship final. There was loud music, singing, and dancing!

Having played for Tampere Ilves for several years, I know the city very well. It's becoming more and more attractive every year, with lots of new things to do. Tampere has many excellent saunas, as well as very beautiful lakes. If you're coming to the championship, in between games you must visit the *Pyynikki Coffee Shop* in Tampere's Pispala district. There you can taste the excellent local doughnuts called *munkki*!

#### HOCKEY FANS ON THE FLIGHT DECK



Airbus A220-300 captain Ingus Sloka is probably the most loyal ice hockey fan at airBaltic. Not only does he support local teams and the Latvian national team, but for the past 15 years he has also played for the Recruit and Ledusvīri ('ice men') teams in the Latvian amateur league. It's a sure thing – Ingus will also be among the Latvian national team's fans during this year's world championship.

'When I was just a little boy, Latvia really only had one professional ice hockey team – Dinamo Riga,' Ingus remembers. 'Back then, it was almost impossible to get tickets to games at the Riga Sports Palace. But my father was a navigator – he worked for *Aeroflot* at the time – and he had a season ticket to the team's games, so he often took me along.'





Ingus liked ice hockey very much. So much so that he dreamt of becoming a hockey player himself, but training was only available in Riga, and it was impossible to make it to all of the practices from the town in which he lived. So he and some other boys played hockey on a frozen lake near their homes. 'My dream of becoming a professional ice hockey player ended right there, on the ice of that lake,' Ingus laughs. Later, however, after becoming a pilot himself, he returned to his childhood dream.

This coincided with a time when ice hockey was becoming very popular in Latvia due to the success of the national team, and hockey rinks were being built all across the country. One was also built in Ozolnieki, where Ingus lived. A team was formed, and he decided to try out for it. 'At one point there were so many people wanting to play that a second team was established,' Ingus recalls. For a while, he even played on the same team as another <code>airBaltic</code> pilot, captain Ēriks Blekte. Ingus has played various positions – offence as well as defence – whatever the team needs at the time. But his favourite positions are the offensive ones, especially centre.

'Hockey is the fastest and most dynamic game in the world, and that's what attracts me to it: the speed, the dynamics, the fact that it's a power game, a team game with a strong team spirit,' says Ingus, an experienced

captain who has also flown the re-established Dinamo Riga team on charter flights to away games. 'But a beer and sauna after the game are also an integral part of amateur hockey,' he says.

At the moment, however, it's almost impossible for Ingus to combine hockey and work. Practice games take place in the middle of the week and tournament matches on weekends, and because pilots don't have a regular nine-to-five work schedule (in addition, they also spend a considerable amount of time abroad), playing on a team and participating in tournaments becomes a mission impossible. But ice hockey is nevertheless Ingus' most beloved sport.

With the success of the Latvian men's national ice hockey team – it has played in the IIHF World Championship top division since 1997 and has participated in five Winter Olympic Games since the restoration of Latvia's independence – fan interest in the team has grown and Latvian fans are well known at World Championship tournaments.

'The tournament usually takes place in May, but that's when pilots are beginning their busiest time of year. Vacations and days off are out of the question, which means that, at best, I can watch the championship games on television. But I have managed to see some championship games in person,' Ingus says. 'The first time was in 2006, when the tournament was held in Riga, and I think Latvian fans still remember the event vividly. Unfortunately, the Latvian team had one of its most disappointing games back then, losing 0:11 to Canada. I think many fans would agree with me that the team felt a lot of pressure from the referees, basically playing three or four against five Canadians!' Ingus still gets agitated when remembering the game. Sweden went on to win that championship.

Last year, when the championship was held in Tampere, Ingus happened to be in the city for work, because Tampere is also an *airBaltic* base. 'On the days I was flying, the games were scheduled for the morning and evening, but on my days off, they took place during the day. I watched four games, three of them involving the Latvian national team,' he recalls.

Ingus truly enjoyed the tournament in Tampere: 'Because Finland is a major hockey country, they had paid attention to every little detail. The new arena was full of fans, and it was also packed during the Latvia-Finland game. As befits a hockey country, the atmosphere was fantastic! Finnish fans are polite and friendly, and in our conversations they always speak well of the Latvian team.'

In 2021, when the World Championship was held in Riga, scheduled flights were still not as frequent as before, due to the pandemic, but even so Ingus was able to attend some games. 'Unfortunately, the pandemic completely ruined the event,' he admits. 'The bronzemedal game between Germany and the United States, which the U.S. won 6:1, felt more like a practice game because the stands were almost empty except for the technical staff and a few team scouts, and the only sound was sticks hitting the puck... But for the final game between Canada and Finland, suddenly lots of people showed up, and the arena was half full. It was a fantastic game - the Finns were ahead the whole time, but then the Canadians tied the game and they had to go into overtime, and the Canadians won. But I was rooting for the Finns.'

Ingus has a few recommendations for hockey fans coming to Riga, some of whom the captain will surely have brought to Riga himself. He says they should definitely take some time to enjoy the city itself, especially the Old Town and the outdoor cafés already open in May on Līvu Square and Cathedral Square (Doma laukums, in Latvian). Just a ten-minute walk from Arena Riga, where the games will take place, lies the neighbourhood known as Riga's Quiet Centre, which is famous for its Art Nouveau architecture, especially the street called Alberta iela. The Quiet Centre is also home to some of Riga's best restaurants.



#### T will definitely try to not miss the games in Riga!'

Riga Central Market is also worth a visit, with market pavilions housed in former German army hangars built during the First World War. And if you want a proper Latvian meal, head to the *Lido Leisure Centre* on Krasta iela. The Āgenskalns Market is located on the opposite side of the Daugava River, but it has recently reopened after an extensive renovation and has a wide variety of places to eat, so it is also worth exploring.

'When people travel to see the ice hockey world championship, they mostly come to enjoy the atmosphere,' Ingus says. 'Having played hockey myself, I've always found it interesting to watch the games live on television, too, because then you can see the nuances of the game much better - there are close-ups, replays, witty comments by commentators, and so on. If my work schedule allows it, I organise a special hockey night at home with friends. We drink beer and watch the game live, which can be very emotional (laughs).' At the time of our conversation, Ingus still did not know what his work schedule would be like during the championship, but he was very hopeful that it would include a flight from Riga or Tampere and that he would have the opportunity to attend a few hockey games. 'I will definitely try to not miss them, because Riga may not have the opportunity to host the tournament again so soon, so I have to take advantage of it!' **bo**

**SPLIT**, CROATIA An inspiring escape

The Adriatic Sea is an integral part of the cityscape in Split, Croatia's secondlargest city and the proud capital of the Dalmatia region. Here, you'll inevitably end up on the Riva, a palm-lined waterfront that's among Europe's finest promenades. No matter the time of the day, this area is always brimming with life. Locals mingle with ice creamholding tourists, the squawks of seagulls mix with the horn blasts of arriving cruise ships, and yachts sway gently in the harbour.

All of this movement is set against the centuries-old walls of Emperor Diocletian's Palace, a stunning UNESCO-protected feat of Roman architectural genius. Half of Split's historic core is found within the borders of this gargantuan marvel of the ancient world, and it's full of life in a remarkable, very Croatian way. Café terraces fill cosy squares where Roman columns still stand, the palace cellars host souvenir stalls, and the narrow streets are never empty.

The centrepiece of the Old Town is the Peristyle, a former palace square dating to the 4<sup>th</sup> century CE. Right nearby is the unmissable Cathedral of Saint Domnius, which has an impressive Romanesque bell tower and a choir from the 17th century. The building was constructed from Emperor Diocletian's mausoleum and is considered one of the oldest churches in the world. Go a little bit farther, and you'll arrive at the Venetian-era Narodni Trg Pjaca (People's Square) full of Baroque-era houses.

If Denmark has *hygge* and Sweden preaches *lagom*, for Split (and Dalmatia) the philosophy of life is *lagano*. Essentially, it means 'easygoing, light,

unburdened'. Locals are experts in taking it easy, slowing down, and enjoying life. And that's exactly how visitors should approach Split, too. Savour a coffee break while admiring the waters of the Adriatic Sea, take an unhurried stroll among the Roman ruins of the Old Town, and book yourself a panoramic boat tour. Take it slow, take it easy.

Many visitors treat Split as a transit point for travels farther down the coast or to the islands. But it pays to stay in the city for a while and embrace the zestful local life. Start the day by browsing fresh produce at the central gradska tržnica (city market) and pay a visit to the covered fish market as well. Then head to the top of Marjan Hill for magnificent panoramas of the city. Diocletian's Cellars is a mustvisit for fans of Game of Thrones, the television show that was filmed here. And definitely order grilled octopus, squid, or a mixed meat platter for a hearty Croatian meal at a konoba (local tavern).

MALAGA, SPAIN A vibrant southern vibe

The sublime Mediterranean grandeur of Malaga is at its most impressive from the Gibralfaro viewpoint. Many arrive there by bus, but for an enhanced experience, hike all the way up; it's absolutely worth it. The view from the top is to die for: the blue of the Mediterranean Sea meets the green of the lush Malaga Park, the round bullring calls to mind strong Andalusian traditions, and the labyrinthine streets of the Old Town beckon for a stroll and getting lost.

This Spanish town is steeped in history. For instance, Gibralfaro Castle ranks among the oldest Moorish fortresses in Europe. Descend a little bit and there's another Arab masterpiece waiting for you, the elegant Alcazaba. Right under it you'll find the remains

of the Roman theatre. And all of that even before you've reached the Centro Histórico. The old part of this city is a mix of narrow winding streets, hidden courtyards, shaded squares, and various architectural styles. It's ideal for wandering and stopping randomly for a *café con leche* or a quick *tapas* break.

Southern Spain is the definition of high-spirited. As a prominent centre in Andalusia, Malaga wears its energetic lifestyle with pride. It seems as if the residents have cracked the secret to enjoying life to the fullest. The streets overflow with excitement, and the terraces of the bars, cafés, and restaurants are always full. And best of all, everyone's invited to join this celebration of good times, to become part of the party.

While Seville and Granada can definitely compete with Malaga in



terms of old-world treasures, the latter has an ace up its sleeve. Here, the presence of the Mediterranean Sea and many beaches changes everything. And you won't have to spend much time reaching them, either, with the most popular stretch, Malagueta, just a few minutes away from the city centre. Go a little bit farther south to find the fantastic long Misericordia Beach. Expect golden sands, pleasant water temperatures, and an abundance of beach bars.

What Malaga does very well is combining beachside leisure with an urban beat. The city is home to some of the most prominent cultural institutions in the country. The Picasso Museum Malaga, which showcases the works of the world-renowned artist (who was a native of Malaga), is the first spot to check out. The Carmen Thyssen Museum houses an extensive collection of Spanish art and is another absolute must. For contemporary art, go to CAC Málaga and take time to explore the vibrant SoHo neighbourhood, which is a cradle of alternative culture in the city.

**HERAKLION,** GREECE An unfiltered experience

Bougainvillea adorns Venetian-era houses, the honking of scooters is incessant, street stalls proudly display many different varieties of fruit, and the azure Aegean Sea glistens in the distance. Crete's capital of Heraklion masterfully blends the chaotic and the pretty, providing an unfiltered and sometimes rough but always authentic Greek experience. While this city is the major entry port to one of the most tourist-filled corners of the Mediterranean region, it remains largely a place filled with locals. And that's why a visit here really pays off.

In Heraklion, you've got all the ingredients for a fascinating Greek holiday. The city has an extensive Old

Town boasting Byzantine, Venetian, and Ottoman influences. And, while it's far from *Instagram*-perfect Santorini or Mykonos, that's exactly the point in Heraklion. You'll love simply wandering the narrow streets and stumbling upon the remains of the past. Take your time to feel the galvanising rhythm of this, the fifth-largest city in Greece.

But it's by the sea that Heraklion shows its epic side. Many top attractions are found near the water, confirming the city's status as an important Mediterranean port. One highlight is the stunning Venetian Port with its mighty fort and picture-perfect harbour dotted with boats and yachts. A visit to the Rocca a Mare Fortress is a must, and the best sunsets can be admired next to the Heraklion Lighthouse at the tip of the harbour walkway. If you

crave more Venetian architecture, the Basilica di San Marco and the Loggia in the heart of the city are worth checking out.


Heraklion can work both as a short day trip or a longer city break. Many visitors to Crete give it a pass, continuing straight to the island's heavenly resorts. But if your idea of a Greek holiday involves a more urban setting, then you've chosen the right place. Combine extensive sightseeing with chilling out on the terraces of cafés, feasting on gyros and souvlaki in the tavernas, and devouring sweet loukoumades from street vendors. However, one thing Heraklion lacks is a proper beach. For that, head to Ammoudara on the outskirts of the city, or check out the sandy stretches at Karteros, Arena, or Mades.

No visit to Heraklion is complete without seeing glorious Knossos, which is one of the wonders of the ancient world. This large site was the former Cretan capital and the cradle of the Minoan civilisation, and it's a pilgrimage of sorts for history buffs. You may also know Knossos from the Greek myths, for it is here that the hero Theseus defeated the Minotaur inside the maze (also called the Labyrinth).









NAPLES, ITALY
A deeply passionate destination

Much like its famous volcanic neighbour Vesuvius, electrifying Naples is always ready to erupt. Not with lava, though. The capital of southern Italy radiates with world-class culture, unparalleled architectural masterpieces, and mouthwatering food. Non-stop movement is part of the lifestyle here. A visitor's first impression of Naples is almost always chaotic. But take time to savour and understand how this city is organised, and you'll be rewarded with one of the most exciting destinations in the world.

Starting with the historical centre is always a great idea in Italy, and Naples has an enormous one. Tracing its origins back to the Greek empire, this city is among the most ancient in Europe.

Use central Via San Biagio, also called Spaccanapoli, as a compass to navigate the maze of the Old Town. Let the gargantuan Naples Cathedral take your breath away, see Caravaggio's works in the Pio Monte della Misericordia chapel, and admire the Rococo sculptures in the Cappella Sansevero.

Museums in Naples are in a league of their own, and you should definitely explore several for some cultural overdrive. Set in a former 17th-century palace, the National Archaeological Museum showcases the wonders of ancient Greece and Rome, including the Pompeii mosaics. Go to the Royal Palace of Naples for opulent interiors, and be amazed by the grandiose beauty of the Piazza del Plebiscito in front of it. For something different, head underground to the eerie Catacombs of San Gennaro.

There's one thing Naples does better than anyone, and that's pizza. The world-famous dish was invented here, and the city still prepares the best pizzas in the world. Nothing can compare to the aroma of a freshly-baked Margherita on the streets of Naples. But you need to know where to go to not fall into a tourist trap. The Antica Pizzeria Di Matteo is a long-standing gem in the Old Town, 50 Kalò is for a more upscale pizza feast, and Gino e Toto Sorbillo delivers simple and delicious perfection. Naples is also known for its various types of pasta, sartù di riso (a savoury rice dish), and babà cakes, so make yourself a culinary tour.

But don't stick only to the historical centre. Naples has a rich variety of neighbourhoods and day-trip destinations. Take a walk next to the sea on the promenade in Santa Lucia and gaze at the mighty silhouette of Ovo Castle. Pair a visit to the ancient city of Pompei with a hike to the crater in Vesuvius National Park. And, if you're into island bliss, regular ferry connections make it easy to take a trip to marvellous Procida and Ischia. **bo** 





A myriad of annual events invites visitors to have some fun and enjoy music, art, and theatre. 'There are festivals on a smaller and larger scale taking place all year round. Venues are within easy reach and are surrounded by beautiful nature,' states Tiina Kuusisto, the executive director of Tampere Region Festivals (Pirfest). 'Our aim is to develop a sustainable and accessible event industry.'

Tampere Region Festivals is a network that includes 36 cultural festivals in the Pirkanmaa region that represent nearly all existing art forms. But whatever size or form the festivals take, corners are never cut: even the smallest of events offers world-class quality and endless awe. 'Some of our most popular festivals are Blockfest, the Tampere Jazz Happening, and the Mänttä Art Festival,' says Kuusisto. 'One unique little gem is the Annikki Poetry Festival, while the crown jewel of the year is the Tampere Theatre Festival.'

Every year in August, local and international performing-art troupes take over the stages and squares of Tampere

as part of the Tampere Theatre Festival. As the oldest and largest professional theatre festival in the Nordics, it has served as a display window for a wide range of interesting productions since 1968. 'During the festival week, up to 400 events take place all around the city,' says Hanna Rosendahl, the festival's executive director. 'All of the theatres work together for the common goal of creating a unique festival of performing arts.'

The Tampere Theatre Festival manages to combine well-known and recognised pieces with new cutting-edge international creations while transforming the city's architectural heritage into performance venues to host thousands of theatre lovers from Finland and around the world. The main programme consists of 20 theatre plays, but many other events take place in addition to them, such as the easily accessible Off Tampere festival.

#### EXPLORE TAMPERE'S MUSEUMS

Sooner or later, an exploration of Tampere inevitably ends up at the Särkänniemi Theme Park, Finland's largest leisure centre. Once inside the park, which lies on the banks of Lake Näsijärvi, continue through the lobby of the Näsinneula observation tower all the way to the Sara Hildén Art Museum, which showcases Finnish and international modernism and contemporary art. It's a true gem.

'We are one of the few art museums named after a female Finnish art collector,' says Anne Kauramäki, the museum's communications coordinator. 'The Sara Hildén Foundation Collection features a wide spectrum of Finnish and foreign art.'

In 2022, the museum created quite a buzz by presenting an exhibition by Thomas Houseago together with Nick Cave and Brad Pitt. Something equally ambitious is currently under way, namely, an international exhibition in the autumn of 2023 that will showcase work by South Korean artist Lee Bul, who is one of the top artists in Asia today. 'The exhibition will include her main works with an emphasis on sculptures,' Kauramäki says. 'She's interested in questions about utopias, order, and power in relation to the body, materials, and architecture.'

The museum also features an exposition of works from the Sara Hildén Foundation Collection. Enjoy homemade delicacies at *Café Sara*, which offers a beautiful view over the museum's sculpture park. sarahildenintaidemuseo.fi

No museum lover will be left empty-handed in Tampere. The versatile Vapriikki museum centre is home to unusual exhibits and fascinating worlds. One ticket lets you explore up to ten different exhibitions, including the Finnish Museum of Games, the Tampere Museum of Natural History, the Pirkanmaa Regional Museum, the Postal Museum, and also the Hockey Hall of Fame Finland.

'During the Ice Hockey World Championships, the Hockey Hall of Fame fills with ice hockey fans,' says Tähtitalvikki Poikajärvi, Vapriikki's communications coordinator. 'This is the biggest ice hockey museum in Europe. Another popular attraction at Vapriikki is the game museum, where you can try out some of the 100 games on display.'

Also under the same roof is a museum restaurant, a shop, and meeting rooms for various events, including private functions such as birthday parties. Needless to say, many people have organised ice hockey-themed parties there! 'Vapriikki is a great destination for the whole family,' says Poikajärvi. 'We're located in the city centre by the Tammerkoski rapids, and we warmly welcome everyone to hip and cool Tampere.'

'When visitors enter the museum, they enter a new reality,' says producer Minna Honkasalo. 'The magic lies in the stories and the imagination – and the safe and warm atmosphere. This is what we all need.' The Moomin Museum is run by the Tampere Art Museum and housed in Tampere Hall. The exposition follows the entire story of the Moomins, highlighting the values of tolerance, equality, freedom, community, and respect for nature. As a young visitor once said, 'If everyone read the Moomin stories, the world would be a better place.'

Serious epicureans head straight to the restaurants *R14* and *Pull*, both of which were included in the Michelin Guide in 2022, when the distinguished restaurant recognition system first spread its reach to Estonia. *Pull* focuses on high-quality meat dishes, many of them prepared directly over a live fire or even roasted in charcoal, such as the chef's signature 'dirty steak'. *R14*, for its part, pairs Mediterraneaninspired food with its collection of carefully selected quality wines.

For a more casual dinner experience, try the Mexican-inspired *Taqueria*, the Spanish tapas bar *Siesta*, or *Flamm*, where the specialty dish

is Alsatian *flammkuchen*, a thin open pastry perfect for a light dinner or snack to share with friends over a glass of wine. One of the newest eateries in Rotermann is *Stalker*, a bar-*rotisserie* that offers a wide selection of unique cocktails, updated bar classics, and a menu of flame-grilled dishes, all accompanied by a DJ set or live music on the weekends.

Rotermann is also considered one of the best shopping destinations in Tallinn. For trend-hunting fashionistas there are high-street shops like *Stradivarius*, *Pull&Bear* and *Bershka*, all within a short walk of each other. Those looking for elevated classics and unique Scandinavian style with which to update their wardrobe will definitely find something to take home at either *COS* or the neighbouring *Ivo Nikkolo*, a classic among Estonian fashion brands.

If you're interested in modern Estonian design or are hunting for the perfect souvenir, head to *Tallinn Design House*. In this concept store you'll find contemporary Estonian design gems. Instead of a useless mass-market souvenir, bring home (or buy for gifts!) a chic pair of earrings, eye-catching interior accessories, or a long-lasting item of sustainable clothing made by a local designer. The famous *Kalev Chocolate Shop* is located on the bustling main square of Rotermann as well, filled with the best locally made candies and chocolates, be it handmade confectionery or local classics that have been loved for decades.

The history of Tallinn is interlaced with modern trends at Rotermann, so take a few hours, or even the whole day, to enjoy time with yourself and find inspiration in the pedestrian streets and squares of Rotermann!

In summer, Pärnu is full of cosy outdoor terraces and bustling restaurant-cafés. The most popular places are located in the old town area and on the promenade Supeluse tänav, which are both car-free during summer. Summer brings a lot of outdoor events and a lot of people to Pärnu – we suggest that after dinner you take a walk towards the beach to have a cocktail and partake in any outdoor happenings sure to be going on.

Enjoy excellent service, exciting menus, and special flavours in Pärnu's top restaurants. Nordic and Scandinavian fine-dining experiences can be found in the restaurant Raimond and in the historical Ammende Villa. This spring, Pärnu's first chef's hall was opened in Villa Wesset, where an experiential dinner is prepared from pure fresh ingredients right in front of your eves. There are two menus to choose from - Local Journey and Baltic Journey - which bring first-class flavours to visitors in surprising combinations. The menu at the Wesset's chef's hall includes smoked eel, veal tongue cooked for 36 hours, deer tenderloin, chocolate-black garlic mousse, and many other exciting delicacies.

The area along the Pärnu River is developing rapidly, and several trendy eateries have established themselves here in recent years. It has quickly gained popularity among locals and visitors alike as the riverside offers a completely different atmosphere. For example, the urban restaurant *Kastrul* serves dishes influenced by Asian and Mediterranean cuisines, while right next door, the bakery *Leivakas* offers freshly baked goods and stone oven pizza. Nearby are *Suncity* and *Wunderbaar*, perfect spots to spend summer evenings. *Baarceloona*, with its considerable Spanish influence on the menu, offers a good selection of sangria and tapas.

To get a better overview of Pärnu's local food culture, try to visit some eateries away from the main streets as well. For example, at the *Kosmonautika* recreation centre located on Via Baltica, the *Kosmos cafe* offers great flavour experiences. Authentic flavours also await at the *Groot* restaurant in Varbla harbour as well as at *Võrgukuur* in Ermistu holiday village near Tõstamaa. The local menu includes traditional fish dishes as well as pork, beef, and game meat dishes. The islands in the Gulf of Livonia, Kihnu and Manija, also offer culinary experiences in which the customs and traditions of our ancestors are still honoured today.

In addition to a high-level restaurant culture, Pärnu also honours the production of craft drinks. Cider, wine and other drinks are made by small producers. The most well-known makers of craft drinks in Pärnu County are Mamm&Frukt, Jaanihanso Siidrivabrik, Tori Siidritalu, Pootsi Winery and Allikukivi Winery. Mamm&Frukt craft drinks can be sampled at the Valgeranna wine stable located in Audru, near Pärnu. The wine stable is a 140-year-old manor horse stable practising small craft wine production, and even has a terrace restaurant offering stone oven pizza. It's a great place to taste the winery's own wine as well as that by other producers, and learn more about the art of wine production.

Pärnu resort town is an attractive destination for visitors looking for food experiences not only in summer but in other seasons as well. Thanks to all the various options on hand, Pärnu is a great place to stay for everyone – couples, families with children, and groups of friends. In Pärnu, enjoy not only good food, but walks in town, golf centres, a racing circuit, an adventure park, national parks and much more. Pärnu also prides itself with having the best beach in Estonia. Families with children can enjoy water centres, spa holidays and *Lottemaa*, the largest theme park in the Baltics. In addition, Endla Theatre and Pärnu Concert Hall offer wide cultural programmes.

In May, the local competition for the Bocuse d'Or world chef championship will take place in Pärnu to determine the best Estonian chef, who will then go on to represent the country at the international championship.

#### VARIOUS DENTAL HYGIENE METHODS ARE AVAILABLE IN LATVIA

Regular dental hygiene is necessary to avoid tartar, tooth decay due to periodontitis (inflammation of the supporting tissues of the teeth), gingivitis (inflammation of the gums), and tooth loss due to various dental diseases. The recommended frequency of visits to the hygienist depends on individual factors such as the level of daily dental care, the general condition of the teeth and their susceptibility to tooth decay, and also the patient's lifestyle and daily habits. # WHAT ARE DENTAL IMPLANTS AND HOW DOES THE IMPLANT PROCEDURE TAKE PLACE?

Implantology is a method of replacing a natural tooth with a dental implant. A titanium or ceramic screw is inserted into the jawbone, and then a crown that visually and functionally resembles a natural tooth but is made of an artificial material is attached to the implant above the gum area. Implants can be placed at any age and can replace a single tooth or a group of teeth.

The patient first has a consultation with an implantologist, and the implant is placed during the next visit. The implant then has to heal, which can take four to six months but does not cause any discomfort for the patient. The crown is then placed on the implant and the tooth is permanently restored. apinesklinika.lv

#### ROOT CANAL TREATMENT AND SURGERY IN LATVIA

Endodontics is a lengthy process, but it can often be the only way to save a tooth. The number and anatomy of canals, the complexity of the procedure, and the extent of inflammation all determine the number of treatment sessions necessary. If the infection has not spread to the jawbone, treatment can be carried out in one visit, but a higher number of canals, infection in the periapical jawbone, and the need for retreatment usually require two or more visits. Root canal treatment in Latvia is carried out using

#### VIA VITALITÉ A PLACE OF STRENGTH TO ALIGN BOTH MIND AND BODY

Sometimes we lack just one element to feel fully well. What good is a beautiful house or an expensive car if, for example, you don't feel good in your own body? Unfortunately, stress and a depressed mood often only add to the reasons why you become overweight and can't achieve the look you want. Maija Atvara, head of the weight-care and wellness centre *Via Vitalité* (formerly known as *Academy Vitality*), and registered dietitian Ksenija Andrijanova explain why stress makes you overweight and how to effectively get rid of a few or more of those troublesome kilos.

Research into the causes of people becoming overweight has long gone beyond the single criterion of food. To understand the holistic picture, researchers look at the impacts of environment, sleep and stress on body mass. Several interesting and modern insights have been gained regarding the impact of stress on becoming overweight.

Short-term stress is a normal phenomenon that has helped mankind survive difficult circumstances and avoid life-threatening situations such as predation. Unfortunately, in today's world, an identical stress response is triggered by overwork, too much responsibility,

or an unfavourable emotional climate in one's environment. Funny as it may seem, yes, your body sometimes reacts to a work email or a tiring project as if there were a tiger behind a tree that wants to eat you. If you don't notice in time what work stress is doing to you, burnout sets in.

One of the stress hormones released in the body is cortisol. Cortisol levels increase at the moment of a short-term threat. When a person is safe, their cortisol level should fall. But people with overload and burnout never reach that feeling of safety - stress accompanies us every day and never ends, so cortisol levels are always high. The catch is that this hormone stimulates the appetite. That's why stressed people tend to eat more and without noticing exactly what they have eaten and how much. This leads to cravings for calorie-dense foods and so-called comfort foods: pizzas, kebabs, burgers, fatty meats and the like. Excess weight gained in this way is more likely to accumulate in the abdominal area.

Our emotional world is also important. Researchers have observed that people with chronic stress are more likely to experience feelings such as shame, guilt and low selfesteem. The urge to 'eat' these emotions away in order to feel comfortable for a while contributes to the accumulation of extra kilos.

'How can we get rid of this stress, given that it has become an unavoidable companion nowadays? I recommend two courses of action: a change of environment or a change of attitude towards the current environment. The best way, of course, is to combine the two. Holidays, relaxation, psychotherapy, sport, meditation, and spending time with like-minded people and family are all beneficial. Small things matter, too. For example, the scientific literature states that just one well-chosen meditation a day can reduce stress levels. But if a person is extremely busy, it can be difficult to find time to relax. Short rejuvenation retreats with rest in nature, eating healthy meals, and moderate and enjoyable exercise can help. 

#### Do you feel tired?

Do you sometimes feel overworked? Do you find yourself wearing down over the course of a normal workday? This is not unusual. Today's jobs increasingly require cognitive awareness, and fatigue has been recognised as a major contributor to human error.

Fatigue is defined as a state of reduced mental or physical alertness, when a person's physical and cognitive performance is substantially decreased. This can mean slower reaction times, reduced eye movement, blurred vision, reduced motor skills, concentration problems, and so on.

#### How does it affect us

The Finnish study *Better work flow*, less errors: Decreasing human errors at work found that as many as 90% of workplace accidents are caused by human factors. Fatigue plays a very important role in this. When people are working with machines, driving vehicles, making products in factories, building houses or doing anything else, fatigue can cause some very serious accidents. People can damage their employer's or other people's property, harm their own health, make defective products that need to be replaced, or crash a truck, van, tractor or other vehicle. A lot of accidents can happen simply because people are tired.

According to research, most accidents happen due to human error. Fatigue is an important aspect regarding making mistakes; it is a growing concern in working life today and it requires our attention.

Most commonly, fatigue is caused by insufficient (less than 7–8 hours) or poor-quality sleep. Other lifestyle factors – such as substance abuse, inactivity, or obesity – can likewise be a problem. Fatigue can also be caused by having to work multiple shifts (especially at night), having irregular or excessively long working hours, and working under monotonous conditions – or the converse: under time-related pressure or excessive alertness demands.

Fatigue is rarely the exclusive, or even the most significant, component in accidents and injuries, but it must be taken into account as a contributing factor. Studies have found that the effect of severe fatigue on a person's performance is equal to one mil of blood alcohol content, i.e. intoxication – an indication that the importance of this issue should be emphasised more strongly in safety management programmes.

#### What is the solution

The first priority is to get rid of fatigue. This means determined action on the part of the employee and the employer. Above all, people need to ensure that they have sufficient rest and sleep time. The employer must bear in mind that people need to be provided with the best possible working conditions, especially in


terms of lighting, ergonomics and noise distraction. Workers must be encouraged to take breaks.

#### BUILDING A NEW WIND FARM IN LATVIA

This summer will see the beginning of the implementation of a power facility in Kaigu Bog, with turbines and solar panels producing 500,000 MWh of electricity each year.



Construction is to take place at the same time as the development of a green industrial park, which will consume the renewable electricity produced to grow seedlings and vegetables. The wind farm is a project developed by Laflora Energy, a subsidiary of the Laflora peat mining and processing company, in conjunction with the wind farm developer Windy, Ltd. Uldis Ameriks, chairman of the board of Laflora and a board member of the German-Baltic Chamber of Commerce, reported that at the end of last year the Jelgava Municipality Construction Authority issued a building permit for the construction of the Laflora 90 MW wind farm. This marked the end of the planning phase, and the implementation of the project has now begun.

Currently, the plan is to establish 16 wind turbines, but Ameriks says that the number of turbines may in the future be increased to 22. He notes that the appropriate regulations have not yet been developed at the national level, but there are promises of such regulations being introduced, enabling any company to install wind farms on state forest land after earning the right to do so through the appropriate

procurement procedures. Initially, it was estimated that 1 MW of output would cost one million euros, but due to inflation, it is currently expected that the investment necessary for the construction of the wind farm in Kaigu Bog will exceed 120 million euros. Final negotiations regarding the possible involvement of Latvian and international strategic partners are currently underway. The wind farm in Kaigu Bog is planned to begin operations in 2025.

Ameriks stresses the fact that the wind farm project has been expanded by the construction of a solar farm, so another 110 MW of power output has been reserved. This means that the total renewable energy output in Kaigu Bog will eventually reach 200 MW. In total, it will be able to produce 300,000 MWh, or the equivalent of about 5% of Latvia's total yearly consumption of electricity. The implementation of the two phases of this project will allow *Laflora* to achieve climate neutrality by 2030, fully compensating the GHG emissions generated in the extraction and processing of peat.

Meanwhile, to encourage the local consumption of peat, the industrial zone is planned as the site for the development of the largest and most modern plant nursery in the Baltics, with greenhouse complexes for growing vegetables and forest seedlings. 'The idea is very simple: to grow seedlings using Latvian peat substrate and deliver them to Europe,' explains Ameriks. 'Currently in Latvia, peat is extracted, processed into peat substrates, and exported to more than 100 countries, including the Netherlands, which is a major producer of flower and vegetable seedlings, as well as vegetables themselves, and part of what is grown there returns to Latvia.'





For example, in partnership with the Teen and Youth Psychotherapy Centre, *Tietoevry Latvia* has developed a virtual therapy lab at the premises of *Tietoevry* in Riga. Nextgeneration technology solutions enable psychotherapy counseling in a virtual augmented reality environment.

Among other outstanding projects is *Tietoevry's* 3td ebook library. Since 2019, this service is provided in partnership with Latvian public libraries. Over 17,000 people use the 3td library to read free e-books by both Latvian and international authors.


While levelling up the quality of life through transformation technology, it is important to also consider how much of a footprint *Tietoevry* is leaving behind in the environment. 'Having an activity-based office and a hybrid working model is perfectly aligned with our sustainability strategy. Also, *Tietoevry* will soon relocate to Verde, the greenest office complex in Riga, and be part of the artery of information technologies and financial services in Riga,' Vārna concludes. tietoevry.com/lv



## FROM THE HOME KITCHEN TO A BAKERY

The *Better Bread* gluten-free bakery in Riga is a family-run business that has been on the list of Riga's best bakeries and pastry shops for several years now, and it has won the trust of locals and visitors alike.

Better Bread bakes gluten-free bread and pastries, and the owners themselves, Aļona and Sergejs Stepanovs, can often be found behind the counter. The idea of creating a gluten-free bakery came to them a few years ago upon their realisation that high-quality gluten-free bread was nowhere to be found in Riga. They brought their idea to fruition and now run two bakeries in Riga – one in the so-called Quiet Centre in the heart of Riga, and the second in the recently renovated Āgenskalns Market on the other side of the Daugava River. They will soon open a third bakery in the city, which will include not only a café but also an open-plan kitchen, allowing visitors to take a look behind the scenes of how the bread is made.

'Our love for gluten-free bread started in our own kitchen, when we decided to cut wheat from our diet,' say the owners. 'Being avid travellers, we had also noticed how many gluten-free options were available in other parts of the world, and we decided that it was high time that Riga had its own gluten-free

bakery. And so, after a lot of research and reading, we rolled up our sleeves and got to work.'

The uniqueness of the bread at *Better Bread* lies largely in the sourdough starter that Alona has perfected. Through attending various masterclasses and spending countless hours experimenting in their own kitchen, Alona and Sergejs developed and refined their own recipes. Several years of experimentation has led to success and the creation of a sourdough recipe consisting of quinoa, buckwheat, and maize flours.

'Our bread is something that we ourselves enjoy eating. It contains no added sugar or chemical additives,' says Aļona. 'We believe that a healthy product should contain only pure and natural ingredients, which is why we use only certified organic gluten-free flour, our own fermented natural sourdough starter, and other high-quality ingredients such as nuts, seeds, fruit, and spices. With great respect and love for the bread, we shape





it into loaves that ferment overnight so that they can be put in the oven in the morning'. For the bakery's first half year, Alona herself went to the bakery every morning at 5 a.m. to bake bread. *Better Bread* has received EU Organic Certification, and several of its products are labelled as organic.

Better Bread's cosy bakeries are also frequented by health-conscious people. Since Better Bread only makes gluten-free products, those who have gluten intolerance can rest assured that their health will not be compromised. 'Our visitors are mindful of their health,' says Sergejs. 'Both tradition and trust in us as the makers of this bread are important to them. We believe that establishing trust is one of the most vital investments one can make today. It's important for us that our customers know and trust us and our brand philosophy. We ourselves always choose to go to places that are based on tradition.'

The Stepanovses themselves also consume *Better Bread* baked goods on a daily basis. Their seed bread and toaster bread are the most popular items among customers, the former made using a special technology that allows for the omitting of starter or yeast. Those not fond of the tang of natural sourdough will appreciate *Better Bread's* ciabatta with olives; made with yeast, it's become a fast favourite among regulars.

Popular dessert pastries at *Better Bread* include canelés and vegan carrot cake made with tofu and lemon cream. As for the canelés, several French customers have pointed out that they

taste just as good as the canelés back home. One of the most sought-after items this spring are the organic marzipan-and-chocolate cupcakes, which many gourmets have already named the most delicious sweets in the city. The first bite makes you wonder how something so tasty could be gluten-free, while every next bite makes you want to come back to the bakery again and again.

But the popular cupcakes aren't the only new thing this spring. The bakery's range also includes two new types of bread, made from oat sourdough starter and from a hazelnut paste. Speaking of which, hurried breakfasters or leisurely diners should make sure to visit the *Better Bread* bakery in Āgenskalns Market, where delicious gluten-free sandwiches are made directly from bread made with with oat sourdough starter.

There are two things that the owners of *Better Bread* are passionate about: gluten-free bread and coffee. Their love of coffee goes hand in hand with their love of bread, and they can talk about both for hours. Being connoisseurs of good-quality coffee, Aļona and Sergejs are well versed in the different kinds of coffee produced around the world. Trusting their own palates, they've chosen to offer *Da Matteo* coffee to the bakery's customers.

Confident that a gluten-free diet can be delicious and enjoyable on a daily basis as well as on special occasions, Alona and Sergejs invite you to stop by one of their bakeries – odds are you will even get to meet them in person.

Olivia Restaurant is distinct not only for its high-quality produce and unique flavours and manner of preparation, but

also for its general philosophy. Each food on the menu has a story of its own. The main menu highlights fish and seafood: the Mediterranean turbot is from the French coast, where it is raised on an organic fish farm, while the North Sea cod is caught in the Barents Sea and the shrimp are supplied from Canada. The swordfish comes from the Atlantic Ocean and sometimes takes more than 20 hours to be delivered to the restaurant. *Olivia Restaurant* is the only restaurant in Latvia to have been granted an official catch quota for bluefin tuna, leading its restaurant team to create a unique concept for Riga – a tuna menu.

The *Olivia Restaurant* team has also kept meat lovers in mind. Most of its meats come from Ireland because in addition to having been quality meat producers for many generations, the Irish are also able to ensure that the meat delivered to the restaurant is organically grown, tender, juicy, and full of flavour.

The dessert menu at *Olivia Restaurant* is not large, but each of the dishes contains refined, nuanced flavours that might even recall childhood. One of the favourite desserts at the restaurant is the caramelised Brunost,

or cheese cream with cloudberries from the Arctic – guests call it an absolute masterpiece. Another highlight is the chocolate brownie with black garlic and lingonberry sauce, which once again confirms the chef's tendency to not shy away from experimenting with various flavours and manners of preparation. Head chef Oja brings experience from Michelin-starred restaurants in Tallinn and Copenhagen, but says that his love for Italian culture and their way of life encouraged him to open a restaurant offering simple and homey Italian dishes something he saw lacking in Tallinn's restaurant scene.

'Our goal is to create dishes as Italian *nonnas* do, with an authentic, simple and rustic approach to both appearance and the flavour palette, while also cutting no corners when it comes to quality ingredients,' says Oja. Most of the ingredients used here - such as olive oil,



cheese, flour, olives and wine - are sourced from Italy, straight from the producers who know how to do it best. When possible, all seasonal and fresh ingredients are Estonian-grown.

Located in a house that dates back to the Middle Ages and which was once home to a rich merchant, the restaurant allows guests to take a peek inside the grandeur of a noble's house from centuries ago. In healthy contrast, the atmosphere inside the grand hall is wholly Italian and designed to give a taste of Italy while in the heart of medieval Tallinn. Upon entering, you're greeted by mellow Italian music, attentive waiters in black-and-white, and the quiet bustle coming from the open kitchen; candles quietly flicker and the air is thick with an intoxicating mix of perfume, truffles and wine. 'Guests often say that only when opening the restaurant's door to go home are they reminded that

they are, in fact, not in Italy but in Estonia,' Oja savs.

The restaurant's menu consists of classic Italian dishes that focus on simple and high-quality ingredients. 'The classics will always be there, but we try to play with seasonal ingredients for risottos and pastas to keep some surprises in the menu for guests who have become regulars,' explains the chef. His own favourites from the menu are a simple tomato and burrata salad,



and *orecchiette* pasta paired with spicy *salsicce* in a tomato sauce. Customer favourites have turned out to be two stand-out starters: artichokes with seasonal truffle sauce, and crispy squid. To finish your dinner, Oja recommends a cold sip of their homemade limoncello. 'It seems to have acquired a cult status around town,' admits the chef with a smile.

Those who share a passion for Italian cuisine can request a seat at the chef's table, where you can enjoy the hustle and bustle of the kitchen throughout the night. The spectacle of the well-oiled machine that is a professional kitchen is a perfect companion to the emotions and discussions that the food will surely spark.

The restaurant's Italian scope in Tallinn has already expanded to a neighbouring house located at Vene l, where an authentic Napoletana *pizzeria* was recently opened to accompany La Cucina di Orm Oja. The same core values of simplicity, quality and a quintessential Italian atmosphere have, of course, carried over to the more casual pizzeria.

#### OF TARTU

Known among locals as the university town, Tartu has a vivid social life. But this doesn't mean that everything comes to a halt as soon as the academic year comes to an end, for the riverbanks of the Emajõgi (the beautiful river that flows through Tartu) do not disappoint during the summer months either – everything simply switches over to a different pace.





#### VÄIKE KUUBA

Many restaurants, cafés and cocktail bars in Tartu open their terraces when the days get warmer and the evenings grow longer – so settle in and discover a different kind of sanctuary to rest the mind and take a break. One bar definitely worth visiting in the summer season is Väike Kuuba ('Little Cuba' in Estonian), a legendary mojito bar on the banks of the Emajõgi. Väike Kuuba won the hearts of both locals and guests as soon as it first opened in 2015 – how could it not, with the best mojitos in the northern hemisphere? If you think we're exaggerating, go ahead and try them for yourself – we guarantee you'll agree (take note: the predicted hit-alerts for this summer are the kiwi mojito and the 'Hemingway frozen daiguiri'). After eight years of being Estonia's first and only mojito bar with Caribbean vibes, Väike Kuuba has maintained its original essence and truly upholds the 'Tartu spirit' during the summer months – if it can be felt anywhere in town during the warmer months, it's in the late evening hours at Väike Kuuba. #### **KOLM TILLI**

If you're getting hungry but aren't exactly sure what you're craving, head to the Kolm Tilli restaurant ('Three Dills' in Estonian) in Aparaaditehas, a former factory that has been transformed into a vibrant cultural hub that features restaurants, exhibitions, performances and other events. Kolm Tilli is inspired by world street food, including the cooking of it, which is why there's an open kitchen at the heart of the restaurant. Adjacent to the main kitchen section are Naples-style pizza and pastry-making corners. All of this is underscored with a modern bar that follows all the latest trends while preserving the classical art of cocktail-making. Guests can observe how both their food and drinks are made while they wait for their delicious meals to be served. A recommendation for the upcoming season (if you haven't been lucky enough to try it already) is one of the most famous pizzas in all Estonia: the salami-truffle pizza. If you're an early riser, you can just as well kick off your day with breakfast at Kolm Tilli - it's not for nothing that it's grown to be one of the biggest restaurants in Estonia. In addition to excellent food, Kolm Tilli also offers a diverse cultural programme, ensuring a versatile and varied experience for every taste.

The quick-stop eatery *The Paper Bag Company* recently opened next to the restaurant. Although it focuses on take-away, you can also sit down and enjoy your meal if there's no need to rush and get on with a busy day.

#### MEAT MARKET

For those who appreciate a good steak, *Meat Market* restaurant is the best meat restaurant in Tartu. At *Meat Market*, cooking meat is considered an art form. *Meat Market's* wide selection of meats and other local produce, as well as excellent cooking techniques, are regarded as of the highest importance here, and all who hold the same values will recognise the worth of the restaurant's efforts.

Meat Market's meat selection is outstanding. On the menu you'll find most everything, from classical beef entrecôte and tenderloin to bull testicles. The restaurant respects their sources, so everything is used – from snout to tail – and food waste has been brought to a minimum. Meat Market has daily butcher's specials, and although normally local products are preferred, occasionally the specials may be very exotic (we're talking things like crocodile, zebra, kangaroo...). The menu includes smoked and slow-cooked meat, and serves food on ice as well as straight from the fiery grill. How food is prepared is what gives it flavour and texture, and the chefs here are well aware of this certitude. Guests are welcome to observe and learn! This season we recommend you try the amazing birria tacos – grilled instead of fried, they're incredibly juicy.

The restaurant also features a bar, and it is no less interesting. Here as well, the emphasis is on the craft – many of the syrups used in the cocktails are handmade. The drink list includes timeless classics and trendy newcomers from all around the world. *Meat Market's* menu has enough variety to fit with simple drinks and snacks with friends, a romantic dinner for two, or a larger group celebration.

#### CAFÉ TRUFFE

If you're looking for a place to spend a sunny day, maybe read a good book, and have a lovely meal, Café Truffe has the most sun-filled terrace in town. The terrace is located right at Tartu Town Square, fits more than a hundred people, and is open from morning until sunset. The café offers Mediterranean cuisine, including a rich salad selection, pastas, handmade desserts, and pastries. Café Truffe has been a local favourite for 18 years, with some items on the menu having reached legendary status (e.g. the satisfying French meat salad and the moistest-ever chocolate marble cake). Of course, new items are also regularly added to the menu to keep things interesting, right next to the old favourites. The 2023 summer menu features additions of Asian flavours, modern world-cuisine trends, and traditional meals. This season we've chosen to recommend the boeuf à la tartar with a Japanese twist, as well as the schnitzel made from slow-cooked meat - it's incredibly soft on the inside but with the traditional crispy crust on the outside.





#### airBaltic UNVEILS ITS $40^{\mathrm{TH}}$ AIRBUS A220-300 AIRCRAFT WITH A SPECIAL LATVIAN FLAG LIVERY

A special event was held at Riga Airport on April 17 to celebrate the arrival of *airBaltic's* 40<sup>th</sup> *Airbus A220-300* aircraft. It is the airline's second aircraft with livery inspired by the Latvian flag.

airBaltic has ordered a total of 50 aircraft of this type, with seven more expected to join its fleet this year.

Since May 2020, *airBaltic* has operated all of its flights with a single aircraft type, the *Airbus A220-300*. It has carried more than 11 million passengers so far, and more than 150,000 flights have been completed by *Airbus A220-300s*.

The A220-300 has the smallest single-aisle carbon footprint in the world, which helps reduce  ${\rm CO}_2$  and  ${\rm NO}_{\rm X}$  emissions by 25% and 50%, respectively. Similarly, its 50% smaller noise footprint translates into a much quieter aircraft. airBaltic's single-type fleet has also improved aircraft efficiency and passenger comfort. With such features as wider seats, larger windows, more hand luggage space in the cabin, and improved lavatories, airBaltic offers an excellent flying experience.

*Airbus Canada* President and CEO Benoît Schultz: 'Our team is proud to have delivered *airBaltic's* 40<sup>th</sup> *A220-300*. Each *A220* aircraft is unique, but this one is particularly special. Not only does it honour the colours of the Latvian flag, but it also represents airBaltic's continued trust towards the A220.'

At the special event in honour of the 40<sup>th</sup> aircraft, *airBaltic* announced its cooperation with the XXVII National Latvian Song and XVII Dance Festival, becoming its official airline and carrier. Taking place in Riga from June 30 to July 9, 2023, this year's festival will mark the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this cultural tradition. More than 60 events and concerts will be held at numerous venues throughout Riga during the festival. *airBaltic* employees sing, dance, or play music in about 50 ensembles that will be participating in the song festival.



#### How to prepare a flight

Alise Zarāne's office is behind the door with the 'Do not disturb' sign. But the sign is turned off right now. And thankfully, because that means everything in *airBaltic's* Operation Control Centre (OCC) is ticking smoothly. Alise describes this area as *airBaltic's* beating heart. It's where all of the daily flight operations are run from 24/7, where decisions about flight routes, crew changes, aircraft loading, amount of fuel, and other crucial factors are made.

So, in a nutshell, Alise, what goes on in the OCC? The OCC coordinates all *airBaltic* flights. But the process actually starts with the preparation of the flights themselves.

#### And how does that happen?

About two or three hours before a flight, we send the flight plan to the pilots who will be performing the flight. Initially, the system prepares it, even several routes, but our team then choose the most optimal one. We check and take into account the route track and altitude; airspace and airport restrictions; the weather en route, at the departure location, at the destination, and at alternate airports; the aircraft's technical status; and other factors.

But it's not enough to just choose a route. We also need to keep up-to-date on the latest information, because even short delays require changes to the flight plan. For example, if we see that a flight is delayed, it may be more cost-effective to choose a slightly more expensive route, but which will in the end be quicker and thus get the passengers to their connections. Planes, like cars, can travel on different 'roads', or paths; they don't just follow a single, straight line, as is commonly assumed. For instance, the

Riga-Paris flight does not follow the same route every day. The route also depends on the weather conditions along the route.

#### Load controllers and crew dispatchers also work in the same office as you. What are their responsibilities?

Load controllers send us data on how many passengers will be on the flight, how much baggage, whether there will be cargo and mail in the hold, and if so, how heavy. That's how we know how heavy the airplane will be on a particular flight and how high it can ascend. The higher an airplane flies, the more optimal and economical it is, because the air up there is less dense, and that means less friction, or drag, on the plane. But the heavier a plane is, the more fuel it consumes, and so it cannot always reach its maximum flight level. For our *Airbus A220-300* aircraft, that level is FL410.

Crew dispatchers make sure that all an airline's flights have sufficient crew assigned to them. Crew working hours are strictly regulated, and if the hours are over, they're over. There are situations in which another crew has to be quickly found for a flight because the previous crew has run out of working hours. That can happen in cases of diversion and also due to flight delays, because crews often operate several flights a day.

#### That's a lot of responsibility.

Yes, that's why we double-check things all the time. The system plans the route, then the flight dispatcher checks it and sends it to the pilots, who check it again and make sure they're happy with everything. A big factor that can have a major impact is sudden technical problems or system faults related to the aircraft.

You probably hear from time to time in the news about strikes by air traffic controllers and airport workers in various countries, most recently in France. This has a major impact on our work as well, because French airspace is congested, there's a shortage of air traffic controllers, and almost all flights over France can be delayed by as much as two or three hours. Such delays are called CTOT, or calculated take-off time.

The European Organisation for the Safety of Air Navigation (Eurocontrol) sends us the time at which our aircraft will be allowed to take off, depending on how busy the airspace is. In the meantime, we try to find alternative routes, which in most cases are more expensive because they're longer, and they're also not as easy to find, especially in summer, when there are more flights and other airspaces are busier as well.

Passengers are often confused as to why they're asked to board an airplane, and then it doesn't go anywhere. This is due to CTOT and congestion in airspaces and airports. In cases when it's not possible to replan a route, we always hope that the situation will nevertheless improve. In such situations, as soon as the aircraft is fully ready – the passengers have boarded, the doors and baggage compartments are closed – we report to Eurocontrol and ask for an earlier departure time. Sometimes these improvements are received and the airplane can immediately head to the runway and take off. But sometimes, unfortunately, that doesn't happen.

I want to stress that nobody has an interest in delaying flights. We do everything we can to ensure that all flights depart on time. In the event of delays, however, we follow along as to what happens with our transit passengers and look for alternatives to get them to their destinations as quickly as possible.

#### What's your role in this system? And when did you begin working at *airBaltic*?

I'm a flight dispatcher supervisor. But right now, while we're also looking to hire additional employees, I work shifts and do everything my colleagues do, namely, route planning.

I began working for *airBaltic* 13 years ago as a flight attendant. After about five years, I realised I wanted a change, so I transferred and became a flight operations coordinator. Those are the people with whom the pilots communicate the most, the people who make sure that the planes are refuelled on time, that the passengers are boarded, that technical staff are sent to the aircraft if necessary, and so on. One summer I offered to help out the flight dispatchers on weekends, because I was very interested in their work. And when a vacancy was advertised, I applied. I've now been in this position for four years.

#### How long is the training for a flight dispatcher?

Flight dispatchers are trained from square one right here at *airBaltic*. Training lasts about six months: three months of theory on air traffic control, aerodynamics, weather conditions, and basic route planning, and then three months of on-the-job training, working together with an instructor.

I myself still fly as a flight attendant from time to time, as part of our *Office in the Sky project* – it's my hobby. This programme was a very interesting idea, giving our office workers who are interested in it the opportunity to train as flight attendants and fly. We have five people from the OCC alone who fly as flight attendants in their time off.

#### How did you decide to become a flight attendant?

At the time, I was dancing in a folk dance group, and one of our fellow dancers was a flight attendant. I remember her running to rehearsals straight after work, still in her uniform. I was studying engineering back then, and for the first three years of the programme I wasn't able to combine my studies with anything else. But when the opportunity arose, I immediately sent in my application. I finished my studies and am now a civil engineer.

It doesn't seem like I've been in aviation for already 15 years. I still love it. Even when I fly as a passenger, I have a bad habit of arranging and adjusting other passengers' bags in the compartments as I walk down the aisle (*laughs*). I know I shouldn't do it, but it annoys me when I see wheels hanging out (*laughs again*), so I push them in. There's something magical about aviation.

#### Is that also why you travel?

Definitely. If I've ever had thoughts about changing jobs, I've never gone through with it; I wouldn't want to lose the opportunities to travel. My travel destinations are mostly to the mountains, whether near or far. I love hiking. In November, I was in Nepal again for a whole month with my colleague Madara Fuksa.

The first time I was in Nepal was before the Covid-19 pandemic. Last year, we reached Everest Base Camp at 5364 metres. We were a group of 16 people, including some colleagues from *airBaltic*, some captains.

But there are beautiful mountains much closer to home, too. Last summer, my boyfriend and I were in the Tatras, and it was very beautiful there. The concept there, though, is completely different, because there's comfort all around, whereas in Nepal

it's quite challenging to live out of a backpack in the mountains for 12 days. But I like to step outside my comfort zone and then come back home and appreciate that I have everything I need.

#### How do you feel when you close the door behind you to go home after a shift?

It's mostly with a feeling of a job well done. I guess the best part is that I can't take my work home with me. I hand my shift over to a colleague, it's over, and I can go home. I couldn't work from home, although sometimes I do envy those who work remotely, such as friends who are able to live in warm climates all winter long.

#### Returning to work, at what moments do you turn on the 'Do not disturb' sign above the door?

That's usually due to technical problems with aircraft: a fault in the system, lightning striking the aircraft, or a bird striking the aircraft during take-off. As soon as an airplane is taken out of the fleet for maintenance, we need to reschedule all the other flights that were scheduled for that airplane. If one aircraft is replaced with another, all the routes have to be rescheduled, because each route is linked to a particular aircraft registration.

#### And your next goals at work?

At the moment, everything is so well balanced – I have a great job, and I can also pursue my hobby as a flight attendant. But we're currently developing new flight dispatcher training programmes, and I'm involved in this interesting process. I also conduct courses for pilots. I've never worked nine to five. I've only done shift work, and I still enjoy it.

#### **Pilots** out of their office

Baltic Outlook introduces you to some of the most important people at airBaltic – its flight crew members, who have some of the most interesting hobbies.



**Roberts Klēbergs** (35), captain on *Airbus A220-300* aircraft, from Latvia

#### **HOBBY**

Captain Roberts Klēbergs began skateboarding at the age of 12. He was still in primary school when the Tony Hawk Pro Skater computer game became popular. Together with his classmates and his cousin, Roberts realised he wanted to give it a try. So their parents bought skateboards for the boys, and they started practising, mostly in Uzvaras Park in Riga. At the time, the city didn't have any special skate parks yet. But Roberts met other skaters in the park, and in the summers he skated every day from early morning until late at night.

'As I tell everyone, skateboarding is around 90 percent failures – that is, falls and crashes – and 10 percent successes, the skating itself,' he laughs. 'But I got used to it. And I even started to like it. It's the best feeling when you land a trick after a lot of unsuccesfull tries.'

After graduating from technical school, Roberts had to start working and gave up skateboarding.. But four years ago a friend of his encouraged him to buy a skateboard and start skateboarding again. By that time, there were already several skate parks in the city. 'I haven't stopped skating since then, and I intend to continue as long as I can, because when I skate, I can completely disconnect from everything else and not think about anything else. I hope that one day all, or at least one, of my three children will follow in my footsteps and realise what a great hobby it is. Skating requires a lot of concentration and technicality. There are days when it's nothing but falls, but then there are other times when it's pure joy.'

Roberts even takes a skateboard with him on business trips and explores nearby skate parks in his free moments.

Roberts' most frequent companion is a close friend who has a PhD in geology from the University of Latvia. 'Yes, when we go to a skate park, there are a lot of young people there, and in comparison to them, our level is mediocre. Some things we know how to do, other things we don't. And when we fall down, the young kids run up to us and ask us politely if we're all right,' he concludes with a laugh.

#### HOW IT ALL BEGAN

'I knew long ago that I was going to become a pilot,' says Roberts. 'One time, back when I was still a young child, my grandfather and I were fixing a roof together, and I saw an airplane flying over us in the sky. I remember thinking to myself that yes, I'd like to fly like that some day, too. And that thought remained with me, all the way up until I realised that this dream of mine could actually come true.'

One of Roberts' friends had already become a pilot and begun working at *airBaltic* when Roberts followed in his footsteps. At age 23, he began training at the Scandinavian Aviation Academy in Sweden. The programme took a year and a half, one year of which he spent at the school's campus in California. He and his wife got married in Las Vegas during that time.

Immediately after graduation, Roberts began working at *airBaltic*, flying *Boeing 737* aircraft. He later flew *Dash Q400* aircraft and became a captain, and before the Covid-19 pandemic hit, he had also already begun flying *Airbus A220-300* aircraft. 'This type of aircraft has very advanced system automation, which makes a pilot's work a lot easier,' he comments.

'I'm a problem solver by nature, and even if I fall off a skateboard, I always try to understand what I did wrong, why I fell off.' Problem solving also comes in handy at his job. But besides pilots having offices with the most beautiful views, what Roberts truly enjoys about his work is the peaceful feeling on the flight deck during flights.
