### Dear guests of airBaltic,

Summer has come to an end, and what a busy one it has been. With each passing month, we have observed growing demand, with passengers choosing *airBaltic* for their long-awaited leisure getaways, short city breaks, and business trips. In fact, this July marked the first time since 2019 that we served over half a million passengers in a single month. I firmly believe this upward trend will persist, as we are offering exciting destinations to prolong the summer in Europe and beyond.

However, the upcoming winter season is also just around the corner, starting at the end of October. This year it will stand out with 11 new routes from the Baltics and Tampere in Finland – the largest number ever seen in a winter season for *airBaltic*. Overall, we will provide around 80 routes across our network to connect Riga and other cities in the region.

On top of that, the company's exceptional Hl financial results, in contrast to 2022, have exceeded our expectations. The data confirm that *airBaltic* has attained its highest-

ever net profit (EUR 14.6 million, up EUR 105.7 million) as well as a surge in revenue (EUR 291 million, up 52%), EBITDAR levels, and operational excellence. Such milestones are the outcome of dedicated work, and we look forward to aiming even higher.

The growth does not stop there, as our fleet also continues to expand by welcoming our  $43^{\rm rd}$  and  $44^{\rm th}$  *Airbus A220-300* aircraft this month. This means that a growing volume of passengers will be flying the most efficient and greenest aircraft, experiencing a high level of comfort. Just imagine – thus far, *airBaltic* has carried nearly 15,000,000 passengers on its *Airbus A220-300* aircraft.

Looking ahead, along with our growing fleet, we must also carefully plan for highly skilled personnel, because they are a key factor of a successful airline. Here we can proudly rely on the *airBaltic* Pilot Academy. While celebrating its fifth anniversary this year, the 19th and 20<sup>th</sup> groups of students are preparing to start their professional pilot studies at the academy. To date, 78 students have joined *airBaltic* as first officers after graduating from the academy, and it is very likely that one of them is taking care of your flight today.







# MEETING AT THE MARKET

It all started with Kalnciema Market, which for years has been hosting concerts and exhibitions alongside a traditional Saturday farmers' and artisans' market. The well-preserved historical wooden buildings that surround this favourite meeting place add to the special aura.

The recently restored Agenskalns Market, whose pavilion is a shining example of the rationalist Art Nouveau style, is also nearby. Here, farmers and home producers sell their wares on the ground floor, while the upper level features food and drinks in a charming atmosphere. Exhibitions, concerts, and stand-up performances are also part of daily life at Āgenskalns Market.

This month, the historic Vidzeme Market. which is still awaiting renovation, will also see a revival of sorts. From September 7 to October 8, it will host Survival Kit, which is Latvia's most important contemporary art festival. Don't miss it!


# SANDRO MILLER PHOTO EXHIBITION **Until October 29**

September 5-24



# Riga – the world's capital of running

Great news for all running enthusiasts! On October I, Riga will mark its title as the capital of road running by hosting the first World Athletics Road Running Championships.

Around 20,000 runners from at least 100 countries will compete in a half-marathon, a 5K run, and a mile run to win unique medals inspired by Latvian art. And the best part is that you, too, can participate!

While there have been World Athletics Half Marathon Championship in the past, the World Athletics Road Running Championships in Riga will be the first competition focused on three distances – a half-marathon, a 5K run, and a mile run. Additionally, for the mass race the event will feature a relay race in pairs. As an introductory step before the 2024 Summer Olympics in Paris, which will have the same entry rules, everyone is eligible to participate. The championships have gathered significant attention from the world's running elite, but amateur runners, running enthusiasts, and those who are just starting to get a taste for running are all welcome to participate. In addition to individual runs and relay races, larger groups of friends or colleagues are invited to form teams and participate in the Team Cup organised by Signet Bank, thus promoting running and an active lifestyle among colleagues, friends, and acquaintances.

Thanks to numerous activities sponsored by *Rimi*, the championship is also suitable for children. On September 30 – the day before the races – children will be invited to participate in distances of 200 and 400 metres, as well as a baby run, free of charge. For a symbolic fee, they can also run for the title of Sprint King and Queen for a distance of 50 metres.



With 2025 being a culturally important year for Latvia thanks to the 150th anniversary of the traditional Song and Dance Festival, the Road Running Championship will also pay tribute to Latvian cultural roots. Not only does the mile run begin right in front of the Latvian National Museum of Art, but the awards are art-themed as well. All participants will receive an official t-shirt featuring elements from artwork by the famous Latvian impressionist Vilhelms Purvītis, and at the finish line they will receive medals inspired by the works of the notable Latvian painter and graphic designer Niklāvs Strunke.

But what if running is not for you? You can still be part of the championships – just line up along the route to support and cheer on your friends and loved ones! The whole of Riga will turn into a big running party on the first day of October, and it will be a great opportunity to be part of the history of the road running championships. See you in your running shoes in Riga!

### CITIES OF THE MONTH / September

Turkish Painting: In the Pursuit of Modernism, an exhibition at the Sakıp Sabancı Museum, reflects the transformation and modernisation of Turkish art between the late Ottoman Empire and the early Republic of Turkey (until December 31; Sakıp Sabancı Cd. No:42; sakipsabancimuzesi.org). The showcase reveals the biggest names in national painting via their vivid landscapes, still lifes, deeply personalised portraits, and documentations of court life. The so-called 1914 Generation is considered to have marked a turning point in the history of Turkish art. Most of its artists – among them İbrahim Çallı, Feyhaman Duran, and Namık İsmail – left for Europe and then returned to Turkey at the outbreak of the First World War. Paris had been their main destination, and the array of artistic expression, styles, and genres of that time, most of all Impressionism, is reflected in the unique works by these Turkish artists.

The Istanbul Modern, the city's first museum of modern and contemporary art, is set in a new building designed by the world-famous Renzo Piano Building Workshop (Kılıç Ali Paşa Mahallesi, Tophane İskele Cd. No:1/1; istanbulmodern. org). Sitting on the picturesque Karaköy waterfront, where the Bosphorus and Golden Horn meet, the museum provides a space for temporary exhibitions, film screenings, and educational programmes. The building was inspired by the glittering waters of the Bosphorus, while its shape resembles a ship packed with containers. The rectilinear façade is made from a sequence of 3D aluminium panels that interplay with sunlight and the sky. The museum's permanent collection of Turkish and international art spans from 1945 to the present. The restaurant terrace has spectacular views across Istanbul, while 360-degree views and a reflective pool mesmerise visitors from the rooftop. The museum also features a library, event spaces, a café, and a gift shop.

Nestled along the Bosphorus waterfront, The Peninsula Istanbul offers a luxurious and memorable stay overlooking the city (Karaköy, Kemankeş Cd. No:34; peninsula.com; from EUR 950). The new hotel occupies four impressive buildings: a former passenger terminal designed in the Bauhaus style in 1937, two restored Ottoman-era gems, and a modern glass-and-bronze extension. Its 177 rooms created by local interior design star Zevnep Fadıllıoğlu combine dark wooden furniture, pastel shades, elegant textiles, and typical Turkish mother-of-pearl inlay. Guests can arrive at The Peninsula from the street or by private boat. The hotel's enchanted garden was designed by the Swiss landscaping master Enzo Enea. The outdoor swimming pool and lounge zone are situated right along the waterfront, while the 25-metre indoor pool is surrounded by Marmara columns and illuminated by overhead domes.






### Renoir - The Painter and His Models is

a monographic exhibition at the Museum of Fine Arts focusing on the figural depictions and portraits of the Impressionist genius (September 22 -January 7; Dózsa György út 4l; mfab.hu). Pierre-Auguste Renoir (1841–1919) declared himself a figurative painter, and his artistic gaze was always drawn towards intriguing people, including, of course, women - his nudes famously celebrate the grace of the female body. A skilled portraitist, he caught subtle facial expressions, radiant gazes, and the nuances of a person's character, as well as the phenomena of modern life at the turn of the century, to depict a carefree and harmonious world through a varied oeuvre spanning more than six decades. The exhibition, which includes paintings, graphic art, and sculptures, follows Renoir's path chronologically and thematically via his relationships with his models.

Liget Project, a major revitalisation project of Budapest City Park, aims to transform a popular green space into a hub of contemporary culture. The park's latest newcomer, the Museum of Ethnography, attracts visitors not only with its rich collection of ethnographic artefacts of Hungarian folk culture but also with a spectacular green rooftop that's open to all 24/7 (Dózsa György út 35; neprajz.hu). The design of the building by Napur Architect features a curve measuring a kilometre in diameter with two wings resembling hillsides. They support a garden that rises as high as the crowns of the surrounding trees. Covering more than 7000 square metres, the green area houses a variety of flora. And with wooden benches throughout, this panoramic roof garden is tailor-made for urban recreation and also provides a spectacular panorama of the park.

Set on central Andrássy Avenue, the Neo-Renaissance-style Drechsler Palace – built in 1886 and the former home of the Hungarian State Ballet Academy - now houses the new W Hotel Budapest by Marriott, which blends a luxurious past with sleek modernity (Andrássy ut. 25; marriott.com; from EUR 587). The 151 guest rooms and 45 suites with noble turquoise wall panelling, sleek lounge area, and speakeasy-style bar elevate guests' stays with a playful and bold design by the local studio *Bánáti* + Hartvig and London-based BJB Architects. Protected architectural elements have been restored, original tiles reused, and former colours and textures reimagined. The light-filled courtyard is shielded by a glass roof, while the mirrors in the vaulted basement spa create an illusion of infinite space. Monochrome checkerboard tiles in the bathrooms reference Hungarian bonds with the game of chess.



### CITIES OF THE MONTH / September









The Infamous Beauty exhibition at the DOX Centre for Contemporary Art highlights the oeuvre of American contemporary artist Andres Serrano (until January 7; Poupětova l; dox.cz). The showcase is divided into two intertwined parts, with the section titled 'Beauty' displaying more than sixty works from Serrano's series Body Fluids (1986–1990), Nomads (1990), Objects of Desire (1992), America (2001-2004), Holy Works (2011), Made in China (2017), and others. His new pieces are complemented by older works to create an intriguing dialogue and powerful connection. The images from the Infamous series created in 2019 are displayed in the mezzanine and overwhelm with the theme of racial intolerance and inequality. Picturesqueness and high aesthetics are a key trademark of Serrano's style. Often considered a rather controversial artist, he seeks and finds ultimate beauty even when depicting the darkest narratives and places.

Held since 2008, the **Dvořák Prague** international music festival is packed with a variety of musical events and enthrals the Czech capital with classical rhythms for two weeks in September (September 2-25; dvorakovapraha.cz). The event is dedicated to the iconic Czech composer Antonín Dvořák (1841–1904). The programme is divided into several series, with the 'Dvořák Collection' at the centre and presenting complete categories of Dvořák's oeuvre every year. The Israel Philharmonic Orchestra and Vienna Philharmonic are among the international orchestras performing this year. On September 9, Zurich's Tonhalle-Orchestra will play Dvořák's Cello Concerto and Symphony No. 9, followed by pieces by Beethoven and Bruckner the next day.

Marie B, a new restaurant with a blank menu concept, has opened in the heart of Prague's Old Town to bring a spirit of experimentation to historical Czech cuisine (Dlouhá 729/37; marieb.cz). Run by a Michelin-starred team from the acclaimed La Dégustation Bohême Bourgeoise restaurant, Marie B is named in honour of the historic culinary hero and cookbook author Marie B. Svobodová. Her 1894 book intrigued with such dishes as fried watermelon, and now Marie B chef Jiří Šoura creates dishes that are no less inspiring. The fourcourse lunch and dinner menu constantly changes, and Šoura is free to serve whatever he decides to create at that particular moment from the available fresh seasonal ingredients. The interior features historic vaulted ceilings and is adorned with neon and textile works by Berlin artist Anselm Reyle. The Vin de Marie wine shop sits next door.

# The majestic Marienburg Castle

Looking like a scene from a book of fairy tales, Marienburg Castle remains one of the main symbols of Hanover.

Lavish balls, extravagant dresses, royal receptions – Marienburg Castle was designed to be the centre of the Kingdom of Hanover, uniting royalty from all the nearby kingdoms. While more than 150 years have passed since the kingdom was dissolved and the state was added to Germany, the castle still stands to remind the world of the magnificent beauty and power it once represented.

The romantic medieval Marienburg Castle of Hanover is a marvellous jewel of the German landscape. Built in the 1860s as a gift and summer house from King George V to his beloved wife, Queen Marie, it has become one of the most prominent architectural landmarks of Central Europe. However, George V was blind since childhood and therefore could not see the marvellous work of art the architects created for his wife. And unfortunately, the castle did not serve as a home for the royal family for very long. It was not yet completely finished or fully inhabited when the Kingdom of Hanover lost the Austro-Prussian War and subsequently also its independence in 1867. The incomplete castle soon became part of the German Empire, and the royal couple were forced to leave and live in exile in Austria.

After losing its original inhabitants, the majestic castle remained empty for almost 150 years. Only in the past few years has it regained its previous grace and reopened to visitors. Marienburg Castle is built in the enchanting Neo-Gothic style, which reflects the architectural trends of the 1860s. Because the castle was abandoned for so long, its detailed interior was left untouched and visitors can marvel at the patterned walls and carved ceilings in their original splendour.

Atop Marienburg Castle rises an impressive tower with a renovated viewing platform. Now open to visitors, the platform offers beautiful views over the Leine River and its valley. Climbing to the top requires good weather conditions, but the view often leaves visitors speechless. The castle itself makes one reminisce about historic grace, the unconditional love that inspired the construction of the castle, and the various different eras it has witnessed. Nowadays, Marienburg Castle is also a popular wedding destination and houses a well-rated restaurant that provides the best finishing flavours and touches to a visit here.

While embarking on culinary explorations in Copenhagen, you're likely to come across tableware by *MK Studio*. The studio is the creation of **Magdalena** and **Michal Kalużny-Włodarek**. Magdalena is a ceramicist, and Michal is a chef. *MK Studio's* vibrant yet incredibly functional dishware is a combination of their expertises.

Magdalena and Michal met in Poznań, Poland, but have called Copenhagen their home since 2014. 'We love how bicycle-friendly the city is, and the food and coffee here are exceptional,' they say. Here, they share some recommendations for a visit to the Danish capital.

# Hart bageri

This is our favourite bakery and one of the most famous bakeries in Copenhagen. Its founder, Richard Hart, was a baker at Noma and has brought Danish pastries to new culinary heights. It's situated in the heart of the green Frederiksberg neighbourhood. We recommend the sesame city loaf with butter and cheese, and definitely also sample the cardamom croissants. 



# Take your friends

...and master the cult Spanish dish – paella.

Did you know that Valencia is the birthplace of paella? It is here, on the Mediterranean coast of Spain, ten kilometres outside the city by the picturesque Albufera lagoon, that the best rice for traditional Valencian paella is grown. Rice cultivation in the region was introduced by the Moors around the 10<sup>th</sup> century CE, and the grain soon became a main ingredient of the local cuisine.

But only tourists eat paella in the evening. It is in fact a typical lunch dish, cooked and eaten at home with the family on weekends. Paella has always been a lunchtime meal of farmers, who added to the rice everything the land and sea could offer. For example, classic *Paella Valenciana* is cooked in a broth with rabbit meat, chicken, small snails, and green beans.

To cook the rice, add two volumes of water for every one volume of rice, and boil for 18 minutes. To recognise authentic paella, one should assess its colour, aroma, and soccarat — the browned, crusty layer of rice that forms on the bottom of the pan and gives extra dimension to the dish. Paella must be cooked on an open fire that includes branches from orange trees, which produce extra smoke that infuses the dish with the genuine flavours of Valencia.

Dozens of restaurants serve this hearty dish in the city centre. But for a more authentic experience, try the iconic *La Pepica* or *Casa Carmela* at the seaside, *La Barraca de Toni Montoliu* out in the countryside, or head to the village of El Palmar amid the rice fields.

So how about cooking some authentic paella yourself? It's a memorable local experience to undertake solo or with a group of friends, and a great opportunity to meet local people. Several workshops and cooking classes in the city, such as Very Valencia and Horta Viva, are offered via tourist excursion apps. My First Paella cooking school is located in the lively Ruzafa neighbourhood. A workshop there begins with a visit of the colourful stalls of Ruzafa Market to buy the savoury local ingredients and hear curious stories about the area. Once the shopping is done, everyone ties on an apron and the pans are set on the fire the magic of paella is ready to begin!

# Back to its origins

Al Shindagha – the historical neighbourhood of Dubai that reveals the heritage and architectural core of the city.

It's hard to believe that the most-populated city in the United Arab Emirates (UAE), which lures visitors in with the most luxurious five-star hotels and the tallest architecture in the world, was a simple fishing village in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. While the trademark urban image of Dubai is now rich, shiny, and future-orientated, there's still a special area here for history and heritage aficionados to discover – Al Shindagha neighbourhood.

Strategically located along the shores of Dubai Creek, this historical district reflects the lifestyle of Dubai from the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century to the 1970s. Back then, houses here were built using the traditional materials of coral stone, gypsum, and teak. They were interconnected with courtyards, separated by narrow alleys and public squares, and pierced with tall wind towers called *barajeels*.

The ongoing Dubai Historical District development project works towards the transformation and conservation of this old site. Now considered the UAE's largest openair museum, the neighbourhood features various different individual heritage projects and attractions, including museums, forts, restaurants, and other venues to discover. The revitalisation of Al Shindagha's identity includes 162 historical buildings in an area of 169,000 square metres. Now 80 of them are grouped in

22 pavilions, each of which presents a particular aspect of Dubai's heritage, such as governance, society, life on land and the sea, creativity, and well-being.

The local practice X Architects, along with the international multidisciplinary design studio GSM Project, has designed the contemporary Shindagha Welcome Pavilion. Shaped like an open plaza with a teak roof and shifting walls, it acts as a meeting point and information centre for visitors to the Dubai Historical District. Also of note is the Perfume House, which offers a dive into Emirati culture via scent. Once the residence of the perfume connoisseur Sheikha Sheikha bint Saeed Al Maktoum, it houses much of the late royal's personal collection of scents, including a rare 28-kilogram piece of oud, which is one of the most expensive items on display in the museum.

The new Al Shindagha Museum, for its part, tells about the cultural origins of Dubai and the Emirates. It hosts permanent exhibitions, workshops, and educational programmes, and several of the museum's pavilions are set in historical houses. With an interactive exposition designed by *Acciona Cultura*, the museum covers such topics as people and faith, urban development, traditional healthcare and food, jewellery, and beauty.



# ALIVE AND KICKING

Give Brussels a chance, and its big-city pleasures, multicultural mindset, and dynamic nature will surprise you.

'Lâches!' ('let go' in French), yells a grey-haired man with beads of sweat on his forehead as we both hang on to the climbing holds 20 metres above the ground, almost reaching the ceiling of the Church of Saint Anthony of Padua. I befriended this man just 15 minutes ago, down on the ground, confessing that this was my first time climbing and seeing terrifying scenarios in my mind of the auto-belay system failing and, instead of gently transporting me back down when I let go of the holds, crashing me onto the floor. I have a terrible fear of heights, so how did I get here?

It all started yesterday when dining at *Old Boy*, a hot-ticket modern Asian bistro, with my friend Sanne, who moved to Brussels from Amsterdam a year ago. While savouring the camembert-and-kimchi-filled wontons, in the classic manner of neighbouring-nation rivalry she noted that every trend that appears in Amsterdam arrives in Brussels two years later...like climbing and natural wine. Suddenly she remembered about a new climbing room installed in an abandoned church: 'You must try it!'

Contradicting my survival instincts, I let go of the climbing holds. The system slowly transports me back to the ground. 'We noticed that the church was standing empty, and we thought – it's perfect for climbing,' says Kyril Wittouck, one of the founders of the *Maniak Padoue* climbing hall.

The Neo-Gothic church tucked away in the Forest neighbourhood at the southern edge of the city was deteriorating and demanded high maintenance costs that the shrinking congregation could not afford. Thus Maniak, which already operated three other modern climbing gyms in Nivelles, Charleroi, and Brainel'Alleud, came to the church with an offer it couldn't refuse - to rent, renovate, and preserve the structure, while the congregation moved to a smaller room within the church. It's a win-win situation. The refurbishment was gentle, with each drill hole carefully considered. The altar and stained windows have remained intact, while the symbols of Christianity were removed. It seems that in Brussels, anything is possible – if you want to fit a climbing wall into a church, you can.

# I'm surprised by the many eye-catching façades I encounter

I FIRST TRIED RIDING AN E-SCOOTER IN BRUSSELS, TOO. IN 2017, MY DATE ARRIVED ON THIS FORM OF TRANSPORTATION, WHICH UP UNTIL THEN I HAD DISMISSED AS JUST FOR KIDS OR LAZY PEOPLE. But then, while zipping through the unexpectedly hilly streets, I got the hang of it and acknowledged the e-scooter's advantages. We ended up eating take-away pizza at Place Poelaert, with the panoramic nighttime view of the historical heart of the city on one side and the Palace of Justice on the other.

When the Palace of Justice was constructed in the late 1800s, it created much controversy. The architect, Joseph Poelaert, was given enormous artistic freedom, and large parts of the Marolles working-class district were sacrificed for the construction of this gigantic court complex, leading to Poelaert becoming a *persona non grata* among the residents. At the time, the Palace of Justice was the world's largest building, but Poelaert died of exhaustion and madness a few years before its completion. In 1984, with the start of a major renovation, the palace became trapped in metal constructions that remain in place to this day, resulting in the nickname the Palace of Scaffolding. Recently, however, the Belgian government announced a plan and budget for finally freeing the building from scaffolding. Construction work will

commence next year and will hopefully be finished in time for Belgium's  $200^{th}$  anniversary in 2030.

One thing that has changed in Brussels is the number of electric scooters. There are currently 21,000 e-scooters on the streets of Brussels, compared to 15,000 in Paris. And while the city's officials have promised to decrease that number to 8000 by next year due to the nuisance of inconsiderate parking and a haphazard driving culture, the residents I meet don't seem too bothered by the scooters, noting their convenience. Following suit, I nab one and head to the *Seven* café, a new health-minded local favourite in the residential district of Uccle.

It's lunchtime, and the airy café is buzzing. The long line of small tables is occupied by lunch dates; young parents and dog owners crowd the wooden lounge chairs in front of the impeccably curated shelves of bookazines; and time-pressed clients in high-end sportswear wait for their superfood shakes on the bench with a ficus-lyrata planted in the centre of it. The concise menu bursts with healthy breakfast and lunch dishes, and I opt for a Nordic salad with baby potatoes, feta, and buttermilk vinaigrette.

Seven is one of the eleven winners of the Commerce Design Awards 2023, which are taking place as part of Brussels Design September (BDS) from September 12 to 30. Indeed, as I wander the streets, I'm surprised by the many eye-catching façades I encounter, from pastel-coloured brunch places and retro cheese shops to crisply minimalist sneaker stores presenting kicks like works of art. 'It's not only about the pure aesthetics but also about how practical the design is,' says Elizabeth Djam, the art director and event manager for BDS, when we meet at the *Hier* studio in





Saint-Gilles. Design usually isn't the first thing that comes to mind when hearing the word Brussels, but undeservedly so.

Multicultural and welcoming, Brussels is a hub where creatives from both sides of the nation mingle with international talent from abroad who have found fertile ground for their work in the European capital. That's also proven by the consistency of BDS, which has taken place for 17 years already. 'What sets BDS apart is that we don't just showcase local design but also facilitate interactions between world-renowned design professionals and amateurs and design aficionados,' continues Djam.

During BDS, the city's workshops, artisan ateliers, galleries, and fablabs open their doors to the community. Shops that have won Commerce Design Awards can be recognised by the stickers on their doors, while participating galleries and workshops have a special D sign hanging above their shopfronts. Other highlights of this year's edition include a contemporary design market and an itinerary around the city's finest vintage treasure troves. BDS is also honouring the 130<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Art Nouveau movement with an exhibition at MAD Brussels showcasing the oeuvre of Spanish designer Jaime Hayon, sometimes referred to as the contemporary Antoni Gaudí.

On September 20, a special conference titled 'Subjects/ Objects on the Move' will tackle the question of soft mobility. With 3D printers buzzing in the background, designer and conference organiser Thomas Billas tells me that the aim is to start a discussion in society. The issue of sustainable mobility will be looked at on a global scale, with experts tackling various different angles of the topic. When asked how he evaluates soft mobility in Brussels, Billas is optimistic: 'It's getting better.' The pandemic forced the city to advance its biking infrastructure, and the results are visible – according to *Brussels Mobility*, around 1.1 million cyclists are pedalling the city's roads nowadays.

WHO TO BETTER ASK ABOUT THE CITY'S WALKABILITY THAN THOSE ROAMING ITS STREETS? I meet Antoine

Lemaître, who is the key account manager at *Samsøe Samsøe* and the co-founder of Carbon Athletics, a running community based at *Bouche*, which is located just steps away from the Quartier Royal and is rightly considered one of Brussels' finest specialty coffee spots. Wearing a cap stating 'Running Cult Member', it's easy to spot Lemaître. He's been running since his teenage years, but his fascination with the sport really only began to take hold two years ago, when he moved to Paris for work and needed to replace field hockey with something more French.

It's there, in Paris – and through running – that Lemaître met Leo, who is also from Brussels. The two were stunned by the French capital's vibrant running culture and decided to bring some of it back to Brussels, where running had a bit of a bad rap: 'It's considered old-fashioned; none of my friends were running.'

To elevate Brussels' running culture, last September the two men launched Carbon Athletics, and since then they've organised around 15 social runs. The idea is simple: meet up, run the city's streets, and then rejoin for a drink. 'Everyone's welcome!' emphasises Lemaître. There's no admission fee or membership. The group simply strives to highlight the social aspects of running, showing that running together is more fun.

# 'Brussels is changing a lot, and the quality of life is amazing!'

Running is social, good for your physical and mental health, practical (because all you need is running shoes)... Lemaître can list countless benefits of running, and at last, it seems he's being heard. Not only have many of his friends started running, but he's also seeing many other running-centred initiatives popping up around Brussels, which he finds super motivating.

A milestone event was this year's '20 km of Brussels', which takes place each year on the last Sunday of May. There were 110 runners registered under Carbon Athletics for the race, and even more joined the afterparty. They teamed up with *Distance*, a hip running store from Paris, and organised a pop-up store in the *Rebel* wine bar and an afterparty at *Bar du Matin*. Carbon Athletics recently also collaborated with the newly opened *The Hoxton Brussels* hotel, and Lemaître discloses there are many other exciting collaborations in the pipeline. Still, the emphasis will remain on the quality, not quantity, of events.

'Actually, running in Brussels is so much better than in Paris, it's crazy!' Lemaître points out. 'Just one kilometre from Ixelles or Saint-Gilles, and you're in the middle of nature, whereas in Paris you need to run at least 2.5 kilometres and pass many traffic lights before you come to a crowded riverside. But it's flat,' he notes. The relative ruggedness of the Brussels Marathon, which takes place in October, could

be the reason why that race is not a favourite among local runners or visitors to the city. For running enthusiasts visiting Brussels, Lemaître suggests the Bois de la Cambre, which has a small artificial lake at the centre, for a short five- to tenkilometre lap, and the Sonian Forest for longer distances.

Although he currently splits his time between Brussels and Paris, at the end of our conversation, Lemaître reveals his plan to relocate back to Brussels fully, mentioning the city's growing appeal: 'Brussels is changing a lot, many daring concepts are springing up, and the quality of life is amazing – it's peaceful and green, yet there's so much happening!'

WHEN OLD BOY OPENED FIVE YEARS AGO, SHARING PLATES WAS NOT A THING IN BRUSSELS. 'We needed to instruct people on how many dishes to order,' recalls John Prigogine, who, together with Xavier Chen, established the restaurant in a tranquil corner of Ixelles. While in Asia it's common to have a happy commotion of dishes on the dining table, that custom seems to have been lost along the way, as most Asian restaurants in Europe rely on clichéd decor and the holy trinity of Western dining: a starter, a main, and dessert.

Having Thai and Taiwanese roots, Prigogine and Chen's kitchen is inspired by Southeast Asia. Five years in, the bistro remains consistently fully booked each night, with a well-coiffed clientele filling up the dining room and the counter, which is lighted up by sudden flashes from the stir-fry pans in the open kitchen. The umami-dense plates served by speedy waiters incorporate local produce, such as Belgian mussels. The food is complemented by an extensive list of natural wines.




Across town, a short walk from the busy Place Sainte-Catherine, Jocasta Allwood, the visionary behind Nightshop, has also noticed the city's growing interest in natural wines and less stern dining concepts. Ironically named after the shabby heavens of late-hour cravings, Nightshop opened last February and quickly began attracting crowds. Allwood, who started out in the graphic design world, never planned for the place to grow into what it is today. Her partner, Jens Crabbé, the founder of MOK specialty coffee, found a garage on the Rue de Flandre, just steps away from his café, to set up a roastery. 'We came up with the idea of opening a small bar-cumshop in front of it. It was supposed to be a side project,' says Allwood.

But there seems to be nothing transient about *Nightshop* when I visit it on an early Thursday evening. Nabbing a chair by the imposing stone counter graced by many white candles, I settle in with a glass of orange wine from Emilia-Romagna and eavesdrop on how the staff guides patrons through the selection in the extensive wine fridge. The menu is short but compelling and changes every week depending on the seasonal availability of the ingredients. Thick slabs of sourdough bread and herb butter,

a plate of *boquerones* swimming in rosemary oil, and courgettes lying on a cloud of *stracciatella* accompanied by salty panko...

I notice the temptation in other guests' eyes when they see my plates. We smile, exchange dish recommendations, and make sure we give each other enough space at the counter. 'We didn't want to be just another charcuterie/fromage wine bar, but a welcoming place with a soul and a bit of roughness, yet welcoming,' says Allwood. The mood is as convivial as the flavours on the plates. *Nightshop* is one of those places for which you may consider moving to another city.


The following day, before I leave Brussels, I take one last lap around the city to come to a verdict. Like most mornings, it's misty and grey, matching the Neoclassical architecture of the Place Royale square. As I wait for the traffic light to turn green, I observe the passersby with envy – I wish my daily commute were as splendid as theirs. Descending from the Mont des Arts, the famous view of Brussels unfolds before my eyes. There I come across the famous surrealist René Magritte, or, to be precise, his signature silhouette of a bowler-hatted man gracing the corner



of the *Château Moderne* café. In fact, it's a recreation of Magritte's The *Happy Donor* painting by street artist Julien de Casabianca. It's one of the eight murals peppered around the city to celebrate the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Magritte's birth. Humorous and clever, Magritte's work can turn any art-averse person into a museum-shop aficionado. Adding to Brussels' extensive collection of street art, these murals will be on display until the beginning of next year.

'Brussels, why would you go to Brussels?' In my mind I replay an inquiry I received before departing for the Belgian capital. Such a sardonic comment could only come from someone who's been in Brussels only to navigate the bureaucratic corridors or spend a layover with some *Leffe* in the first bar at hand. Spend a day or two in this city, and you'll see there's so much more to it than a tiny peeing boy with an ever-changing wardrobe and chocolates that are too pretty to eat. The city's countless enjoyments – a buzzing design scene, exciting food concepts, picturesque architecture, amiable locals – will make you as dizzy as a hearty glass of Trappist beer on an empty stomach.

As I enter the Royal Park (the former hunting grounds of the Dukes of Brabant), a pair of middle-aged men run past me, chatting. Brussels seems perfect for reunions of friends. Just imagine whiling away the hours in a cosy bar, sampling the extensive beer menu, or jumping on the natural wine trend, or exchanging big ideas of life in the palatial hallways of the Royal Museums of Fine Arts, or catching a concert in one of the city's numerous world-class venues. And finally, having a midnight pick-me-up at the *frithot* while promising each other to wake up early tomorrow morning to once and for all set the record straight – who's the faster runner?

### YOUR NEXT DESTINATION / September



**Túbo Logier** is the chef-founder of the *Aster* restaurant, a noteworthy newcomer to Brussels' dining scene. *Aster* serves refined dishes made of local fish and vegetables cooked over fire.

Having grown up in Ghistel, a town in West Flanders, Logier honed his gastronomical talents at Belgium's destination restaurant *In De Wulf*, London's *The Clove Club*, and 4850 in Amsterdam. Logier has always been attracted by the cosmopolitanism of Brussels.

# What are some hidden gems in Brussels?

When I feel like just having a few beers and hanging out, I head to Kiosk Radio in Parc Royal. This tiny wooden kiosk hosts up-and-coming DJs playing sets. Brussels has a roster of great art museums, such as the Centre for Fine Arts (Bozar) and the Horta Museum, but I think the Wiels contemporary art centre is often overlooked. Situated in the Forest district, it's housed in a former brewery. But when I want to escape the city's noise, I head to Plantentuin Meise just outside of Brussels, which is one of the biggest botanical gardens in Europe.

# How would you describe the locals?

It's hard to define a local because Brussels is such a diverse, multicultural city, gathering all sorts of people with different backgrounds and stories. But what unites everyone who's been in Brussels for a longer time is that they're all resilient and tough but also very welcoming and kind.

# Where would you recommend going outside of Brussels for a day trip?

There are many places to go for a day trip. While all the tourist guides highlight Bruges and Ghent, I'd recommend Ostend. It's a town on the Belgian coast of the North Sea, and I spent a lot of time there when growing up. It has a lot to offer for daytrippers, from marvelling at the Belle Epoque houses to a nice walk in the dunes to sayouring shrimp croquettes.

# What are some food and drink spots you'd recommend? My favourite local pub is

Midpoint, near Kanal. It's run by the most heartwarming Turkish couple and has a great atmosphere. Nightshop, a wine bar offering small plates and a fine selection of natural wines, is a great option for a night out with friends. For dining, I'd consider Samouraï. It's been operating since 1974 and does traditional Japanese cuisine very well. An old favourite is Le Pigeon Noir, a restaurant that's been holding a Michelin star forever. Come here for sublime traditional fare such as kidneys in mustard sauce or a good beef tartare with fries.

# What's a common assumption about Brussels that you think is false?

That it's only worth visiting the city centre. There are a lot of things going on beyond Grand Place – loads of vibrant neighbourhoods and spots to discover, such as the daily flea market at Vossenplein in Marollen or Abattoir in Anderlecht, which is an old-fashioned market hall hosting an array of vendors selling fresh produce.



# THE ANALYTICAL RUNNER

Matt Rees – a Welsh runner and ambassador for the World Athletics Road Running Championships in Riga The World Athletics Road Running Championships in Riga will host many elite athletes from all around the world, who will compete in 21K, 5K and one-mile distances. Matt Rees will participate in the mass start and invites all running enthusiasts to join him and the other runners on the course. Rees is from the United Kingdom, he gained wider recognition during the London Marathon in 2017 when, close to the finish line, he stopped to help another runner who was unable to finish the race. This gesture robbed Rees of breaking his own personal record; however, there's much more to this ambitious runner than just kindness and compassion.

With a background in chemistry and renewable energy, Matt Rees got into running in 2015 and has never looked back. His analytical mind, battle with anxiety, and competitive spirit have led him to coach other running enthusiasts and inspire more than 38,000 people on his *YouTube* channel and *Instagram* profile about how running can change one's life.

Over the past couple of years, it seems like everyone's become involved in some sort of running. Cross country, nationwide marathons, or simple running before or after work – people seem to not be able to sit still and are spending every free minute going outside for a run...mostly for the physical and mental benefits one can get from this activity.

But everyone's motivation to run is different. For some, it's to increase their endurance or to lose some weight, while for others it's a way to spend some time alone listening to their favourite music. Rees is also one of those people who can't imagine their lives without a daily jog through the city or the forest near his hometown of Lydney in England. Running at least twice a day – once outside and once on a treadmill – the Welsh-born runner is a participant and also an ambassador for the World Athletics Road Running Championship's half-marathon distance.

However, the journey to becoming one of the leading Welsh runners and competing in races every two or three weeks has not always been easy. While Rees has participated in various sports and athletic activities throughout his life, they did not bring him the sense of fulfilment he desired. His passion for running started as a New Year's resolution in 2015 to aid him in dealing with his mental health issues and anxiety, which were restricting him from socialising and meeting new people.

Eight years later, Rees says he has completely changed his life, switching his career from chemistry to running, and now he coaches and inspires athletes from all around the world to reach their running goals. He also met the love of his life through running.

While Rees admits that the mental battle against anxiety is never over, in our interview he is easy to talk to, drops a joke here and there, and naturally has a lot to share regarding running. His own personal gains from running, as well as the positive aspects of turning a hobby into a full-time job, make for an inspiring story of listening to one's inner voice, finding one's true passion, and living an authentic life in order to become mentally free.

# His passion for running started as a New Year's resolution


Even if you think running is not for you and the only running you're willing to do is when you're about to miss a flight or bus, Rees' key takeaways on determination and finding life purpose are useful for any area of life.

In 2017, when you were running the London Marathon, you stopped near the finish line to help a struggling athlete, David Wyeth. That affected your own result, as you were on your way to beating your personal record. Why did you choose to forfeit your own achievement?

For me, it wasn't really a choice but a natural response. When you see someone struggling, your instincts are to help them. I was coming around a corner and looking forward to crossing the line and finishing the race. A marathon's a long distance, and it takes a lot out of you. But suddenly I saw David on the ground... I saw him trying to get up and then stumble and fall back down.

At the time, I thought I was going to break two hours and 50 minutes, which I would have been really happy with. But when I saw him, that didn't matter any more – there's always another race. Making sure that he was okay was the only thing I was focused on. I went over and tried to help him,

and when I realised he wasn't going to be able to get to the finish line, although he was so close, I just wanted to make sure he finished. I never expected all of the attention that came with it, and I didn't realise until later that we had been on TV. For me, it was just making sure that someone who was struggling and needed help got the help they needed.

## For you, is running about competition and the result, or is it about the feelings and the people you meet?

It's about both. Running has become a huge part of my life, and I love how it makes me feel. I also love the people I meet through running. But I also try to be the best I can and to achieve the most I can

I started running to deal with my mental health. At that stage, competition didn't matter to me running changed my life and made me a stronger, happier, more confident person. I feel like it balances me out, levels me, and grounds me.

I was told many times to try running, but I had always found running really boring and not something I wanted to try. Only when I stuck with it and decided to actually give it a proper shot did I discover a love for it and saw the benefits both mentally and physically. And then I got addicted to competition and trying to achieve more and be the best I could be.

I love racing, I love events, but I also love the process of training and setting goals and going after those goals. Just seeing what I can achieve and how much I can push myself physically and mentally, both in training and racing. With running, you get to travel and meet people and make friends. And the running community is such a welcoming, great place. I've met so many incredible people through running.

How has running changed you both mentally and physically? Are you still struggling with anxiety? I think anxiety is one of these things that I'll always have, but now I know how to deal with it much better. If I don't run for a few days or a week, I feel like it builds up a little bit. Whereas if I get out and run, it balances me out. I also find that through running I've learned to deal with discomfort and with my emotions - it's become my therapy. When I go out for a run, I can just be in my head and work through any problems I have. Running has taught me that it's okay to be uncomfortable.

What motivates you right now to keep running? Running has made me a more confident person. If it wasn't for running, I wouldn't have turned up for the interview today. I may have travelled here, I may have waited outside the café, but it would have been difficult for me to walk inside. I think I'll keep running forever, because I know how much it helps me.

But now I also have other goals related to running. I want to continue to see what I can achieve. I love the process of going out to train and then testing myself on race day. That's the thing with running - you progress by small steps and reach small goals, and you feel good about yourself for doing that. Running is one of these things that everyone will progress in if they stick with it. Your endurance will build, and you will get better.

## Running has become such a big trend recently. It seems that everybody's running.

Yes, there seems to be a huge uplift in running, and that's great, because it's so good for mental and physical health. There are so many benefits to it. In the United Kingdom, we have an event called 'parkrun'. It's a free five-kilometre run at 9 a.m. every Saturday morning, when people meet and go out and run. It's not a race, but it is a measured course, so it feels a bit like a race. But it's free and you don't have to take it too seriously. You can walk the five kilometres if you want, or you can walk some of it and run some of it.

Running seems to be going through a boom right now, which is great, but I don't know why it's happening. I think the pandemic played a role. People weren't allowed to meet up with anyone, and there was very little we could do, so running was something that lots of people tried.

### What is the most important thing when starting to run? What's the best motivation?

Everyone's got their own reason to run. Some people want to become a bit healthier, for others it's an escape, or a form of therapy. But whatever the reason for starting, there will be numerous benefits from it. That's why I love it and why I promote it and why I advise people to try it.

When I talk about running with some people, the reaction I get is 'Oh no, it's so boring.' My main advice for beginners is to just try it. But don't just try it once, because as you do it more, you will get better. And as you get better, you can actually go for a run and feel comfortable doing it. Once you get through that struggle, you'll get so many benefits from running! If you can get to a point where you can go out the door and start moving and it feels easy - very much like a walk but faster and with more endorphins - it feels amazing!

Are there people who should not run long distances? There are so many different circumstances, and I can't tell people how far to run. It's less about how far you can go and more about getting enjoyment for yourself. Also, with social media, you can get very drawn into comparing yourself with others...which can be both good and bad. There are lots of people out there who share only the good side of things, but not the bad side of things, and that's where comparison can be bad. Therefore, don't be hard on yourself if someone else is running a marathon but you can only run five kilometres. Any distance is great!


## You also work as a running coach. What's your opinion, should people start running on their own, or should they get some advice from a coach?

I think you can start on your own. My coaching is very much about helping people to improve their performance, but you don't need that guidance to get started. Running is a very simple sport, and you don't need much equipment – just a pair of trainers. As long as you build up slowly, you can pick up the basics of running quite easily. But obviously, as a coach, I also believe that coaching can definitely help!

I love helping runners. I love seeing them achieve their goals. But having a coach is not a necessary thing if you're a beginner runner. There are loads of resources out there that can help you build up to a level where you feel that you're enjoying running and you're getting the benefits that you want.

How do coaches train runners? Do you come up with a plan for them, or do you run together with them to see how they're doing?

A bit of both. Most of it is done online. I write their plan, I tell them what types of runs to do, what paces, what efforts. And then – because we've all got GPS and stuff like that these days – I can see the data. I can even see things like their heart rate, how fast they've gone, I can see the routes. That's objective feedback.

But runners also provide comments on how they felt during a run – what they enjoyed, what they struggled with, and so on. From those two things, I can see how they're actually doing, and I devise a plan to progress them to whatever race or performance goal they have. Some people just want to improve their running practice, while others want to prepare for a specific race.

Do you prefer running in competitions yourself or training others?

I love running. I love pushing myself. But I get so much out of seeing other people achieve their goals. On weekends when there are races, I'm waiting for the app to update so I can see how these runners have done. And then they message me, and there's something amazing about the sense of achievement someone feels when they've accomplished something. It might be a certain time goal they've reached, or it might just be that it's their first half marathon or their first ten kilometres. It makes my weekends truly great!

Do you think the competitiveness of joining races so soon after you started running helped your anxiety as well? In a race, one would think you should be more anxious about your result than about comparing yourself to others.

I don't think the results brought me anxiety. Instead, it was more the turning up and being around people. That was the biggest hurdle and barrier for me. But I was in a place where I truly wanted a change; I'd had this anxiety for so many years and it was affecting so many aspects of my life, so I finally decided to do something about it and deal with it. To try and improve myself, I started making choices that I normally wouldn't make.

Joining a running club so soon after starting running was daunting. Meeting all these other people, these runners who supposedly know all about running... But the first time I went, I couldn't believe how welcoming they were! They made such an effort to make me feel comfortable. They didn't know I was struggling with anxiety; they didn't know that was the reason I had started running.

I threw myself in the deep end with racing, but also with joining a running club. And from there it just grew. Yes, I set these big goals and want to achieve them, and I do get very nervous before races, but I feel like those are normal nerves, whereas the anxiety I was feeling around life in general was not something I was dealing with very well. I think once you start racing, you also start to run faster, and the adrenaline makes the nerves feel a bit easier. I can never run as fast in training as I can in the races.

Why do you think the running community is so welcoming? Is that the case with all sports clubs? I think it's probably the same for most sports. People just tend to be welcoming. Although maybe there's an aspect of running that makes that community more welcoming than others. For example, football clubs can have a lot of banter and jokes but also a bit of an alpha-male aspect to them. I've just never been in an environment as welcoming as the running community. It doesn't matter how fast you are; it's more about 'we love running, come and join us and do what we love doing'.

It doesn't feel like we're competing against each other, whereas in football, although everyone's on the same team, there's still this rivalry in places – will I get picked for the team, and so on. That said, I do love all the team sports. I've played football, rugby, hockey, tennis... I love sports, so I've tried a bit of everything.

# Besides running and coaching others, you're also a content creator and influencer. What does content creation mean in terms of running?

I make *YouTube* videos on running and use my *Instagram* account – @thewelshrunner as a running influencing platform. I never thought of myself as a creative person, but since I started making videos on *YouTube*, I've been loving it. It's a great feeling to put together a video and share a bit of your journey. Then you press 'publish', and you get a little nervous: 'Are people going to like this?'

When I first started making videos, they weren't very good. But it just grew, and people started watching them. Comments like 'this inspired me to go for a run' wowed me. Initially, it was just about sharing my journey and the ups and downs of running, but now it's a wonderful thing to do on the side.

# You're definitely an inspiration for many, because you started running relatively late.

Yes, I started running in my late twenties. But I don't think it's ever too late to start running and get benefits from it. Whenever you decide to start running, you'll get something positive out of it.

# Regarding content creation and influencing, you're also an ambassador for the World Athletics Road Running Championships in Riga this October. How do you feel about that?

I'm so excited! This is the first time this kind of championships will be held, and I can't wait! I think it's such a great concept to involve both elite runners and mass participation racers all at the same time. I'm looking forward to watching some of the elite races and seeing some of the best runners in the world. I myself will run only the half marathon later in the day, alongside elite runners, which is very cool. I've never been to Riga, so I'm very excited to visit the city as well.

# Do you have any obligations as an ambassador for the event?

We get to meet some of the elite athletes and ask them a few questions. I'm a bit of a geek, so I love

finding out how elite athletes train and how their minds work, how they prepare for races. Then, I'll be watching the races, making YouTube content, and sharing the whole event with people who cannot make it over to Riga. It's going to be such a busy weekend.

### By the way, do you have any specific rituals or lucky charms before races?

No, I've never had any rituals or good-luck charms. I just eat breakfast and do some activation work, such as massaging the glutes in the morning.

When I was growing up, I used to feel like I always had bad luck, and I started telling myself that I was an unlucky person. But then I realised it was ridiculous: if you tell yourself you're unlucky, you start to become unlucky. So I decided to not believe in luck anymore and just try my own best. In a race, I feel that I just have to mentally push myself, and over time I've learned to do that better. For example, really learning how to 'sit' through the discomfort. It takes practice.

## Do you have a favourite distance?

The half marathon is probably my best distance, where I perform best. I enjoy this particular distance

because it's long enough to not feel like sprinting at the start, but it's not as long as a marathon. I do love marathon race days though. I love the preparation for the marathon - the fuelling and everything else. But I'm stronger in the half marathon.

## Did you also have a coach when you started running, or are you self-trained?

I'm self-coached. I joined the running club and threw myself in, and just tried to learn as much as I could. I kept asking questions, reading books, listening to podcasts, trying to get as much information as I could while also trying it out myself. I like to learn by talking with other people and reading, but I also like to test things out.

I come from quite a scientific background, so I like trying things and seeing how I respond to them. I was always good at science - I did a degree in chemistry, then a master's degree in renewable energy, and was doing a PhD in energy in buildings. I have an analytical brain, so I felt like I should carry on with chemistry, but I never had a passion for it. When I found running and the analytical side of that, I found passion and wanted to learn more about that. I was using some of my analytical skills but in a way that suited me better.


## Your life partner, Kelly, is also a runner. What came first - did you meet and then together fall in love with running, or did you meet through running?

We met through running and just hit it off. We had an amazing connection. It's nice that we understand each other's passion for running. Maybe our personalities are similar, and that's why we both love running. It's nice to see each other going after those big goals and achievements. Hopefully, it's inspiring for our kids as well.

What are your main recommendations for someone who's still only thinking about running? For the very beginners, it's all about consistency. Don't put pressure on yourself about paces. If you consistently go out and run, you will get better.

The other thing that beginner runners tend to do is that they run too fast, too much at a time, and they end up running at the same pace all the time. If you have variety in your running – you do lots of easy running, but then you also do the harder runs, tempo runs with a faster pace, intervals you can get more out of the harder runs and build endurance.

So, it's about a variety of easy and hard runs and not running the same pace all the time. And consistency. People often find it hard to get back into running if they've missed a run. But it doesn't matter if you miss a run, or if you miss two runs. Just lace up, get out the door, and you'll get those benefits again - it all comes back. bo



The Atlantic Ocean hugs this Moroccan port town and creates a stunning backdrop for your holiday. Although it's the fifth-largest city in the country, Agadir is relatively calm and laid-back and feels worlds away from the chaos of Marrakesh and the buzz of Casablanca. In 1960, large chunks of Agadir, including the old medina, were destroyed in an earthquake and Morocco had to rebuild it from scratch, so it's also a completely new city.

The oceanside promenade is the place to be. The boardwalk is a microcosm of kitschy fast food joints, traditional souk market stalls, street vendors, and luxurious restaurants serving delightful Moroccan cuisine. Every morning the sun loungers are placed out on the sand, the umbrellas open, and another sunny day begins. In fact, it's very rare to have a cloudy day here; even in winter the temperature usually doesn't fall below 20 degrees Celsius.

Whether you're coming to Agadir for a lazy holiday or an active retreat, there are many awesome things to do. Make sure to take the cable car up to the remains of the ancient Kasbah (fortress) for a spectacular bird's-eye view of the city and the ocean. Souk El Had is a must-visit for shopping enthusiasts and one of the largest traditional markets in the country. And take lots of pictures in the terracotta-coloured La Médina built in 1992, which pays homage to and reinterprets the old part of the city that was lost in the earthquake.

No visit to Agadir is complete without visiting Taghazout. This small fishing village is among the most beloved and well-regarded surfing centres on West Africa's Atlantic coast. With hippie fame and easygoing attitudes, it makes for a perfect break from the hustle and bustle of the big cities. Try surfing (many rentals are scattered around the village and also offer lessons), immerse yourself in traditional Berber culture, have yoga sessions on the beach, and give in to the soothing sound of the waves. In that sense, Taghazout is a wilder, more down-to-earth alternative to the beaches of Bali and Goa.

Must-try experience: 4x4 jeep safari tour in the desert





#### Remote natural paradise

Gran Canaria is a fantastic place to marvel at nature's beauty, whether it's endless dunes meeting the blue ocean waters, astounding ridges featuring phantasmagoric stone formations, or simply the colourful vegetation covering this enchanted land. While the Canary Islands are a part of Spain, they're among the most exotic destinations that the European Union has. Located in Macaronesia, a group of archipelagos off the North African coast, Gran Canaria invites you for an unforgettable outing.

It's perfectly safe to visit the island in autumn and winter, because the weather here is very mild. It never gets too cold, and it's rarely scorchingly hot, so an 'eternal spring' atmosphere is guaranteed. While you can certainly travel around by public transport, it's much more rewarding and flexible to rent a car.

Surprisingly for such a remote natural paradise, the capital is a relatively large, vibrant city with diverse neighbourhoods and plenty of attractions within the urban limits. The local Las Canteras Beach is a long Atlantic jewel that sets the rhythm of life here. Settle in on one of the numerous ocean-facing terraces here, and you'll finally feel true island bliss just observing the waves and living in the moment.

Las Palmas is really old, too, founded at the height of the colonisation era in the 15th century. Its historic Vegueta and Triana neighbourhoods are UNESCO-protected areas, so be prepared to spend some time here visiting the spectacular Catedral de Canarias and its observation deck, exploring the Casa de Colón, where Columbus himself was a guest, and learning about the indigenous population and traditions at the Museo Canario.

But it's what lies outside the cities that's guaranteed to take your breath away in Gran Canaria. Dunas de Maspalomas is a spellbinding dune complex that doubles as one of the most beautiful beaches in the world. A trip to the interior village of Tejeda involves a journey through high canyons, never-ending peaks, and sleepy mountain settlements. Also, from here you can hike to the island's symbol, the epic Roque Nublo stone formation. For wilderness and dramatic cliffs, give Tamadaba Natural Park a go.







#### Ultimate destination for hedonists

All the skyscrapers, roads, and cars may give you the impression that Tel Aviv is, indeed, a very busy and business-centred megalopolis. But wait until you get to the seaside promenade. It won't be hard, because all streets here lead to the Mediterranean. And there you'll see the real soul of Tel Aviv – it's a city that embraces its striking location and makes the most of it. It's the ultimate destination for hedonists and party animals, yet it has no lack of culture and is perfectly set for an exploration of Israel.

Present-day Tel Aviv is a very young city, having been founded only in 1909. Walking around the city centre you can witness the layers of its short but turbulent history. The 1930s were a heyday for urban development, and the so-called White City was constructed then. Nowadays protected by UNESCO, it has the world's largest collection of Bauhaus-style buildings, which are surrounded by leafy boulevards. Skyscrapers are also heavily present in Tel Aviv's urban fabric, giving the city a Miami-like appearance with its palm-lined streets and the blue of the sea.

When here, one inevitably wants to live in full, to live decadently. Eating and drinking well is a big part of this lifestyle, and Tel Aviv doesn't disappoint. On the contrary, it's among the foodie capitals of the world with a kaleidoscope of cutting-edge restaurants, third-wave coffee shops, innovative cocktail bars, and trendy street food.

Buzzy Carmel Market is the perfect place to start your culinary exploration. Go to the Neve Tzedek neighbourhood for cool sidewalk cafés and ice cream joints. The area around Sderot Rothschild has many street-food spots for a mouthwatering *sabich* (pita with fried eggplants) or falafel. Dizengoff Square and its surrounding streets are a mecca for coffee lovers.

And don't forget about Jaffa, a picturesque medieval city that is now a part of Tel Aviv. Take some time to stroll around its atmospheric ochrecoloured streets, visit St. Peter's Church, and see the Ottoman-era Clock Tower. Jaffa also has the best vantage point for viewing the sunset. Few things can beat the sight of the sun setting over the beaches and the tall skyline of Tel Aviv.

#### Perfect for families and first-time visitors

The Teide volcano watches over the spectacular island of Tenerife and serves as a mighty sentinel for this stunning land of high cliffs, excellent sandy beaches, lively resort cities, and remote valley villages. Tenerife has few competitors when it comes to raw beauty, and the Atlantic Ocean is at its most sublime here. The island is also very accessible, with plenty of accommodation options and a well-regarded reputation as a holiday destination.

Tenerife has a unique, very delightful climate – winters are warm, and autumns are largely what Europe calls 'summer'. Head to the southwestern coast if you're into beach lounging, cocktail sipping, and boardwalk strolling. Costa Adeje, Playa de las Americas, and Los Cristianos provide a year-round sunny escape and can be compared to the resort towns along the Costa Blanca and Costa del Sol in continental Spain. It's also a treat for families with children, featuring amusement parks such as Siam Park, Aqualand, Jungle Park, and Monkey Park.

For culture and history, go to La Laguna, a colonial-era gem with a city outline that was subsequently used by the Spanish in Latin American cities such as Havana and Lima. The Neoclassical cathedral is as striking as it gets, there's a collection of picture-perfect palaces, and there are also plenty of cafés to take a caffeinated break next to the dragon trees (a symbol of the island). Then take a short drive north to Puerto de la Cruz, which is dotted with hotels and boasts one of the most striking coastlines in Spain. Don't miss the ocean-washed Punta Brava as well as the stunning Playa de los Roques.

Outdoor buffs will find a paradise in Tenerife. The hiking trails are plenty, the volcanic panoramas are overwhelmingly beautiful, and the diversity of landscapes is remarkable. With a height of 3718 metres, the Teide volcano (the highest point in Spain) and the surrounding national park offer lots of trails and climbing. Parque Rural de Anaga is another outdoor hotspot with dramatic terrain. You can also join a whale- and dolphin-watching tour departing from Costa Adeje. **bo**

### ENJOY INDIAN SUMMER IN TRONDHEIM

Uncovering myths, legends, and the best Norwegian food on a weekend to remember in the city of Trondheim.

'There's a mystery at the heart of Nidaros Cathedral,' explains my guide, Martine, who is clad in a dramatic wine-red robe, as we walk around this monumental space. 'Nobody knows what happened to St. Olav's bones.'

We're in Trondheim, in the heart of the old Viking empire, in Norway's largest and most important building, and I've never felt more like Indiana Jones in my life. Martine, a guide at the cathedral, is leading me through secret doors, up stone staircases, and into tiny hidden chapels in a special tour of this building's hidden spaces, regaling me with stories as we go. As it turns out, St. Olav, the patron saint of Norway, was quite the man.

'He's often pictured with a cross in one hand and a sword in the other,' Martine explains in hushed tones as we walk down narrow corridors and stoop under the low ceilings. 'He was a Viking from the age of 12 and travelled all over Europe. During these voyages, he discovered Christianity and brought it back to Denmark. But he didn't let go of his Viking ways: one of his habits was to "Christianise" a town by turning up with a cross in one hand and a sword in the other and offering the townspeople a choice of one or the other.'

Swashbuckling Olav went on to inherit the throne of Norway in 1015. When his body was moved a year after his burial, it was noted that his hair had continued to grow and his wounds had seemed to heal. His body had barely decayed at all. This revelation led to him being canonised as a saint. His bones were kept in a silver box on the altar of this very cathedral, which was built in his honour. During the Reformation, the box was moved and nobody knows where the bones

went. They are presumed to be somewhere under the cathedral's flagstones, amid the bones of archbishops and noblemen going back to the year 1070.

That's just one of the great stories of this Gothic-medieval cathedral, a building where kings and queens are crowned. But, says Martine, they're only borrowing the throne from King Olav, who is still the eternal king of Norway. Because archaeologists have been unable to find his bones, there's a sense that everyone is still waiting for his return.

Taking a tour of the cathedral in search of a lost king's bones is just one of the reasons to visit Trondheim. The third-largest city in Norway, and a formerly important trading port in the middle of the country, Trondheim has in recent years become something of a hot destination. Crowned a European Region of Gastronomy, along with its region, Trøndelag, in 2022, it has multiple Michelin-starred restaurants, the highly-ranked Norwegian University of Science and Technology, a famous pilgrimage route, and a nationwide art prize for contemporary artists. And in Norway, you're never far from nature: the city sits on a fjord, making it ideal for fjord cruises, and it is close to the UNESCO-listed mountain village of Røros as well as the southern reaches of Norway's Sámi people.

But back to the cathedral, because there are more stories to uncover. Another legend about this building, which was 250 years in the making, is that it should never be completed. If it is, says Martine, the legend tells that the cathedral and the town of Trondheim will slip into the fjord and be lost forever. To make sure it is never finished, a stone figure of a stonemason has







been carved in the process of placing a brick in the wall, which is just jutting out from it. The fact that this stone figure will never complete his work will hopefully keep the building and the town safe.

The figure of the stonemason is one of hundreds in and on the cathedral itself. Over its main entrance, an overwhelming array of 76 figures from Norwegian history stand, holding orbs and sceptres, crosses, axes, swords, and standing on dragons. Gargoyles coil around buttresses and statues command the scene from raised plinths. By far the most curious is a tall statue with the face of Bob Dylan at the top of the northwest tower.

Thanks to time, fires, reconstructions, and the ongoing work of maintaining an enormous building such as this, parts of the building have been made and remade again over time. When sculptor Kristofer Leirdal was working on a statue of the Archangel Michael for this tower, he decided, just like the medieval stonemasons who went before him, to base the face of the figure on a real-life person. And thus, Bob Dylan stands at the top of a tower on Nidaros Cathedral.

Trondheim has welcomed travellers for centuries, thanks to the bones of the saint and the pilgrimage they inspired. It's not as well known as the Santiago de Compostela route, but today, pilgrims come to Trondheim via nine different pilgrimage routes. These routes, known as St. Olaf's Ways, cross around 3000 kilometres of mountainous landscapes and pass through many cosy, culture-filled villages.

With another guide – this time Wanda from Trondheim For You (trondheimforyou.com) – I explore the rest of the city. We take in the beautiful surroundings of Bakklandet, the old town of Trondheim, where colourful houses sit along cobbled streets and heavy-headed peonies nod their heads against old stone walls. It's a peaceful and lovely space right beside the old harbour, which is lined by characterful red, yellow, and brown warehouses of varying ages. Bakklandet is also a hub for students in the city.

We walk on to the city's main square, which is lined by food trucks, and past squat stone churches and narrow city alleyways. It's a pretty place to walk, with shopping streets decorated with multicoloured umbrellas and tumbling flowers. Wanda points out Trondheim's many art galleries, including the edgy contemporary art spot K.U.K. (k-u-k.no), whose name stands for Kjøpmannsgata Ung Kunst (meaning Kjøpmannsgata Young Art) but is extremely rude if you take away the dots (it rhymes with 'dock') – in its restaurant, a dangling pair of disco balls emphasises the theme even more.

We also walk past former industrial buildings turned into shopping centres and apartments, and into cultural houses where old wooden buildings meld with modern architecture, until we reach the port and the edge of the city. Tonight, a lone ferry floats across the water, continuing its journey into the port, where a cruise ship is weighing anchor.

This calm fjord is the reason why the city was built in the first place. It served as an entry and exit point into the city for traders and raiders and everyone else. Today, Trondheim is still a city of comings and goings, just as it always has been.

#### TRONDHEIM'S FOOD SCENE

Take a foodie tour of the city dubbed the Home of Nordic Flavours!

#### Breakfas

Scandic Nidelven has won the title of Norway's Best Breakfast 14 times, most recently in 2022. It's easy to see why, because you've never seen a hotel breakfast like this! With dedicated chefs serving smoothies and ginger shots, hot-food counters with multiple types of salmon, a special vegan and gluten-free food counter, and a waffle station where you can even get ice cream (for breakfast!!), it's an overwhelming array of just about everything you could imagine.

#### Coffee

No matter how much you love coffee, you cannot possibly love it as much as the dedicated coffee nerds who run *Jacobsen og Svart* (Brattørgata 4; jacobsensvart.no). Enjoy pour-over coffees from emerging coffee nations such as East Timor in a trendy coffee shop where the bookshelves are filled with architectural coffeetable books. It's one of the hottest places in town for serious coffee fans. If you prefer tea, the specialist tea shop *Gravraak Teateliér* makes blends from local herbs (Nedre Baklandet 58; gravraakteatelier.no).

#### Drinks

After dinner, take your pick from this student city's many bars. For cocktails, the *Britannia Hotel's Vinbar* is the city's best spot (Dronningens gate 5; britannia.no). If cocktails aren't your thing, its cellars also hold 10,000 bottles of wine from all over the world, so you're sure to find a drink to your liking. *Spontan Vinbar* is another of the city's stylish spots and was recommended by the *Michelin Guide* in 2023 (Fjordgata 1; spontanvinbar.no).

#### Ice cream

At *Gola e Tentazioni* you'll find an Argentinian gelato maker with a revolving counter of extraordinary flavours and some of the smoothest ice creams ever. Its coffee ice cream is made from the same brand of coffee served at *Michelin*-starred *Credo*, and the pistachio and hazelnut flavours complement it wonderfully.



#### Lunch

It's not a hardship to walk down the river to the cosy *Streif* bakery and café at Nidaros Pilegrimsgård. It's an exceptionally friendly place to eat. The Ferdafolkets Delingsbord (Travellers' Sharing Plate) is highly recommended and is full of local cheeses, local meats, and a sprinkling of pistachios, quiche, and toasted sandwiches to bring together the flavours of local producers and international pilgrims.

#### Dinner

If you get the chance to eat at any of Trondheim's *Michelin*-starred restaurants – *Credo* (Ladeveien 9; restaurantcredo.no), *Speilsalen* (Hotel Britannia, Dronningens gate 5; britannia.no), or *Fagn* (Øraveita 4; fagn.no) – grab it with both hands. Bookings typically need to be made three or more months in advance. All three establishments use the best modern Norwegian ingredients and make the most of the city's setting on fertile land beside the fjords and the coast, with mountain pastures just a short drive away.

Alternatively, a dinner at *Troll Restaurant* gives a great introduction to Norwegian dining in a characterful wooden house on the quay (Fosenkaia 4A; trollrestaurant.no). Expect a changing menu with the likes of local reindeer, wildflowers, locally-caught pollack, and more. After a meal, walk down the quay to its sister venue, *Kafe Shuret*, for a little live music (Fosenkaia 40).



Or, if you prefer sushi, grab one of the limited seats at the beautiful *Maki Kitchen* in Bakklandet (Nedre Baklandet 75; makikitchen.no). As locals tell it, salmon did not feature in Japanese sushi until Trondheim exported it to the Far East. This bijou sushi restaurant is a great place to try it without the air miles.





#### **BEYOND** THE CITY

#### Getting to know Norway's drama-packed nature.

Norway is known for its outrageous nature (think roaring waterfalls, vertiginous fjords, and coastal wildlife that includes orcas and sea eagles), and with a little more time in Trondheim, your jaw can drop with the best of them.



#### Go foraging in the wilds of Norway

A half-hour drive from the city, *Trøndelag Sankeri* (Trøndelag Harvesting) offers outdoor cooking adventures in which you will collect and prepare your lunch surrounded by Norwegian nature, gathering wild plants, berries, mushrooms, and seaweed along with the occasional lecture. Book in advance for a private tour. You'll be in good hands; the organisation's 16 professional harvesters also supply companies and restaurants all over Norway, including *Michelin*-starred spots in Oslo. trondelagsankeri.no



#### Discover the eight seasons of the Sámi

Another great reason to visit Røros is to see a Sámi reindeer farm. At Rørosrein, a South Sámi family of reindeer herders welcomes guests to their farm for reindeer experiences, including sledding in winter, and dinner. Their restaurant, *Koia*, is built as an octagon and clad in timber, according to old Sámi tradition, representing the people of the eight seasons. The Sámi people have always divided the year into eight seasons, which relate closely to the behavioural patterns of their reindeer.

#### Explore a mountain village

The traditional mountain village of Røros lies a two-hour drive from Trondheim and is easily reached on a day trip. It's a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the oldest towns of wooden buildings in Europe, complete with cosy alleyways and even copper mines running under the mountains. It's one of Norway's certified sustainable destinations, meaning that it's working hard to reduce the negative burden of tourism and support cultural heritage. Guides can take you on tours of the town, which include plenty of colourful storytelling, and you can't leave without trying a famous Røros *pjalt*, a special kind of pancake served with *brunost* cheese.



#### Get a 360-degree view of nature

About two hours west of Trondheim, two glass igloos overlooking the coastal landscape, a field of alpacas, and the mountains offer an unexpected and wonderful way to immerse yourself in nature. The hidden glamping spot is run by a family that also offers SUP and kayak trips in the nearby ocean as well as guided hiking with alpacas. Each of the igloo-like domes has a double bed and all the cooking gear you need, including a barbecue for grilling any fish you catch. opplevauna.no



#### Go Viking hiking

With a bit more time, you can go completely Viking in the heart of Norway. 





### DIG INTO MEDIEVAL HISTORY AT RAUNA CASTLE

Rauna, a small town in northern Latvia with only a little more than one thousand residents, attracts local as well as international visitors thanks to its historical sites and artefacts, the most prominent of them being its medieval castle.

Rauna is a small but intriguing destination for those interested in medieval history and natural beauty. Situated at an elevation of 115 metres above sea level, the town provides astonishing views of the landscape below. But there's no doubt that the most famous view of Rauna can be seen from Rauna Castle.

The history of this medieval castle is quite exceptional. The masonry structure was constructed gradually and rebuilt several times, from the 14<sup>th</sup> to the 16<sup>th</sup> century it was one of the main residences of the Riga archbishops, and it also served as a fortification. After being a military and cultural centre for three centuries, Rauna Castle lost its prominence when the Archbishopric of Riga was taken over by the Duchy of Livonia. The structure was destroyed in the early to mid-17<sup>th</sup> century following the conflict between Sweden and the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth, leaving only ruins and lots of space for the imagination to ponder what life looked like back in the day.

Built as a fortification, the whole complex had five round towers, an impressive inner courtyard, detailed dining and sleeping halls, and a chapel. The courtyard was certainly one of the most significant features of the castle; the longitudinally extended rectangle was decorated with marvellous stone galleries and carefully paved with medium-sized stones, some of which can still be seen today. The architectural works were impressive for their time, and because it is likely that the initial purpose of the castle was defensive, the design possibly featured some temporary wooden structures built inside the fortified walls.

Conservation work on the castle began only recently, making the site one of the main visitors' attractions in the Rauna region. It's one of the largest and best-preserved castle ruins in Latvia. Even though only the main body of the castle remains, one can learn more about the archaeological findings and the castle's past in an exciting interactive exhibition located on the castle site.

Nowadays, Rauna Castle is also a cultural centre for the region, hosting various events that celebrate the town's medieval past as well as current trends. In May, Rauna has its own medieval celebration, in July it hosts the *Rodam Raunā* (Finding in Rauna) festival, and in August the town celebrates its name day with a fun party.

In addition to the castle, Rauna has numerous other objects worth visiting. Tanīs Hill and the

mythical Staburags Cliff of Rauna are located near the castle. In the Middle Ages, Tanīs Hill was one of the largest and strongest Latgalian hillforts. The Staburags Cliff of Rauna, on the other hand, is a natural wonder and a gem for all those seeking beauty in Latvian nature. The freshwater limestone cliff is around 8000 years old and covered in calcified grass stalks and leaves. Nothing else like it can be seen in Latvia – its only counterpart, the Staburags Cliff of the Daugava River, was flooded when hydroelectric stations were built in the  $20^{\rm th}$  century.

The atmospheric Rauna Evangelical Lutheran Church can also be found nearby. Built in the 15th century, the church has witnessed various powers and wars and continued to operate as a church during the Soviet occupation. Also, no visit to Rauna is complete without seeing the Rauna Freedom Monument, which was built from local donations in the 1930s and also miraculously survived the Soviet era. It features a sculpture of a *kokle* (Baltic psaltery) player and the patriotic prayer šGod Bless Latvia'.

Rauna has a rich history to explore, and, in order to make it more accessible, a mobile audio guide offers video stories as well as an expansive photo gallery in Latvian, English, and Russian. The audiovisual guides let anyone dig into medieval history from the comfort of their own home. But for those who love reading, the Smiltene region has also launched an extensive website containing most of the available information about the tourism opportunities in the region and the history of the main sites and artefacts.

The walls of the main body of Rauna Castle have been strengthened and a mobile tourism guide through Rauna as well as an interactive castle tower exposition have been created within the RUNRARO project. It is planned to improve the equipment at Rauna Castle, expand the tower exhibition with informative tablets on the archaeological findings in the castle ruins, and organise several cultural events within the ZE RUNRARO project.



The University of Tartu is launching two influential projects to advance life sciences.

### EXCELLING IN DIGITAL BIOENGINEERING AND PERSONALISED MEDICINE

In September, the University of Tartu – Estonia's leading research institution – is launching two internationally influential projects to bring new quality to life sciences, biotechnology, and personalised medicine.

The plan to curb climate change and mitigate its effects by reducing the consumption of fossil raw materials, thus reducing the environmental impact of agriculture and fostering the growth of the circular economy, will focus efforts on bioengineering. It is a line of research that investigates processes at the cellular level and applies genetic engineering to design cells with useful functions. Engineered cells can be used for the environmentally sustainable bioproduction of the essential chemical building blocks for polymers or, for example, the ingredients used by the pharmaceutical, cosmetics, and food industries. Such technologies significantly reduce the need for petrochemicals and mitigate the environmental impact of these industries. New bioproduction methods also make it possible to valorise currently low-value waste, such as waste gases or biomass left over from the food and forestry industries.

The Centre for Digitalised Bioengineering (DigiBio) being developed in parallel with the newly established Institute of Bioengineering at the University of Tartu applies digitisation, big data analysis, and machine learning methods to the genetic designs of such cells.

It will offer a new quality for life science research and the bio-industry, significantly accelerating the discovery of important cellular mutations and the creation of designer cells with specific functions.

A biofoundry, or automated experimental unit for the digitalised design and engineering of cells, will be established in Tartu together with partners from the Novo Nordisk Foundation Centre for Biosustainability of the Technical University of Denmark and Tallinn University of Technology. This will be the only centre of its kind in the Baltic region. According to Mart Loog, a professor of molecular systems biology at the University of Tartu and the leader of the project, the Danish partners have unique experience in the digitisation of biology, making the opportunity to learn from them invaluable. The aim is to connect the Estonian biofoundry to the international Global Biofoundry Alliance network in order to benefit from international experience and open new horizons for the local research community and the biotech industry. 'Engineering biology using such a high-throughput approach helps us to meet global challenges ranging from sustainable bioeconomy to fighting pandemics and diseases,' says Loog.

Thanks to advances in science and technology, the field of medicine is going through a breakthrough that can be summed up by the term 'personalised medicine'. Increasingly, there are opportunities to look at health issues more individually than ever before, considering a person's genetic background, lifestyle, and environmental influences, among other factors. Largely thanks to the valuable database of the Estonian Biobank, which over 200,000 Estonians have joined, Estonia has become one of the most advanced countries in terms of personalised medicine. A unique national IT infrastructure for personalised medicine has also recently been completed, enabling the secure integration of genetic data into doctors' daily work.

Progress so far has been noted. The University of Tartu and Tartu University Hospital recently received a historic research grant from the European Commission to establish an international research and development centre for personalised medicine in Estonia. The creation of the region's most influential centre of expertise will allow it to take the next steps in bringing genetics-based healthcare services into practice.

The work of the consortium in establishing the centre is led by Professor Mait Metspalu, who is the director of the University of Tartu Institute of Genomics. According to him, the centre will enable closer collaboration between different scientific disciplines, from clinical medicine and public health to social and data sciences, to study all stages of the implementation of personalised medicine. The consortium's research will include developing new scientific methods, tools, and clinical trials to study and validate the created applications in cooperation with patients. It is also important to assess the impact of personalised medicine services on society, the economy, and public health.

Another aim of the consortium is to improve the digital usability of people's health data in Estonia. Even though strong e-state governance is available in Estonia, some electronic data are still unstructured and in a free-text format. In addition to enabling better use of data for prevention and treatment, a well-organised health data infrastructure will also boost health technology startups, which in turn will accelerate the flow of research into society.

In addition to local researchers and experts, partners include the University of Helsinki and the Erasmus University Medical Centre, which are among Europe's leading centres for personalised medicine. This means the consortium can use the world's top expertise and share its experience and discoveries internationally.

The European Commission is supporting the projects with 30 million euros over six years, with another 30 million invested by the Estonian state. Both projects are supported by a Teaming for Excellence action under the "Widening participation and spreading excellence" subprogramme of the European Commission's Horizon Europe research and innovation funding programme. The programme supports collaborative projects between European research institutions to deliver cutting-edge research and better integrate it into society and the economy.

#### RSU ANATOMY MUSEUM IN RIGA

#### AN UNFORGETTABLE JOURNEY INTO THE ANATOMY OF THE HUMAN BODY



If you are an explorer, art enthusiast, or someone with a medical background, the Rīga Stradiņš University (RSU) Anatomy Museum should be on your bucket list the next time you visit Riga, Latvia. It's a one-of-a-kind cultural space that just might get under your skin and linger there for a long time.

Address: Kronvalda bulvāris 9, Riga am.rsu.lv FB/ RSU Anatomijas muzejs/ RSU Anatomy Museum The RSU Anatomy Museum is one of the few anatomy museums in Europe that's open to the public. It displays complex inner systems and organs of the human body usually seen only by surgeons or anatomists.

The museum is based on the first anatomy training collection in Latvia and was founded in 1920 by two scientists, the Swedish anatomist Gaston Backman and the first Latvian anatomist, Jēkabs Prīmanis. The collection was initially created to train medical students, but nowadays, the museum not only serves as a place for study and research but also where visitors older than 14 or children accompanied by adults can explore a deeper sense of what it means to be alive. System by system, organ by organ, the museum provides a fascinating insight into what is happening inside every one of us. Here one can experience the diversity of human bodies, skeletons, bones, body parts, and organs, their structure, and how they vary in different forms.

Housed in a  $19^{\text{th}}$ -century stable building in the Theatrum Anatomicum complex, the museum's exhibition is laid out on two floors. This rich medical heritage of Latvia has remained unchanged for 100 years. Here, you can explore 1000 preserved organs and body parts, more than 600 skulls, and 200 corrosion preparations.

The first thing visitors see upon entering the RSU Anatomy Museum is the skeleton of a 27-year-old male. This was the first voluntary donation of a human body to the museum and one of the rare specimens that includes details about its donor, because usually donors remain anonymous. The skeleton of Lukstinš is almost

one hundred years old and serves as a reminder that every exhibit is not only scientific but was also once part of a real human body. According to legend, Lukstiņš was a medical student who did not pass the anatomy exam and committed suicide. Another story tells about unrequited love.

On the first floor of the museum, visitors can learn about human organs and anatomy. It's an incredible encounter with the inner systems of the human body that shows the effects of different lifestyle choices, for example, the lungs of a smoker and a non-smoker. Each display is specifically themed, and, between the specimen jars and human bones, provides a truly immersive experience with 2D, 3D, and interactive elements.

There is also a strong connection at the museum between anatomists, artists, and museum experts. Many of the exhibits shine with colour: arteries filled with red, veins with blue, and bronchi with yellow. It is not known how these particular organs and systems were coloured, but saffron, wine, and ink were historically used to create such exhibits.

One of the galleries at the museum showcases hundreds of skulls. Did you know that as late as a few decades ago a real skull was still an integral part of medical studies? There were no digital technological or artificial models available at that time, and therefore every medical student had their own skull. Most of the skulls displayed in the RSU Anatomy Museum were found during archaeological excavations in the 1920s and 30s. They were collected to study the anthropological variations and health of the Latvian population in the 20th century and earlier. The oldest skull in the collection dates to the 5th century CE and was found in Tervete.

The museum's ground floor houses more sensitive exhibits, such as the collection of congenital anomalies and embryology. Here, visitors can also see the museum's storage rooms through transparent glass walls.

The most unusual collection at the museum contains tattooed skin specimens, which stand out for having no obvious connection to the study process. These 30 specimens have been showcased at the museum for several decades, and recently the museum published an illustrated catalogue of its collection of tattooed skin specimens in cooperation with local artists Kristians Brekte and Aleksandrs Breže.

The next time you're getting ready to visit the RSU Anatomy Museum, download the 'RSU Museum' app. Delve deeper into anatomy with close-ups of organs from different angles and explanations about the exhibits given by experts.

In 2023, the RSU Anatomy Museum was nominated for the European Museum of the Year Award and was characterised by the jury as a place that combines historical artefacts with modern anatomical 3D illustrations and contemporary artistic interventions, creating a delicate and elegant exhibition on the history of research on the human body.

Bauska and the surrounding region are unique in Latvia due to the favourable geographical location, the developing traffic infrastructure, and long-standing business traditions. The city is crossed by a busy motorway, is within an hour's drive of both a freight port and an airport, and is planned to host a Rail Baltica railway station with cargo handling terminals. Bauska is close to both Riga, the capital of Latvia, and the border with neighbouring Lithuania. It has a long tradition of business, especially in agriculture, and it is not for nothing that the region is said to be fertile land for business. The development of a logistics centre in this region is simply logical.

The Bauska Industrial and Logistics Park (BILP) has become one of the cornerstones of the region's rapid development. This 105-hectare site, with all the necessary communications and access roads, is a municipal idea that was conceived and began incubation several years ago.

#### A major future logistics centre

Ilze Tijone, Head of the Development and Planning Department of Bauska Municipality, outlines the advantages of BILP: 'The advantages of Bauska Industrial and Logistics Park are mainly related to its geographical location and the possibility to flexibly provide land areas for investors of up to 50 ha.'

Regarding the geographical location of BILP, Tijone points out that the Bauska region is located in the outer ring of the Riga metropolitan area, Sweden

an area characterised by higher economic activity and significant population fluctuation. The territory of Bauska municipality is 2173 square kilometres, and the road network is widely branched with a radial structure, providing easy access both within the municipality and for transit traffic. The total length of roads, bridges and streets in the county is 2053 kilometres.

The largest airport in the Baltic states, Riga Airport, is only an hour's drive away. A large part of the territory of Bauska Municipality is located within the Riga agglomeration; the construction of the Rail Baltica local railway station will significantly change the concept of distance to and from the capital city in the next ten years, increasing the attractiveness of Bauska Municipality for potential investors and its potential for further growth as a logistics centre.

In terms of the infrastructure provided for entrepreneurs, Tijone points out that in anticipation of the development of the 70-ha production area, the municipality has already constructed a street with pedestrian and bicycle paths, utility networks, storm water drainage lines, sewer pipes, external electrical networks, under-ground communication lines, water supply pipelines, and a gas pipeline.

#### Gold-standard parking for long-distance HGV drivers

The construction of a service centre for longdistance HGV drivers is also actively underway on the BILP site. The project has been listed as having gold status by European standards, which means that alongside the car park there will be a comfortable hotel, a café, and a car wash.


The average number of HGVs traversing Bauska per day is 4,465, of which more than 3,000 vehicles cross into Lithuania at Grenctāle. Most of these are Polish HGVs transporting goods from Eastern Europe to Northern Europe – mainly Finland and Estonia – and back. Approximately 10% of the HGVs are from Lithuania and Estonia. The A7 Riga-Bauska-Lithuanian border (Grenctāle) road is consistently the most congested.

Aleksandrs Petrašs, CEO of VISSA, stresses that this service centre could be very important in a few years when the Bauska bypass is built. Petrašs also has high hopes for BILP, as it will allow both factories and warehouses to be built alongside the long-distance service centre, which will, in turn, reduce transport costs for manufacturers and industry, and will undoubtedly generate interest in developing production facilities here.

Petrašs stresses the potential of Bauska as a logistics centre: "The Bauska Industrial and Logistics Park has a bright future, especially once the bypass and Rail Baltica are built. Bauska can easily become a major transport hub. For example, freight that will come in by rail can be transferred to trucks here.'

#### Local support and a skilled workforce

Nils Kazaks, board member of *Bauskas alus*, one of Bauska's oldest and most successful companies, agrees that Bauska has the right environment for business. He stresses that skilled employees are particularly important for a successful business: 'We are fortunate that the *Bauskas alus* team is made up of competent, long-term and responsible employees who demonstrate high loyalty to the brand, the employer, and the Bauska region.' Kazaks acknowledges that the experience of





cooperation with local and state authorities is also positive: 'We are always met with clear expectations and a receptive attitude.'

As for BILP's development plans, Kazaks is positive. 'Bauska's location and available infrastructure certainly open up a lot of opportunities in logistics. Successful cooperation between the municipality and the business community can exploit this potential and ensure the development of Bauska as a logistics centre.'

# AUDI Q8 SPORTBACK E-TRON TAKING THINGS TO A NEW LEVEL



There are times in every car manufacturer's history that become a turning point for the brand and a guidelight for future development. Back in 2015, the presentation of the *e-tron* became such a milestone for *Audi*, as it set its sights on future electrification and new technologies. Now in 2025, a new iteration named the *Q8 e-tron* is out, and it's taking things to a new level.

On a late summer day, a striking blue *Audi Q8 Sportback e-tron* quietly arrives at our doorstep. It's a sporty coupe-like version of the premium SUV, and the looks alone get us hooked. *Audi* keeps its design well balanced and subtle, giving you all the details you need to understand that what you're seeing is a powerful, high-quality, modern vehicle, but it doesn't try to overwhelm you with very exaggerated design elements. It's clean and elegant.

At the front you have neat digital matrix LED headlights, which blend in with the front grille and the new two-dimensional four-ring logo. At the back lies an impressive full-width light bar and a swoopy tailgate, which in combination with massive alloys on all four corners gives the car a sporty feel.

The same philosophy is carried over to the interior of the *Audi Q8 Sportback e-tron*. It's a high-tech

environment, there's no doubt about that. By now we've all become used to big multimedia screens at the centre of the front dash, but *Audi* has added another screen for all the climate controls. It's well laid out and easy to use, so even if you like the knob-and-button controls in older vehicles, you won't have any problems with this set-up. One more screen is in front of the driver. A fully digital instrument panel allows various layout choices with navigation and all the info you need while driving, doubling it on a head-up display for extra safety.

The rear-view mirrors on the sides have been swapped out for cameras and neat triangular displays in the doors. Sure, it takes a couple of hours of driving to get fully used to that, but when you do, you'll start to appreciate the technology of it. Blind spot monitors warn you of cars next to you, and you're always aware of your surroundings.

We set off for a drive, and the first thing that strikes us the peace and quiet of the drive. In an urban environment you'll hardly ever hear any road noise at all, and even on the highway the disturbance from outside is kept to the minimum. That's the benefit of the electric drive and the

great sound isolation of the cockpit. Turn on the *Bang & Olufsen* sound system, and you can almost forget about the world beyond your car. The audio sound is so clear and precise that we have to double check we don't have a band playing in the back seat.

Don't be fooled, though. Remember we mentioned the sporty looks of the car? Well, it's not just a visual impression. All that initial calmness can be brushed away if you stomp hard on the accelerator. We have the 55 e-tron model with a 300 kW motor, and when all 664 Nm of torque kicks in, we reach 100 km/h in less than six seconds. That's pretty impressive for a car that weighs about 2.5 tonnes, and it does it with such ease that you don't feel stressed about it. If that's still not enough, go for the \$Q8 e-tron\$ with 370 kW of power and a whopping 973 Nm of torque. That should do it.

Driving is very *Audi*-like. The steering and suspension work together well and provide the driver with good feedback. We never feel out of sync with the car; it's predictable and precise. Even on loose surfaces the quattro system makes you feel confident and safe at the same time. The air suspension swallows the imperfections of the road surface and lets you enjoy the journey.

Speaking of the journey, in real life conditions – with traffic, unpredictable weather, and using climate control or other extras – you'll get about 500 kilometres of range from the 114 kWh battery. That should be more than enough for any daily drives. If you want to go farther, you can pump the battery up to 80% in just 30 minutes if you stop at a fast-charging (up to 170 kW) station for a coffee.

It doesn't matter whether you're just doing daily commutes to the office or on a longer cruise to the countryside, the *Q8 Sportback e-tron* is a nice place to be. There's plenty of space, and the seats are more than comfortable, especially if you go for the massage option. The seat upholstery and interior design materials are elegant and of high quality, giving you a stress-free and relaxing drive. The digital matrix LED lights will guide you in the darkness of night, and various active safety systems will keep you and your loved ones safe. There's also plenty of space for luggage, with a 528-litre boot in the back and a 62-litre frunk at the front of the car.

The SUV segment has become increasingly popular in recent years, and for good reason – it lets you combine all your daily needs in one vehicle. But with the *Audi Q8 Sportback e-tron* you get even more. It's a business-class vehicle that also doubles as a family car. If you feel frisky, you can drive dynamically as well. And to top it all off, there's superb build quality, high-tech features, and great looks.



In addition, it's important for us to give thought to each ingredient, from the fish and meat all the way to the mushrooms and berries, which are, for example, gathered in the forests of northern Finland. If each of the ingredients in a dish is of the highest quality, then the meal is truly delicious and enjoyable.'

Olivia Restaurant is distinct not only for its high-quality produce and unique flavours and manner of preparation, but

also for its general philosophy. Each food on the menu has a story of its own. The main menu highlights fish and seafood: the Mediterranean turbot is from the French coast, where it is raised on an organic fish farm, while the North Sea cod is caught in the Barents Sea and the shrimp are supplied from Canada. The swordfish comes from the Atlantic Ocean and sometimes takes more than 20 hours to be delivered to the restaurant. *Olivia Restaurant* is the only restaurant in Latvia to have been granted an official catch quota for bluefin tuna, leading its restaurant team to create a unique concept for Riga – a tuna menu.

The *Olivia Restaurant* team has also kept meat lovers in mind. Most of its meats come from Ireland because in addition to having been quality meat producers for many generations, the Irish are also able to ensure that the meat delivered to the restaurant is organically grown, tender, juicy, and full of flavour.

The dessert menu at *Olivia Restaurant* is not large, but each of the dishes contains refined, nuanced flavours that might even recall childhood. One of the favourite desserts at the restaurant is the caramelised Brunost,

or cheese cream with cloudberries from the Arctic – guests call it an absolute masterpiece. Another highlight is the chocolate brownie with black garlic and lingonberry sauce, which once again confirms the chef's tendency to not shy away from experimenting with various flavours and manners of preparation. #### TRAVELLING WITH INFANTS (0-2 YEARS)

#### **Booking tickets**

- Infant passengers without a seat receive a 90% discount (excluding taxes and surcharges).
- Each infant must be accompanied by an adult (16 years or older). One adult can only take care of one baby on board, so the number of infants requires the same number of adult passengers. For example, three infants must travel in the company of three adults.
- Book your tickets early: only ten infants are allowed on board an Airbus A220-300 aircraft.
- Have you decided to bring along the baby at the last minute? No worries, you can still purchase a child's ticket after booking the flight by contacting the airBaltic Call Centre.

#### Arriving at the airport

- Check in online to avoid extra hassle at the airport. Online check-in is available as early as five days before the flight.
- Passengers travelling with infants can take on board reasonable quantities of liquids (e.g., baby food, etc.). However, you may be asked to show them at the security gates. Security restrictions may vary from airport to airport.
- Just like any other passenger, children must hold a valid travel document with

- a photo to board the flight. Newborns younger than eight days old can only fly with a valid medical clearance.
- Diapers, clothes, toys we know that little passengers come with baggage. Therefore, each baby or toddler gets one checked bag (up to 10 kg) free of charge, plus one fully collapsible pram (or stroller, carrycot, or infant-type car seat). The accompanying adult's cabin baggage allowance remains the same.
- To make your airport experience even smoother, airBaltic offers priority boarding for all passengers travelling with infants. Ease your way through the airport by taking a stroller to the gate and dropping it off when boarding the plane.

- Nothing feels safer than a loved one's lap. Infant fare does not include a separate seat on the plane; the baby sits on the accompanying adult passenger's lap. Flight attendants will provide a safety belt for the infant before take-off.
- · If a passenger wants a separate seat for an infant, this service can be purchased online or through the Call Centre. But for safety reasons, they are still required to hold the infant in their lap during the aircraft's ground movement, take-off, and landing and when the seatbelt sign is on, even if a separate seat has been booked.



### From student to instructor

This September, 14 students are starting their pilot training at the *airBaltic* Pilot Academy (PA), and the next group will start in November. Ivars Pulkis was a student in the academy's very first group. That was back in 2018. Two years later, he began flying for *airBaltic* as a first officer. When the pandemic hit and many pilots temporarily lost their jobs, Ivars applied for a PA instructor vacancy – now he continues flying for the airline and also trains new pilots.

This *Diamond* aircraft simulator is your second workplace. What exactly are your responsibilities at the *airBaltic* Pilot Academy?

Yes, simulator training is part of the training programme for new pilots, and I spend a lot of time with the students here. I'm also a flight instructor in Liepāja, where their actual flight training takes place at the airport. I also teach theory: instrumentation, meteorology, general navigation.

When I was temporarily laid off from my job at the airline due to the pandemic, there was a vacancy for an instructor at the *airBaltic* Training Centre, which I applied for. It's possible to earn an instructor certificate through the Training Centre, and so once I had that, I began working there along with seven other new instructors. Now I spend about half of my time flying for *airBaltic* and the other half working here at the *airBaltic* Training Centre.

Had you already been interested in teaching and training new pilots before you began working as an instructor? Yes, the idea of becoming an instructor came to me while I was still studying at the PA myself. But my priority was to start flying for *airBaltic*. I had to stop flying for a while due to the pandemic, but as soon as the opportunity to teach arose, I took it.

I had to go through special training to get my instructor certificate. One of the courses was 'Teaching and Learning', which taught us how to teach. That was very interesting, and we got a lot of useful tips and tricks. For example, in how much detail to tell a student about the tasks to be done in the pre-flight briefing or during the flight to maximise the student's progress. Or, another example: during a debriefing, in how much detail to tell students about their mistakes so that they're able to perceive what is the main problem, error, or shortcoming in their performance.

I had already noticed that I was good at teaching. I have a much younger brother – we're 13 years apart in age – and when he started school, I realised that I liked helping him with his schoolwork. My hobby is skiing, and I've taught three members of my family to ski. I like to teach technical, schematic things that you can visualise.

What are the things that excite you most about this job? First of all, I find it interesting to initially assess the students and identify the different psychological types and what approach will help them make the most progress. They shouldn't be stressed out by my requests and the tasks I give them; instead, I want the students to be openminded and to find learning exciting and enjoyable. But at the same time, they need to understand how responsible and serious this work is.

It gives me great satisfaction to see students get the hang of flying after the theoretical training. There was one striking example in Liepāja. I was flying with a student who had difficulty landing the plane. I tried all sorts of approaches until I finally found a way to show him how to do it, and he succeeded. What a great joy and satisfaction! This student is now also working for *airBaltic* as a first officer.

I teach my students with the idea that I'm training my future colleagues, and my motivation is to help my students achieve the best they can. Their achievements give me pleasure, too.

#### And what did you learn from your instructors during your own studies?

Actually very much. And I've taken something from the experience of each of my instructors to become the instructor I am today. Already as a student, I would observe which teaching approach worked best for me and what worked best for my classmates. I recently noticed that I now try to explain especially well to my own students precisely those things that gave me trouble when I was studying in the academy myself (*laughs*)...and then it turns out that they understand everything right away.

When I started studying at the PA, it was a very new project for the airline. Many of our instructors were company pilots, their teaching approaches differed, and the guidelines hadn't all been worked out yet, like they are now. But I really appreciate every instructor I had, because every one of them contributed to me becoming not only a pilot but also an instructor. Although there are procedures in place, similar to those for captains on the flight deck, instructors' approaches nevertheless differ. I've found that the most effective method is to initially take in all the advice you're given and then develop your own approach – one that works best for you.

I say the same to students, too, if they remark that another instructor has shown them how to do something differently. I say: in that case, evaluate what works best for you. Because I'm not saying another instructor's approach is wrong; this is simply my suggestion on how else you can do it.

#### How does simulator training work?

What I like about simulator training is that you can stop the 'flight' and explain something immediately. In aircraft training, there may not be enough time for that – everything happens quickly, and everything is new to the student. Simulator training starts with simple manoeuvres, which usually don't worry the students because they've already flown a plane in Liepāja for at least 40 to 50 hours.

Then I gradually start adding new things and new challenges, and then the simulated flight does indeed have to be stopped and explained. As a student's simulator hours are coming to an end, I tend to add some special challenges, such as the displays suddenly shutting down or some other unusual situation. In those cases, it's not so important for me to see what solution the student applies; more important is the student's reaction and thought process. That is, the student should not panic, so as to not make any hasty, ill-considered decisions.

And how do you feel when you're undergoing your own regular simulator checks?

It's an extra responsibility for me. I teach others, so I definitely cannot make any mistakes myself (*laughs*)!

#### How did you decide to become a pilot? What's your story?

It began on a trip with my family, the first time I flew on a plane. Both the flight and the atmosphere of the airport made a very big impression on me. As my final high-school exams approached, I started thinking about what I wanted to do in terms of a career, and becoming a pilot was one of my choices. However, the airBaltic Pilot Academy had not yet been established, and my family's resources were limited. I started my studies at another flying school, and at the same time I studied construction at the university in Jelgava and worked at a building design company. But when airBaltic opened the PA, which also offered bank co-financing opportunities, that was very welcome news and I took advantage of it. I had to interrupt my studies and my job, because the programme at the PA is very intense, especially

the first four or five months. But I'm still determined to finish my degree at the university; I have one year left

The PA has now become even more affordable, because *airBaltic* provides a company loan for most of the training and also guarantees job opportunities. What are the new students like? The selection process for studies at the PA is quite serious. Unlike at other pilot schools, where training is open to all who have the desire and the means, and thus the differences between students are more pronounced. The level of training at the PA is high, and the students are similarly selected in terms of motivation and ability, so that their average level is both very high and similar.

And yes, if a student performs well, the company will offer them a job. I'm happy that foreign students also choose to come and study in Latvia and that the PA has such a good reputation. At the moment, there are very, very few offers in Europe like the one <code>airBaltic</code> has developed.

And one more thing that makes me happy: more and more of my students are now becoming my colleagues! On a recent flight to Baku, the previous crew, from whom we took over the plane, included one of my former classmates at the PA. And once we got to Baku, the crew that took over the plane from us included one of my former students. Those are pleasurable moments.

#### **Pilots** out of their office

Baltic Outlook introduces you to some of the most important people at airBaltic – its flight crew members, who have some of the most interesting hobbies.



Egidija Deveikyte (34), captain on *Airbus A220-300* aircraft, from Lithuania

#### **HOBBY**

Egidija Deveikyte's hobby is anything related to being in the mountains: 'Whether it's hiking, trekking, mountaineering, rock climbing, or snowboarding in the winter, I really enjoy all of it! There are so many disciplines one can do, depending on the season and how much time one has.'

The rope Egidija brought to the photo shoot is used for rock climbing and mountaineering. And also for practising in a rock-climbing gym. 'I'm from Lithuania and, like the rest of the Baltic states, my native country doesn't have high mountains. But in order to climb in the mountains, I have to be prepared and get in shape, which I do in the gym.'

Egidija has always loved being outdoors and completed mountaineering courses in 2020, during the pandemic: 'It was the first summer when we didn't fly so much, and I had time to climb more intensively. I really love spending time in the Alps and recently did some via ferratas there. A via ferrata, or 'iron path', has metal rungs or permanently fixed safety wires that help climbers cross steep, rocky terrain. But the biggest thing I've done so far has been mountain trekking in Nepal, where we reached an altitude of 5535 metres. Last November, I joined a group led by one of our *airBaltic* colleagues, Madara Fuksa. I now dream of one day seeing Patagonia in South America. I have a lot of ideas about what I still want to do, but they all require time as well as skills. You can't go into the mountains without proper preparation, so therefore I try to take a small step towards my goals every day.'

One of the first things a climber needs to train is endurance. For that, Egidija runs almost every day and goes to the climbing gym whenever her schedule allows, even if it's during a work trip. She finds that being in the mountains is a perfect opportunity to rest: 'When I'm climbing, I'm so focused on what I'm doing – and you need to be focused! – that I simply can't think about other things. There's no checklist at all, no schedule of tasks that need to be done.'

#### HOW IT ALL BEGAN

As a teenager, Egidija came upon the idea of becoming a pilot, even though nobody from her family has ever been connected with aviation in any way. But with great focus, she began pursuing her dream, taking small steps, one at a time. During her studies, she worked in quite a lot of positions within the aviation industry and had the opportunity to get to know it from different angles, working as a flight attendant, at the airport, and in the flight operations department. Egidija admits it was not easy, because she had nobody to guide her, but somehow it all worked out, and for nine years now she has been flying for airBaltic. She began as a first officer on Dash Q400 aircraft, and now for almost two years she flies as a captain on Airbus A220-300 aircraft.

'Years ago, when I was still dreaming about becoming a pilot, I had no idea what day-to-day life looked like in this industry, but for me, the reality has turned out to be even better than I hoped,' she laughs. 'Of course, there are a lot of challenges in this profession. You spend a lot of time away from home, and the people around you constantly change, which also requires endurance. But there are still moments when I feel like, "Ah, I love this job! And I really

A pilot's job also requires a lot of discipline... as does Egidija's hobby. And there's one more similarity: 'To stay safe in the mountains, you never go alone. There are also always two pilots on the flight deck so that we and our passengers are safe.'

## Flight cancellation and name change options

For your peace of mind, add the option to cancel your reservation and get a full refund in the form of an *airBaltic* gift card in case your travel plans change. This service costs EUR 19.99 per passenger per direction.

Or add the option to change the passenger name on your ticket for a fee from EUR 9.99 per flight segment.

The Cancellation option is available only for *GREEN* and *GREEN plus* tickets, whereas the Name change option is available for *GREEN*, *GREEN plus* and *GREEN Classic* tickets.



#### Heavy cabin baggage

You can take on board one cabin bag (55x40x23 cm) and one personal item (30x40x10 cm) with a total weight of eight kilograms free of charge.

However, sometimes you may need to carry more but want to avoid waiting for a checked suitcase at the baggage belt. Now you can add an extra four kilograms to your cabin baggage from EUR 11.99 and take a total of 12 kilograms on board.


